Defined Terms

What is CodePrint?

CodePrint [™] is a Windows 3.1 compatible program for printing ASCII text files on any printer supported by Windows. What makes CodePrint unique is you have control over how the text is formatted on the page. You can open and save configurations that store the page formatting for the various text files that you normally print. For example, if you are a programmer you can save a configuration for printing your source code two-up on a page. Users of on-line services can save a configuration for printing README files or ON-LINE service listings. To save the amount of paper used, CodePrint has a duplex printing option that allows printing on both sides of the paper. A duplexing printer is not required but is supported. Features include:

- Portrait or Landscape paper orientation
- Multiple columns
- Include headers and/or footers that you define including filename, date and page number
- Option to print FULL filename path or filename ONLY
- Option to select file creation/modified date or date printed
- Change fonts, style and size
- Include border with column dividers or dividers ONLY
- Optional border widths, LIGHT, MEDIUM or HEAVY
- Change left, top, right and bottom margin
- Change the spacing used to expand tabs
- Text automatically wraps if wider than column
- Change wrap symbol and turn ON or OFF
- Option to truncate lines at the right margin
- Option to include line numbers
- Open and save page setups
- Compatible with Windows 3.1 Drag-Drop feature using File Manager
- Duplex printing option print on both sides of the paper
- Multiple instances of CodePrint allow you to drop files to several different configurations
- Maintains a list of most recently used (MRU) configurations
- Compatible with Windows NT
- · Supports command line arguments useful for batch processing

The Drag-Drop feature under Windows 3.1 allows you to select files from the File Manager and Drag and then Drop them over the CodePrint icon for printing.

Benefits of Registering

CodePrint is distributed as shareware and you must therefore register the software if you continue to use the program beyond the 21 day evaluation period. When you register CodePrint you will receive the following benefits.

- Latest version of the software on disk
- On-line support from Compuserve or written support by mail
- Notification of low-cost upgrades
- Registration information to remove information screen during program start-up

If you use CodePrint print, please register by filling out the registration form and sending in your registration fee.

Upgrade Information

Upgrades for CodePrint will be handled in the following manner. The three upgrade classifications are as follows.

1	Bug fixes ONLY	Increments version number in the x position as in 2.1x			
2	Minor enhancements w/possible bug fixes	Increments version number in the x position as in 2.x0			
3	Major enhancements w/possible bug fixes	Increments version number in the x position as in x.00			

Class 1 upgrades are **always** free to <u>registered users</u> by downloading the <u>shareware</u> <u>version</u> from one of many locations. If you have version 2.00 or higher, your current registration number will convert the shareware version to a registered version. If you have problems, please contact us. (See **contact information** below)

Class 2 upgrades are usually free as well. They can be downloaded in the same manner as class 1 upgrades. However, there may be occasions were a small fee is required for shipping and handling of a new disk. This fee will be between \$3-\$5 and is subject to change.

Upgrade notices will be sent for class 3 upgrades. Class 3 upgrades will require a small upgrade fee. If you decide to upgrade you would simply return the form with your upgrade fee. You will then receive a new disk of the latest version.

File Menu

The File menu includes commands that allow you to open and save page configurations, change printer settings and exit CodePrint. The File menu also includes a <u>MRU list</u>.

For more information, select the File menu command.

Page Menu

The Page menu includes commands that allow you to change the current font, header and footer text and page layout options.

The Options menu includes commands that allow you to change the way CodePrint operates.

The Help menu includes commands that allow you to display help for various topics related to CodePrint.

Control Menu

The <u>Control menu</u>, duplicates the most used commands as well as providing support for duplex printing when CodePrint is run as an icon. The following commands are only available from the Control menu by selecting the <u>Application icon</u>.

Open Configuration Info Duplex Printing Print Pass 2 Cancel Pass 2

List Command

The List push button on the main CodePrint window is used to populate the file list box with files in the current directory that match the wild card specification in the **File spec.** edit control. Therefore, if a file name is entered or displayed in this field, by selecting a file name from the file list box, the List push button is disabled.

Select File(s) Command

The Select push button on the main CodePrint window is used to populate the print list box with the selection in the **File spec.** edit control. If the file spec. control contains a file name, the file name will be displayed in the print list box. If the file spec. control contains a wild card specification such as *.txt, all the files in the current directory with a TXT extension are displayed in the print list box. If the file spec. edit control is blank, the Select push button is disabled.

