 Each record in the Master File can have only one comment, to 120 characters. 0
 In Chapter 10, we will search for words that you had entered into 0
 the comments, irrespective of where those words occurred. 0

 This report contains 2 pages but requires 4 screens to display it. 0
 Rather than continue 'scrolling' through the report with 'PgDn', 0
 let's enter Escape to return to the prior menu. 0
