

NETDIAL READ ME FILE

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

NetDial is an Internet dialer for Microsoft Windows. NetDial was made to (hopefully if you like it) replace your packaged TCP/IP dial-up program. NetDial will call your host, log you in and start your TCP/IP package for you, automatically. NetDial has many features, some of which are:

- Supports configurations for up to 5 separate connections
- Baud rate support to 256k baud
- Easy to set up login scripts for getting you logged in automatically
- AutoDial on Startup option means you just have to start the program, NetDial takes care of the rest.
- Can redial up to 99 times, allowing you to get other things done while NetDial gets you on the Internet.
- Run it minimized and out of sight if you want, NetDial can inform you of a successful connect by playing a user-specified WAV file.

SYSTEM REQUIREMENTS

- 386 processor or better
- Microsoft Windows 3.1 or later
- 900kb free hard drive space

INSTALLING NETDIAL

To install NetDial, follow these steps:

1. Create a directory for NetDial.
2. Unzip the NetDial.Zip file to the directory that you created in Step 1.
3. Move the following files as specified:

<u>FILE NAME</u>	<u>DESTINATION DIRECTORY</u>
CTL3DV2.DLL	Your Windows SYSTEM directory
MSAFINX.DLL	Your Windows SYSTEM directory
VBRUN300.DLL	Your Windows SYSTEM directory
CMDIALOG.VBX	Your Windows SYSTEM directory
SS3D3.VBX	Your Windows SYSTEM directory
THREED.VBX	Your Windows SYSTEM directory
VSVBX.VBX	Your Windows SYSTEM directory
VSVBX.LIC	Your Windows SYSTEM directory

Leave the remaining files where they are!

4. Start Windows. Click on the program group inside the Program Manager window where you wish to add NetDial to, or create a new group. To create a new program group, select File, then New from the Program Manager menu. Then select 'Program Group'. Enter a new group name and select 'OK'.
5. Select File, then New from the Program Manager menu.
6. Select 'Program Item'
7. Enter 'NetDial' in the description box
8. Enter the full path for NetDial.Exe in the 'Command Line' box. For example, if you expanded NetDial.Zip to C:\NetDial, then you would enter 'C:\NetDial\NetDial.Exe' here.
9. Click 'OK' to save the new item. You should now see a NetDial icon in the program group you selected in step 4. To start NetDial, double click the NetDial Icon.

ONLINE HELP

NetDial has built-in online help. If you need help at any time while using NetDial, just press the 'F1' key.