Print File(s) Command

The Print Files push button on the main CodePrint window is used to print all the files listed in the print list box located directly under the button. If the print list box is empty, this button is disabled.

Remove Command

The Remove push button on the main CodePrint window is used to delete the file entry selected in the print list box. If the print list box is empty, this button is disabled.

Clear All Command

The Clear All push button on the main CodePrint window is used to delete all the file entries displayed in the print list box. If the print list box is empty, this button is disabled.

Opening a Configuration

To change the current <u>configuration</u>, select Open Configuration from the File menu or click the Open button on the toolbar, to display the Open Configuration dialog. The first configuration is always <u>DEFAULTS</u>. Other saved configurations are listed below DEFAULTS.

To load a configuration, highlight the configuration you want to open and press OK or doubleclick the highlighted line using the left mouse button. The selected configuration is now the current one with the configuration name displayed in the caption bar.

Saving Current Configuration

To save the current <u>configuration</u>, select Save from the File menu. This option is GRAYED if no changes have been made. Alternately you can click the Save button on the toolbar.

The following information is saved with each configuration.

- Page specific number of columns, margins, spacing for tabs, line number status, border, orientation and wrap symbol
- Font specific size, style and type face
- Header specific header text
- Footer specific footer text
- Options status
- General file spec., directory path and window position

Saving As a New Configuration

To save the current <u>configuration</u> with a new name, select Save As from the File menu to display the Save As dialog. The current configuration name is displayed in the <u>edit control</u>.

To save the current configuration using the current name, press OK. To save the current configuration under a new name, type the new configuration name and press OK.

The following information is saved with each configuration.

- Page specific number of columns, margins, spacing for tabs, line number status, border, border width, orientation and wrap symbol
- Font specific size, style and type face
- Header specific header text
- Footer specific footer text
- General file spec., directory path and window position

Changing Printer Setup

To change the default printer, page orientation or the duplex option (ONLY if supported by the printer), select Printer Setup from the File menu.

Note: You can also change the page orientation from the Page:Layout menu item.

Changing Fonts

To change the current font, select Fonts from the Page menu to display the Font dialog. This is the font common dialog new to Windows 3.1.

Changing font, style or size affects both the page text and the header/footer text.

Changing Header/Footer

To change the header and/or footer text, select Header/Footer from the Page menu to display the Header/Footer dialog. You can enter any text you want for either the header or footer. To access the file name, date/time or the page number you can press the appropriate push button along the bottom of the dialog, which will insert the formatting characters at the location of the **I-beam** cursor. For example, to produce the following footer

c:\files\readme\readme.txt - page 1

enter the following footer text in the footer edit control.

%**f -** page %**p**

Where f inserts the file name and p inserts the current page number.

When the date formatting character (**%d**) is used in the header or footer, you must select the "Use Date Created" option to print the date/time the file was created. Otherwise select the "Use Date Printed" option to print the current date/time the file was printed.

When the file formatting character (**%f**) is used in the header or footer, you must select the "Use Full Path" option to print the filename with the FULL path. Otherwise select the "Use Filename ONLY" option to print only the filename.

For the header or footer to be printed, the header and footer check boxes must be checked. The middle and right status fields, located below Columns, displays the current status of the header and footer respectively. If "On" is displayed, the option is ON, while "Off" means disabled.

Changing Page Layout

To change the page layout options, select Layout from the Page menu to display the page layout dialog. From the page layout dialog you can change or toggle the following page features.

- Number of text columns per page
- The spacing used to expand tabs
- Enable printing a line wrap symbol
- Enable or disable line numbers
- The amount, in inches, for the left, top, right and bottom margins
- Page border with column dividers, column dividers only or no border or column dividers
- Border line width
- Page orientation which can be landscape or portrait

Drag and Drop Printing

CodePrint takes advantage of the new Drag-and-Drop feature of Windows 3.1. CodePrint must be minimized to use Drag-and-Drop. To use the drag-and-drop feature, open File Manager and select the text file(s) you want to print. Then drag the files over a CodePrint icon and release the mouse button.

Duplex Printing

Duplex printing allows you to save paper by printing on both sides of the paper. To use the duplex printing option with printers that do not internally support duplex printing, you must enable this feature by selecting Duplex Printing from the Options menu.

PRINTER DIRECTLY SUPPORTS DUPLEX PRINTING

If you have a <u>duplex printer</u> you must change the duplex printing option from the Printer Setup dialog box. From the Printer Setup dialog box, choose the Options button. In the Duplex Printing group box, select the option you want to use. (If your printer does not support duplex printing, this option will not appear in the dialog box.) Choose the OK button and print as normal using either RESTORED MODE or MINIMIZED MODE. If you want to turn OFF duplex printing you must select the none option within the Duplex Printing group box.

