The Wirenet Dashboard is designed to provide a friendly interface to your internet connection. It consists of a number of buttons to start various functions, some of these buttons have cycle gadgets alongside them to select options for the function. All of the buttons have keyboard shortcuts, indicated by the underlined letters.

The buttons are:

About Dashboard

This brings up some program information with an option for online help.

1.3 Connect

Connect

Dials into U-Net and puts you online. It has five options, selected from the cycle gadget:

Open Go online and send any outstanding news or mail

Mail As Open, plus fetches any mail in your mailbox

News As Mail, but also gets all new News

AutoMail As Mail and then automatically disconnects

AutoNews As News and then automatically disconnects

If you click on Connect while you are already online, a requester will pop up to let you know and give the option of sending any queued events.

1.4 Disconnect

Disconnect

Breaks your connection. After taking you offline, it processes any mail and news you may have received, ready to be viewed in Thor. It has two options

Now Breaks the connection immediately

Wait Waits until all sending/receiving of news/mail has finished

before disconnecting

1.5 **Get**

Get

Fetches mail and/or news. The options are

Mail Fetches new mail

News Fetches new news

All Fetches new mail and news

This is an alternative to selecting Mail or News collection for the $$\operatorname{\textsc{Connect}}$$

button. do not try to use both at once.

1.6 World Wide Web

World Wide Web

This starts up the AWeb browser.

For documentation on AWeb, just start it up and press the help key.

1.7 File Transfer

File Transfer

This starts the AmiFTP program. Full documentation is in AmiFTP.guide. This is in the doc drawer of the Internet drawer, on the drive you selected for installation.

1.8 Browse News

Browse News

This starts the ConnectThor news browser, you have to be online to use this option.

You can then look through newsgroups online, downloading the headers and selecting which articles you want to fetch. This is of course much slower than automatically getting news, so it is probably best if you only use it in those newsgroups that contain large binary postings.

1.9 Read Mail & News

Read Mail & News

Starts the Thor news and mail program.

You can then read your mail and news offline, without worrying about your phone bill. Any replies or postings you write will automatically be sent next time you connect.

For more information read the docs in the Thor drawer, or press the $Help\ key$ when Thor is active.

1.10 User Buttons

User Buttons

The two user buttons allow you to customise the operation of Dashboard.

Clciking on User A will run Internet/UserScripts/Function.A. This can be either a dos or arexx script, but it must have the script protection bit set. A dos script is simply a list of commands, as typed in a shell. So you could start AmIRC from Button A with the foillowing line in Function.A:

Run >NIL: Wirenet:AmIRC/AmIRC

The text for the buttons is set in the

User

section of Dashboard Preferences.

1.11 Exit

Exit.

This ends the dashboard program.

If you are online at the time, your internet connection won't be affected.

1.12 Quit

Quit

This shuts down your TCP stack (AmiTCP or Miami) and then exits.

The TCP stack is the main interface between your Amiga and the Internet and is automatically started when you start Dashboard.

Selecting Quit while online will break your connection and stop some programs. You shouldn't do this, instead

normally and then select Quit,

otherwise you risk losing any information being transferred at the time.

A warning requester will appear if you select Quit while online.

If in doubt, don't change anything.

This window sets the name of the server to use for Aminet downloads, the directory these downloads are stored in and whether the readme files are downloaded as well.

These settings are used when you have selected files for Aminet download within Thor.
