It is commercial software which you are allowed to use and evaluate before paying for it. This makes shareware the ultimate in money back guarantees.

With shareware you get to use the product for a limited time, without spending a penny. You are able to use the software on your own system(s), in your own special work environment, with no sales people looking over your shoulder. If you decide not to continue using it, you throw it away and forget all about it. No paperwork, phone calls, or correspondence to waste your valuable time. If you do continue using it, then - and only then - do you pay for it.

The shareware system and the continued availability of quality shareware products depend on your willingness to register and pay for the shareware you use. It's the registration fees you pay

which allow us to support and continue to develop our products.