Note: It is recommended that you have a <u>duplex printer</u> <i>if you use the Duplex Printing option on a network.

SIMPLEX PRINTERS

If you have a <u>simplex printer</u>, CodePrint will allow you to print on both sides of the paper by printing all the ODD pages first. You must then re-insert the sheets to print the EVEN pages on the opposite side of the page. Follow the procedures outlined below for either RESTORED MODE or MINIMIZED MODE.

Note: HP is one printer manufacturer that does not recommend printing on both sides of the paper by turning over the paper and running it through the printer on the reverse side if you are using one of their simplex printers.

RESTORED MODE

Duplex printing requires two steps when printing on a printer that does not support built-in duplex printing. First you select the files you want to print and choose the <u>Print File(s)</u> button. After the files are sent to the printer or to Print Manager, the following message is displayed.

When printing is complete, turn sheets over and re-insert in printer so the blank-side of the first sheet is on the top. Then choose the Print File(s) button again.

Press OK. The files you printed will remain in the Print list box. Next, wait until all the sheets are placed in the output tray. Then place the sheets back in the printer's input tray and choose the Print File(s) button again to print on the back of the page as required. This completes duplex printing.

MINIMIZED MODE

There is only a slightly different procedure to follow when CodePrint is minimized. After dragging the file(s) to the <u>Application icon</u> the following message is displayed.

When printing is complete, turn sheets over and re-insert in printer so the blank-side of the first sheet is on the top. Then choose Print Pass 2 from Control Menu. Press OK. The icon now displays a RED light on the right side of the printer. This is an indication the pass 2 is pending. When pass 1 printing is complete, and with CodePrint still minimized select the application icon to display the <u>Control menu</u>. Now select **Print Pass 2** to complete duplex printing. The printer light on the icon changes back to BLACK. If you need to cancel Pass 2 printing select **Cancel Pass 2** from the Control menu.

Due to the variety of printers on the market, you may have to experiment with the order the sheets are output from the printer and the order and orientation required when placed back in the input tray. Therefore it is suggested that you print only one file with multiple sheets for test purposes.

Sheet Order

When duplex printing is enabled for <u>simplex printers</u>, you must pay attention to the order the sheets are placed in the output tray after the first printing pass and also the order they are placed back in the input tray for the second printing pass.

The output tray order should be as follows.



You should then turn the sheets over and place them back in the input tray as follows for the second printing pass.



You may need to experiment to get the front to back orientation you require. For example, try rotating the pages 180 degrees.

Using the Toolbar

The toolbar, displayed below the menu bar, provides quick access to various commands.



Opens a configuration.



Saves the current configuration.



Displays the font dialog.



Displays the header/footer dialog.



Displays the page layout dialog.

The two status fields to the right of the buttons display the size, in bytes, and the date last modified for the file selected in the file list box. Initially these fields are blank and will not display information until a file is selected in the file list box.

Using Multiple Instances of CodePrint

CodePrint supports <u>multiple instances</u>. Why would you want to do this? The obvious reason is with the Drag-and-Drop feature new to Windows version 3.1.

As an example suppose you normally switch between two different configurations. One prints two-up in landscape mode, the other prints one-up in portrait mode. To use this feature open the first copy, which is set to use the two-up configuration and minimize it. Now open a second instance and minimize it. Select the <u>Application icon</u> to access the <u>Control menu</u>. Select Open Configuration to open the one-up configuration.

Now when you want to print files using the two-up configuration simply drop them on that icon. To print one-up drop the files on the other icon.

Using Command Line Arguments

The normal method used to start CodePrint and other Windows programs is to double click on the program name from File Manager or on the icon in a Program Manager group. However, you may want to start CodePrint in a way that will print one or more files and then terminate. CodePrint supports several command line arguments that allows you to start it, for example from the File:Run... dialog, print a file and then terminate. The following command line arguments can be used with CodePrint.

