You can also access the newsgroup alt.tv.x-files for more discussions, or submit story and episode ideas to the alt.tv.x-files.creative newsgroup. In these newsgroups, I've found episode synopses, poems to Mulder, Scully and from Tooms, episode guides, and the X-Files YAXA list. Check it out!
