1.2 Description

F1GPPalette.pprx is an ARexx for use with PPaint 7.

It's pretty simple. All it does is to reduce the current image to less than 32 colours, reorders the palette and then inserts FlGP's default colours which are used to render the menus in the game.

You will need to use FlGP-Ed to convert the images into the format required by FlGP before you can use them in the game as backdrops.

1.3 Installation & Usage

Installation is very simple. Just copy the FlGPPalette.pprx to PPaint:Rexx/

Run the script from within PPaint using the toolbar.