/f - Use this argument to specify a file name to print. for example: /fc:\autoexec.bat

you may also use -f this option can be specified multiple times

/c - Use this argument to specify the configuration used to format the page. The name used must be one saved in the [Configuration] section of the CodePrint INI file.

for example: /creadme

you may also use -c this option should only be specified once

/t - Use this argument with a 1 to terminate CodePrint after printing the files specified with the /f argument. Otherwise use 0. for example: /t0 or /t1

you may also use -t this option should only be specified once

The above options can be specified in any order. For example, to print the autoexec.bat and config.sys files from c:\ using a configuration named 'LISTINGS' and terminate after printing, the command line entered in the File:Run... dialog would be specified as follows.

c:\codeprnt\codeprnt.exe /t1 /fc:\autoxec.bat /fc:\config.sys /clistings

Open Configuration Command

Use this command to change the current <u>configuration</u>. Select Open from the File menu to display the Open Configuration dialog. The first configuration is always <u>DEFAULTS</u>. Other saved configurations are listed below DEFAULTS.

To load a configuration, highlight the configuration you want to open and press OK. The new configuration name is displayed in the caption bar.

Save Command

Use this command to save the current <u>configuration</u>. This command is initially GRAYED. If changes are made to the current configuration the Save command is enabled.

For a visual indication of when changes have been made, the window title displays an '*' between the application name and the configuration name as shown.

CodePrint * [Readme]

After changes are saved by selecting Save from the File menu or clicking the Save button on the toolbar, the title bar changes as shown.

CodePrint - [Readme]

To save the current configuration under a new name select Save As from the File menu.

The following information is saved with each configuration.

- Page specific number of columns, margins, spacing for tabs, line number status, border, border width, orientation and wrap symbol
- Font specific size, style and type face
- Header specific header text
- Footer specific footer text
- Options status
- General file spec. and directory path

Save As Command

Use this command to save the current <u>configuration</u> with a new name. Select Save As from the File menu to display the Save As dialog.

The following information is saved for each configuration.

- Page specific number of columns, margins, spacing for tabs, line number status, border, border width, orientation and wrap symbol
- Font specific size, style and type face
- Header specific header text
- Footer specific footer text
- Options status
- General file spec. and directory path

Printer Setup Command

Use this command to change various printer options. Select Printer Setup from the File menu to display the Printer Setup dialog. You can change printer options such as default printer, page orientation and duplex options (if supported by the installed printer).

To control duplex printing for a <u>duplex printer</u>, choose the Options button and select the duplex option you want to use within the Duplex Printing group box.

Exit Command

Select Exit to close CodePrint.
Font Command

Use this command to change the current font used for printing. Select Font from the Page menu to display the Font dialog. Changing the font, style or size changes both the page text and the header and footer text.

Header/Footer Command

Use this command to change the header and/or footer text. Select Header/Footer from the Page menu to display the Header/Footer dialog. You have the option to include or not include header and footer text. You can enter any text and optionally include format codes to insert the File Name, Date/Time or Page number in the header or footer. You also have the option to print the filename with the FULL path or just the filename and print the creation/modified date/time of the file or the date/time it was printed.

Page Layout Command

Use this command to change the page layout options. Select Layout from the Page menu to display the Page Layout dialog. From the Page Layout dialog you can change number of columns on a page, the number of spaces used to expand tabs, toggle printing of the line wrap symbol or change symbol, toggle printing line numbers, toggle printing without or with a border with column dividers or column dividers only, change page orientation, and change the left, top, right and bottom margin.

Page Info Command

Use this command to display summary information for the current configuration. Information displayed in this dialog supplements information not displayed on the toolbar or status sections of the main window.

The following summary information is shown.

- Characters per line and lines per page
- Current status of Option menu items
- Current margin settings

Use Path Option Command

Use this command to toggle the option to use the path saved with a configuration. When this option is checked, CodePrint will use the path and file spec. saved with the current configuration as the working directory during startup and when a saved configuration is opened.

If this option is not checked, CodePrint will use the default working directory, as listed in the Program Managers "Program Item Properties" dialog for the CodePrint icon item, during startup and when a saved configuration is opened.

Ignore Form Feeds Option Command

Use this command to toggle the option to ignore form feed characters. When this option is checked, CodePrint will ignore form feed characters within a text file.

If this option is not checked, CodePrint recognize form feed characters by advancing to the next page.

Truncate Lines Option Command

Use this command to toggle the option to truncate text printed on the page. When this option is checked, all lines are truncated if wider than the page.

If this option is not checked (default), all lines wider than the page will wrap to the next line.

Duplex Printing Option Command

Use this command to toggle the option to enable duplex printing when using a <u>simplex</u> <u>printer</u>. When this option is checked, CodePrint will print on both sides of the paper. If a <u>duplex printer</u> is the default printer, this option is ignored.

