Installation & Useage

Right. This is the rum olde bit of the guide where you have to pay lots of attention. PLEASE Pay Attention! This is very important and I'm not joking for once.

HDP 3/6

In your S:Startup-Sequence file type this right at the beginning:

ASSIGN HDP: DH0:HDP

HDP: HDP. MAIN

This is of course assuming that the HDP drawer is in the partition DHO: so if the drawer ISN'T in DHO: then type in the partition that it IS in. And then save it.

Reboot, and you should then get a screen with a few windows in it. This will disappear and you should be asked for a new password. Make one up (this is the bit where your brain comes in) and REMEMBER IT. WRITE IT DOWN SOMEWHERE. I WILL NOT BE HELD RESPONSIBLE IF YOU FORGET YOUR PASSWORD AND CAN'T GET INTO YOUR HARD DRIVE AGAIN. Press enter and then you will be asked for the password. Type in the one that you just made up. Then after a few secs Workbench should appear! Hurrah! Now every time you reboot you will be asked for the password.

When you are in workbench you can change the password again if you want. Just click on "HDP.PREFS" and you can change it. And oh yeah if you want you could run the program in the other partitions startup-sequences! But if you want a different password for each one you need to:

REGISTER!!
