

Ghost Tutorial

A Guide To Using Ghost 2.0.1

This guide was written to help users hide files with the Ghost 2.0.1 application. It provides illustrated instructions on hiding and restoring files, folders and applications with Ghost. (Click on images for more information.)

Part A - About Ghost

Ghost is an application built with the Make AutoTyper utility, part of the FileTyper suite by Daniel Azuma. Its purpose is to easily hide and restore files, folders and applications using drag and drop.

When a file is hidden with the Ghost 2.0.1 application, it is made invisible, which means it cannot be seen or worked with from the Finder, it is locked, which means other applications cannot alter the file in any way nor can the file be deleted, its name is locked so an application cannot somehow change the file's name, and its file type and creator are changed, which means other applications will not recognize the file as a document that can be opened in that certain application, even if it normally could be. These effects are all temporary, and removed when the file is restored with the Ghost application.

Part B - Hiding Files

Hiding files with Ghost is simple. Just keep a copy (or alias) of Ghost in an easily accessible location, such as the desktop, Apple Menu (if you have Glidel which allows drag and drop via menus) or in a popup folder tab. Whenever you wish to hide a file, folder or application, simply select it (or multiple items) and drag it/them onto the Ghost 2.0.1 icon and let go. The Ghost application will launch and

instantly hide the files.

The files will be in the same location they were in before being hidden, but you will not be able to see them from the Finder. This prevents others from accidentally damaging or deleting your important files.

Part C - Restoring Files

Restoring files has been made much easier since Ghost 1.0, because you no longer need to have a separate application to manually restore the files. Ghost 2 now automatically restores your files when you drag them from the Find File window onto the Ghost icon. To restore a file, follow these instructions:

1. Open the Find File application by typing command-F from the Finder or selecting it from the Apple menu. Figure 3 shows the Find File window.

2. While holding down the option key on your keyboard click and hold the pop-up menu that reads "name". You will be presented with a list of search options. Choose "visibility".

3. Click the "More Choices" button on the Find File window. Then select "creator" from the new pop-up menu. (You do not need to hold down the option key this time.) Then type "GHST" into the creator field as shown. You must type it in all upper-case letters or it won't work.

4. Click the "Find" button or hit enter on your keyboard. You will be presented with a list of hidden files on your hard disk. To restore a certain file, drag it from the Items Found window back onto the Ghost icon in the Finder. It will reappear in the location it was in before being hidden.

Part D - Restoring Folders and Applications.

Restoring applications is much like restoring a standard file. Follow all the same instructions for restoring a file, but in step 3 instead of choosing "creator", choose "file type". Enter "GHST" into the file type field as well.

Restoring hidden folders is also quite similar. In step 3 choose "kind" from the pop-up menu and then set the second pop-up menu (to the far right of it) to "folder".

This will actually list all hidden folders on your hard disk, whether or not they were hidden with the Ghost application. So don't be surprized if you see a bunch of folders you've never seen before.