If this option is not checked (default), or the none option (from printer setup) is selected for <u>duplex printers</u>, only one side of the paper is used.

Note: It is recommended that you ONLY print to a <u>duplex printer</u> when using the duplex option on a network.

Help Contents Command

Use this command to display the help index for CodePrint.

Help Search Command

Use this command to display the help search dialog for locating specific help topics.

Help About CodePrint Command

Use this command to display the about dialog for CodePrint. This dialog contains copyright information, version number, current Windows mode and Windows resource information.

Open Configuration Command

The Open Configuration command on the <u>Control menu</u> displays the Open Configuration dialog from the <u>Application icon</u>. This command is only accessible from the Application Icon.

The Info command on the <u>Control menu</u> displays the summary information dialog. This command is only accessible from the <u>Application icon</u>.

The Duplex Printing command on the <u>Control menu</u> toggles the option to enable duplex printing when using a <u>simplex printer</u>. This command is only accessible from the <u>Application</u> icon.

Print Pass 2 Command

The Print Pass 2 command on the <u>Control menu</u> starts pass 2 when duplex printing is enabled for <u>simplex printers</u>. This item is grayed until after one or more files are dropped on the application icon. This command is only accessible from the <u>Application icon</u>.

Cancel Pass 2 Command

The Cancel Pass 2 command on the <u>Control menu</u> cancels pass 2 of duplex printing. This item is grayed until one or more files are dropped on the application icon. This command is only accessible from the <u>Application icon</u>.

Page Layout Dialog

The Page Layout dialog allows you to change the number of columns on a page, the number of spaces used to expand tabs, toggle printing line numbers, toggle printing without or with a border with column dividers, change border line width, change paper orientation, and change the left, top, right and bottom margin.

The following chart list the DEFAULTS settings.

If you are using a dot matrix printer and the right or bottom margins are off the page, you may want to change the margins as follows.

Left	Тор	Right	Botto m
0.10"	0.30"	0.10"	0.30"

You may have to experiment to find the margin settings that work correctly with your printer.

Contents

The Contents contains a list of all Help topics available for CodePrint. For information on how to use Help, press F1 or choose Using Help from the Help menu.

Application icon

A graphic that represents a running application. This icon appears only after you start an application and then minimize (reduce) it.

Configuration

A configuration stores program options. You can therefore change settings such as the font and font size and save this information under various names. The default configuration is always available if you want to load the application defaults.

Control Menu

This menu, also known as the System menu, contains commands you use to manipulate a window. The control menu is also available when an application is minimized to an icon. To access the control menu click on the box located next to the title bar of the window or select the application icon when minimized.

Default

The DEFAULTS configuration retains the settings as shipped.

Duplex Printer

A duplex printer prints on both sides of the paper. A duplex printer is recommended when printing to a network printer.

Edit Control

A edit control is a field for retrieving information from the user that is required by the application program.

MRU List

The most recently used (MRU) list provides quick access to recently used configurations, without accessing the Open Configuration dialog. When a configuration is opened, its name is placed as the first name in the MRU list, located on the File menu above Exit. Up to 4 configuration names are listed at any one time. Older names are removed from the list.

Multiple Instance

Multiple instance refers to running more than one copy of an application.

Registered Users

A registered user is a thoughtful person who paid the required fee to register CodePrint. As a registered user you are entitled to various benefits such as free support and notification of upgrades.

Shareware Version

A shareware version of CodePrint displays 2 opening NAG screens when the program is first loaded. Once the software is properly registered, these screens will no longer appear.

Simplex Printer

A simplex printer prints on one side of the paper. To implement duplex printing on this type of printer you must turn the paper over and run it through the printer on the reverse side.

Font

Displays the currently selected printer font name, size and style.

Printer

Displays the currently selected default printer.

Columns

Displays the number of page columns in the format C:#, where # is the number of columns.

Line Numbers

Displays the status of the line number option in the form L:Off or L:On.

Duplex Mode

Displays the status of the duplex option selectable from the menu and duplex support for the selected printer in the form D:Off [#] or D:On [#], where # is "Supported" if the printer has built-in duplex support or "Not Supported" if the printer does not support duplex printing.

Headers

Displays the status of the header option in the form H:Off or H:On.
Footers

Displays the status of the footer option in the form F:Off or F:On.

Border

Displays the status of the border option in the form B:Off or B:On.

Page Orientation

Displays the status of the page orientation currently selected.
