1.2 Disclaimer

This animation has a warranty of 60ns from date of purchase, applying to users based in the Bermuda Triangle....

In other words if your Amiga blows up, it's not my fault!!

But then again, what can possibly go wrong with an animation?

1.3 Requirements

1. Any Amiga
2. The animation has only been tested on an AGA machine, but it should work on ocs/ecs Amigas. See point 4. Considering how many kewl new modes there are with AGA you should upgrade right now. Have you seen 1472 x 580 in 262,144 colours :-0
3. 3 meg of free RAM. If you have 3 meg exactly, then you may need to disable the startup-sequence to get it working. The actual animation is 1.5 meg and refuses to work on a basic 2 meg A1200.
4. The three icons have been included for different systems.

Owners of multisync monitors should use "Windoze.VGA"
Standard AGA owners using a TV should use "Windoze.PAL"
Owners of OCS/ECS machines should use "Windoze.ECS" (Not tested)

1.4 Reason?

Well the best one would be because I don't like the PC, and especially Windoze. Comparing this to Workbench 3.0 is a joke! Now you can now annoy all those PC freaks that may visit occasionally with their smug comments. Show them this and they'll be in tears :-0

Seriously though, the Amiga is being treated unfairly in the computer world at the moment. It was multitasking 10 years ago and only now is the PC attempting to do the same, provided you have more RAM than I have Hard Drive space...

1.5 My System

Since upgrading from an A500+ in July 1995, I have acquired the following:

8 meg of fast RAM

Microvitec Deltascan 1402 multiscan monitor

Reno portable dual speed CD-ROM

1.6 Upgrade

If you want to make sure the Amiga's future is secure the word "upgrading" comes to mind. Give software developers the freedom to release titles without the restrictions of a 2 meg 14Mhz Amiga.

- Hard Drives: So cheap these days. You'll easily get a Gig for £130. Since purchasing one, I found it the most essential piece of hardware for the Amiga. You'll never look at floppies in the same way again!
- Accelerators: Plenty to choose from and fairly cheap. £99 now for a Blizzard, or drool over the new PowerPC ones, check out Phase 5's site for details.
- Extra RAM: Very cheap now. £24 for 8 meg is a snip. There is no excuse for 2MB anymore. I'm glad shareware games are taking advantage of this. But even my system is getting out of date for the more intense graphic games ;-)
- CD-ROM: At the moment, the ultimate media for distribution purposes. 640M on each disc. Get one!!
- MODEM: The Internet is the most talked about subject as far as computer enthusiasts are concerned. Heck, you must already have one if you are reading this! Unless the 'office' machine was secretly used!!!

That's about it really. Prove to the PC owners what the Amiga can do. Showing them Worms from Team 17 would be a good idea. it plays fine on a basic A1200, with perfect scrolling. On a 486DX66 with 8 meg, the scrolling is appalling. Work that one out Bill Gates!!

For owners of a similar accelerator to mine, I recommend XTreme Racing from Silltunna Software for an excellent Mario-Kart style 3D racing game and the Doom clone of your choice. (Millions to pick from!) Full screen 1x1 pixel ratio runs at about 10 frames per second...
