The Setup program menu offers the following options:

Exit	Terminates Setup. (Keyboard shortcut: Ctrl-X)
Install	Starts the installation process. (Keyboard shortcut: Ctrl-I) <u>First Time Installation</u> <u>Upgrade Installation</u>
ReadME	Displays the Read Me file (README.TXT). See this for new information that may not yet be in the on-line help. It also contains instructions for starting Setup.
Help	Gets this help. (Keyboard shortcut: F1)

Changes Setup and Wallpaper Manager Make To Your Windows System

Files: Setup copies the Wallpaper Manager files to the hard disk directory you specify in the Install dialog. The Help/Uninstall menu option will delete all and only these files. It will also delete the Wallpaper Manager directory provided it is empty following the file deletions.

WIN.INI: Setup and Wallpaper Manager may modify the `load=` line in the `[windows]` section if you enable Autostart. Any change is undone if you Uninstall. Wallpaper Manager also changes the `wallpaper=` line in the `[desktop]` section. If you Uninstall and the current wallpaper is not in BMP or RLE format then this line will be set to null; otherwise it is unchanged. Under Windows NT the Win32s build makes these changes in the Registry instead.

SYSTEM.INI: No changes.

AUTOEXEC.BAT and **CONFIG.SYS:** No changes.

Program Items and Groups: Setup creates a Wallpaper Manager Plus program group. This contains a WallPlus program item that you can use to launch Wallpaper Manager Plus and a WM+ ReadMe item that will display the README.TXT in your default editor (usually Windows Notepad). Uninstall does not delete the items or the group.

Support Policy

Support for Setup and Wallpaper Manager Plus is available by phone Monday through Friday, 10:00 am to 7:00 pm Eastern Time. If I do not answer please leave a message on my machine and I will return your call usually within one working day. You can also contact me through CompuServe.

Refund Policy

First Time Installation

When you select Install Setup will display a dialog box suggesting a new directory to install Wallpaper Manager into. If this directory is acceptable just click OK to proceed. If not enter the directory name of your choice.

NOTE: For best results Wallpaper Manager should be installed in its own directory. This will make it easier to install future upgrades or to uninstall the program should you later decide not to use it.

Autostart Checkbox

When checked this will configure Wallpaper Manager to start automatically whenever you start Windows. This is the recommended way to configure Wallpaper Manager and the box is checked by default. You can subsequently turn Autostart on and off from within the Wallpaper Manager program itself.

Remainder of Setup

After Setup has copied the Wallpaper Manager files to the directory you have selected it will prompt you for your name. This personalizes your copy so that your name appears in the About dialog.

Finally, Setup will prompt you to find out if you want it to create a program item for Wallpaper Manager. If you click Yes, Setup will attempt to create a program item (icon) called WallPlus. It will place this item in the Wallpaper Manager Plus program group which it will create if necessary. If you click No you will have to create a program item manually.

When it is finished Setup will offer to display the Read Me file (`README.TXT`) unless you have already used the ReadMe menu option to display it. The Read Me file contains any last minute information that may not yet be in the on-line Help.

Upgrade Installation

First, check the version number of the copy of Wallpaper Manager that you are currently running. Wallpaper Manager's Help/About dialog displays the program version number directly beneath the Wallpaper Manager icon.

If you are currently using version v2.50 or later:

1. When you select Install, Setup will prompt you for an installation directory. Enter the name of the directory where your current copy of Wallpaper Manager is installed. Setup will upgrade it to the new version while preserving your current initialization and gallery files.

If you already have a `WALL.GAL` file in the installation directory Setup will create a new gallery file named `WALL????.GAL` with information on the distribution wallpapers. The `????` is replaced by the current version number of Wallpaper Manager, e.g., `WALL280B.GAL`. You can look at this gallery by opening it using the Gallery/Open command in Wallpaper Manager.

If you are currently using a version prior to v2.50:

1. Before proceeding you may want to manually delete all your current Wallpaper Manager files except your current `WALL.INI` and gallery files.
2. Create a directory to hold the new version of Wallpaper Manager you will be installing, e.g., `C:\WALL`.
3. Copy your original `WALL.INI` file to this directory.
4. Now select Install. Setup will prompt you for an installation directory. Specify the directory you created in step 2).

Autostart Checkbox

When checked this will configure Wallpaper Manager to start automatically whenever you start Windows. This is the recommended way to configure Wallpaper Manager and the box is checked by default. You can subsequently turn Autostart on and off from within the Wallpaper Manager program itself.

Remainder of Setup

After Setup has copied the Wallpaper Manager files to the directory you have selected it may prompt you for your name. This personalizes your copy so that your name appears in the About dialog. If Setup can determine that you are installing over a previous registered version it will skip this step.

Finally, Setup will prompt you to find out if you want it to create a program item for Wallpaper Manager. If you click Yes, Setup will attempt to create a program item (icon) called WallPlus. It will place this item in the Wallpaper Manager Plus program group which it will create if necessary. If you click No you will have to create a program item manually.

When it is finished Setup will offer to display the Read Me file (`README.TXT`) unless you have already used the ReadMe menu option to display it. The Read Me file contains any last minute information that may not yet be in the on-line Help.

Entering Your Name and Registration Number

Setup attempts to determine if you are a registered user. This dialog appears if it cannot confirm that you are already registered.

Unregistered Users

Unregistered users installing a BBS distribution should just click the Unregistered button. This will install an unregistered copy. The unregistered version displays a nag message and does not support GIF and GLZ format wallpapers. Otherwise it is completely equivalent to the registered version.

If you decide to use Wallpaper Manager on a regular basis you must purchase a registered copy. For more information on obtaining a registered copy [click here](#).

Registered Users

Registered users upgrading using a BBS distribution may or may not be prompted for their name and number depending on how old their previous version is and where they install the upgrade. If you received an upgrade notice in the mail you will find your registration number printed in red above your name on the front of the notice. Type your name and number exactly as they appear in the appropriate edit boxes then click on Registered.

If you cannot find your registration number [contact me](#) and I will let you know what it is.

Clicking Cancel will stop the installation process. A working copy will not be installed after canceling.

Users receiving a registered copy in the mail from me should not see this dialog. If you do it is an error and you should click Cancel and then rerun Setup. If the problem persists please [contact me](#).

Registering Wallpaper Manager

Wallpaper Manager is sold directly in a registered version and is also distributed as shareware in an unregistered version.

If you obtained your copy from a BBS or other shareware source it is (or should be) an unregistered copy. You are free to try the unregistered program out and see if it meets your needs. You are also free to copy the unregistered distribution files and to pass them on unmodified and complete to others.

If you like the program and make regular use of it you must purchase a registered copy. Not doing so is, for one thing, a violation of my legal copyright. More importantly it hurts the shareware marketing system which helps make good software widely available for low cost and minimal risk to the buyer.

It has been my experience that well-intentioned individuals (myself included) will occasionally overlook registering a shareware product they routinely use. To help prevent this oversight the unregistered version of Wallpaper Manager displays a nag message when it starts and occasionally thereafter during wallpaper changes. As a further inducement the unregistered version does not support `GLZ` and `GIF` format wallpapers. Otherwise, it is identical to the registered version.

When you register you will also get the most current version of Wallpaper Manager (shareware postings can be quite out of date). In addition you will be entitled to automatic notification of any major upgrades. These will be made available either for free or for minimal cost.
