1.2 Introduction

INTRODUCTION

Once upon a time, a close friend of mine showed me his new Palm Pilot Personal. I was impressed of this cute little thing. The only drawback was the missing IR interface, so I decided not to buy one yet, and finally I forgot it again.

Then, in the March issue of a major German computer magazine, I read about 3Com's announcement of the Palm III. The Palm III has an IR interface built in, so it was the stuff dreams are made of. :-)

I got more and more curious about the Palm Pilot series, the existing large software pool, its hardware and its operating system. I found out that the Palm Pilot is a kind of 'Amiga lite'. It has an 68000 core. Even more, the Palm Pilot outperforms a native Amiga 500 due to its 16MHz clock. The PalmOS is lean and has preemptive multitasking. I still wonder why there are only a few Amiga users who know about the Palm Pilot. It is an "Amiga" that you can put in your pocket and have it around you wherever you are. ;-)

Of course, the Amiga is not supported by 3Com. The only chance we had until now was to buy the MacPack and run it on ShapeShifter, or to use all the free Un*x sources on NetBSD. Both solutions are not very satisfying.

So I had a very close look at the freely available pilot-link source by Kenneth Albanowski (thank you very much, Kenneth). Anyhow, I disliked to do just another Un*x port. They are slow, memory consuming and require the ixemul.library. In other words: they suck a big deal, compared to native Amiga applications. (Of course, they are still better than nothing. ;-)

So PalmLink is not just a Un*x port. I wrote it from the scratch new, with a new (and partially unconventional) concept and use of AmigaOS features.

I hope you will enjoy it as much as I do!

1.3 Requirements

REQUIREMENTS

PalmLink requires:

- AmigaOS 2.04 or higher, and at least 1MB of RAM. If you have
-

large files on your Palm Pilot, then you must also have more RAM on your Amiga, since all files are cached in RAM. I also suggest to use a harddisk.

- 68020 or higher (no FPU or MMU). Special 68000 library included.

- A 3Com Palm Pilot Personal, Palm Pilot Professional, Palm III, Palm IIIx, Palm V, or compatible, with PalmOS 2.0 or higher.

PalmOS 1.0 is not supported. The required workarounds would be implemented rather quickly, but there are more important things.

Anyhow, if you use PalmOS 1.0, you should consider to send me a [mail](#) and ask for support.

- The Palm Pilot cradle. Currently, simple serial cables without HotSync button are not supported. Also, do not modify your cradle to save battery power! PalmLink won't work then.

- A serial interface the Palm cradle is connected with. The serial port must be able to use 8N1 at 9600 baud. It may also support higher rates up to 57600. If you use the internal port, I suggest to use the 8n1.device for better performance. BaudBandit.device should work as well, but this is untested.

Choose between the 68020 version and the 68000 version (palmink.library_000)

-> arexx Some ARExx examples, not required

-> developer A developer should know where to place them

-> examples Only interesting for developers

-> PalmLink.guide To where you collect good documentations ;^)

-> PalmTransfer To C: or any other directory within Shell path

-> PalmTime To C: or any other directory within Shell path

1.6 Usage

U S A G E

The document is not completed here. Just a quick guide:

PalmTime

Sets the Amiga time to the Pilot time, or vice versa:

PUT/S Change the Pilot time to Amiga time (not yet implemented)

GET/S Change the Amiga time to Pilot time (not yet implemented)

SHOW/S Shows the Pilot time

DEVICE/K Serial device to use (def. serial.device)

UNIT/K/N Unit of this device (def. 0)

MAXBAUD/K/N Maximum baud rate to use (def. 28800)

PalmTransfer

Makes backups of your Palm Pilot databases, or installs new software

BACKUP/S Backup the database (DIR)

If a database entry was not changed compared

to the backup, it will not be read. If a

database has been deleted from the Pilot,

its file will be deleted as well.

RESTORE/S Restore a backup (DIR)

Put all database files back to the Pilot.

Also, see [FAQ](#) .

INSTALL/S Install a file (FILE)

Installs a .prc or .pdb file. If the database

does already exist, it will be deleted.

MERGE/S Merge a file (FILE)

Installs a .prc or .pdb file. If the database

1.10 FAQ

F A Q

Why should I write a mail?

See [MailWare](#) .

I always get a 'bad baud rate' error. What can I do?

Your serial device is not able to generate the baud rate that was suggested by the Palm Pilot. Try to lower the maximum baud rate that is used by PalmLink. A maximum baud rate of 9600 should work in any case.

I have modified my cradle to save the battery power.

By this modification, the DSR line is cut. The DSR line is used by the PalmLink library, because there is NO way on the Amiga to do CTS/RTS handshaking without checking the DSR line as well. You must fix this line if you want to use PalmLink!

I have some problems with installing Pilot files or restoring backups.

BlitzBlank seems to be the troublemaker. Remove it from your WBstartup or startup-sequence. This is advisable, anyhow, since the BlitzBlank startup code is rather buggy. :(

On restore, some files fail with error code 9

This means that the file does already exist and is not replaceable.

Just ignore this error.

1.11 History

H I S T O R Y

V1.2 (24. 4.1999)

- Bugfix: A wierd, magic number was written into .prc and .pdb files if there was no backup time available. Now, 0 is written as it should. PalmLink will correct bad files while reading.

I suggest to make an entire backup of your Palm Pilot, and restore the backup.

V1.1 (28. 2.1999)

- Added ARexx port and basic functionalities
- Some minor bug fixes
- Removed bugs in pragma file
- 68000 library included

V1.0 (25. 9.1998)

- Fixed the maxbaud recognition, now BSC MultiFace cards are working as well [a lot of people complained]
- PalmTransfer can be aborted with CTRL-C. Anyhow, you have to press it twice in some situations... ;-)

V0.7beta (1. 7.1998)

- Fixed an Enforcer hit in PalmTransfer. It was quite serious, but the backups are all right. [Jens Gelhar]
- Added Assembler include files
- Added Amiga-E include files [Dominique Dutoit]

V0.6beta (21. 6.1998)

- First release
- Still beta, please be careful! Before you use PalmLink, try to make a backup of all Palm data using an original 3Com software, or be prepared to lose all your data.
