

# Trouble Shooting Guide

for  
A-10 Attack! 1.1

Q: A-10 Attack! seem to very slow on my Macintosh, what can I do?

A: There are several options for you to try, here are a list of them to try:

1). If you are running A-10 Attack 1.0 or 1.1 on a 68030 (i.e. Lc III or Mac IIsi/ci) try to change that Simulator preferences to suit your Macintosh. i.e.

Turn off "High Object Complexity" and "High Particle Density". Do not set your "Terrain Horizon" higher than medium setting and the "Ground Clutter Range" no higher than near.

2). If you have a Power Macintosh please make sure that the Power Pc Only file is at the same level as the A-10 Attack! 1.x application. If this is not at the same level, the Simulator will run in standard 68k emulation mode.

Q: Can I run A-10 Attack! 1.0 or 1.1 with a 4mb Macintosh.?

A: No, you will not be able to run A-10- Attack! 1.x on a Macintosh with only 4mb of Ram. A-10 Attack! 1.x requires at least 3900k (3.9mb) of Free System Ram to Run!

Q: Can I use memory utilities like Ram Doubler<sup>®</sup> and Virtual Ram<sup>®</sup> with A-10 Attack! 1.x to double my Ram from 4mb to 8mb?

A: Yes you can, But there is a price to pay. The Simulator will be very slow and will sometimes Crash out due to the slowness.

Q: Can I run A-10 Attack 1.x with multiple monitors with different resolutions?

A: You can run A-10 Attack! 1.x with up to 3 monitors, but the resolution must be the same on all monitors.

- Q: When in the Mission Map, I see Waypoints, but do not know which A-10 they apply to?
- A: The Waypoints are set to only one of the A-10's in that Mission. You can tell which A-10 it is by looking at the chits and seeing which one has the Waypoint Cross in the top left hand corner.
- Q: I do not know how to arm and release Weapons, other than the Gau-8a Cannon?
- A: Weapon arming and Release is described in the Training Manual, you will find this Manual in an Electronic format in the A-10 Attack! 1.x Folder on your Macintosh.
