Menu commands

These commands are issued through the main menu.

This menu command allows for the current word to be guessed. One guess may be made per letter guessed. Depressing the **Guess word** button will also invoke this command.

Game-Exit

Introduction

<u>Hang Man</u> is a word game for children and adults. It is based on the popular pencil and paper game of the same name. The computer picks a <u>word</u> and displays blanks corresponding to the number of letters in the word. The player continues to <u>guess letters</u> until the <u>hang man</u> is complete (the player loses) or the word is complete (the player wins). After each letter is guessed, the player gets one chance to <u>guess the whole word</u>. The number of times a player wins and loses is stored and displayed after each game (word). The list of words is stored in a file named (HANMAN.LST). More words may be added using a simple text editor (such as MS-DOS Edit or MS-Windows Notepad).



This is the word that must be correctly guessed before the <u>hang man</u> is completely formed (9 missed guesses).

Hang man

The hang man is the figure that is filled in every time a wrong letter is guessed. The hang man consists of a head, torso, two arms, two legs, two eyes, and a mouth for a total of nine missed guesses. When the hang man is completely formed, the game is lost. If the <u>word</u> is guessed before the hang man is completed, the game is won.

Game screen

This is the main game screen. It consists of the title, four buttons, the word, the hangman, and the Guess letter dialog-box.

Results

This dialog-box is displayed after a game (word) is won or lost. The dialog-box will display a happy or frowning face, whether the game was won or lost, the correct word, and the number of games won and lost.

Questions and answers

Question: How do I guess a letter.

Answer: Use the <u>Guess letter</u> dialog-box by clicking on a letter button. The letter will disappear and can not be chosen again for that game (word). If the letter is in the word, the letter(s) will be shown. Otherwise another part of the hang man will be shown. If the hang mans whole body is shown before the word is guessed, the player loses.

Question: How do I guess a word.

Answer: Use the Game-Guess word menu command or the Guess word button to invoke the <u>Guess word</u> dialog-box. To guess a word, simply type in the word. There is no penelty for a wrong answer, but only one guess is allowed per guessed letter.

Question: How do I add to the word list.

Answer: Use an editor such as Edit for MS-DOS or Notepad for MS-Windows and simply add words (in any order), one per line. Do not include any spaces or other punctuation.
