Unzip the MoneyGo.Zip file anywhere on your hard disk and make sure that you have the file VBRUN300.DLL, which is required to run a program written in Visual Basic Ver. 3.0. It must be in you Windows or Windows\Systems directory.

Create a new icon for it by selecting FILE then NEW from your program manager. In the dialog box select PROGRAM ITEM and hit OK. Type MoneyGo in the "Description" box, the path plus MONEYGO.EXE in the "Command Line" box (ex. c:\moneygo\moneygo.exe), and the directory the program is stored in, in the "Working Directory" box. Hit OK and the icon will appear in the active window. Double-click the MoneyGo icon to start and go to HELP CONTENTS to learn how to use the program.
