CompuServe Catalog-Files Manager

CisLib is a CompuServe Catalog-files manager for Windows. It is intended for those users that need a Windows tool to manage their <u>Catalog files</u>; it reads, reorders and discards filenames. <u>TapCis</u> and <u>GoCIS</u> users can use CisLib to download files and to save descriptions of downloaded files. CisLib is 100% TapCis and GoCIS compatible.

Introduction

To run CisLib you need a personal computer with Microsoft Windows 3.1 or above. CisLib also works in a Windows session under OS/2 version 2.1 and OS/2 Warp and on a Windows NT 3.50 workstation.

It is not necessary to have a copy of <u>TapCis</u>, or <u>GoCIS</u> although CisLib has many functions to interact with these programs.

Modules required to correctly run CisLib:

CISLIB.EXEMain Program.THREED.VBXA Visual Basic VBX.CMDIALOG.VBXA Visual Basic VBX.VBINT.DLLAn External DLL.VBRUN300.DLLVisual Basic runtime module (not included).

The complete CisLib package also contains:

CISLIB.HLP	Help Module.
MYFILE.CAT	A catalog file for your tests.
FILE_ID.DIZ	Summary (Abstract).
README.TXT	Instructions.
CISLIB.XLM	A simple Excel 4 macro to read the History file.

Strictly speaking, this module (CisLib.Hlp) is not essential to the program but we greatly recommended having it.

Getting Started

CisLib needs no installation or setup!!!

All that you need is the Visual Basic runtime module VBRUN300.DLL.

The first time you run CisLib, it creates its <u>initialization file</u> in its <u>starting directory</u>. After this, we suggest that you move the initialization file into your <u>Windows directory</u> and the three extensions (Threed.Vbx, Cmdialog.Vbx and Vbint.Dll) into your <u>System directory</u>. In this way you can place Cislib.Exe wherever you want, because it needs no other file than the initialization file and the three extensions.

Setup option is strongly recommended for TapCis and GoCIS users.

Simply click on the *Setup* Button (<u>Button Bar Commands</u>); choose your <u>Navigator</u> and click the *Find* Button; CisLib will look for selected navigator across all directories and all available disks; if found, all of the <u>Extended Features</u> will become available.

Mastering CisLib

When you feel confident enough with CisLib, try these *master* options:

Preferred Sort.

This option allows you to set up a preferred sort of your CompuServe catalog file using up to three keys. In the *Sort* Menu select *More Sort* option. Then select your favorite sort keys and click on the *Set* command button in the preferences area.

Save descriptions.

These two options allow you to save a description for every file to download and to get descriptions in the same directory used by your <u>navigator</u> for downloads. It is very useful to have a file and its description in the same directory. No more file-unzipping only to see the contents. To activate this important feature, choose *Options* label from the *Setup* form and check the *Save Descriptions* box.

Save a history file.

Choose this option, and every time you mark a file for download, a new record is written in the CisLib History file (CisLib.His). Important information such as Forum, Section, Date of Download, File length, and Title will be saved. You can retrieve this information by loading the history file into an Excel© sheet. A simple Excel 4 macro comes with this program to make it easier to read the history file.

From the *Setup* form, choose *Options* and check *History File*. Mark some files for Download, and save the catalog file. Run Excel. Load CisLib.XIm and run the macro.

Uninstalling

To uninstall CisLib you can delete all the file contents in CISLIB.ZIP.

If you have moved some file(s) in <u>Windows directory</u> or <u>System directory</u> then:

<u>CISLIB.INI</u>. You can delete it.

• THREED.VBX , CMDIALOG.VBX, VBINT.DLL (in your <u>System directory</u>). You can delete these files *ONLY* if other programs do not need them. (You know, this is an unresolved problem of Windows programs).

In most cases you would leave THREED.VBX and CMDIALOG.VBX and could delete VBINT.DLL. Our suggestion is to rename all files (i.e. *ren Threed.Vbx Threed.old*) and delete them after a while.

CisLib Outputs

As we do not like programs that create a large number of files (i.e. index files), only one file, the <u>initialization file</u>, is created exclusively for CisLib purposes. However other files (mainly log files) are also created.

CisLib.Ini

This is the initialization file. This file is created in CisLib <u>starting directory</u>. We suggest you to copy CisLib.Ini into your <u>Windows Directory</u>.

CisLib.His

This is the history file, containing information about downloaded files. This file is created and updated only if you choose to create it (<u>Setup</u>). CisLib.His resides in the CisLib <u>starting directory</u>.

CisLib.Err

This is the error log file. We have tested CisLib for about two months in the SWBETA forum, and believe that virtually all the errors have been found and fixed. Should an error occur, CisLib writes the error log file in its <u>starting directory</u>. You may send us this file with a brief description of the error. This will help us to understand and fix the problem.

<FileName>.Des

This is the description file containing a long description of a downloaded file. This file is created only if you choose to create it (<u>Setup</u>). The description files reside in the same directory that <u>TapCis</u> or <u>GoCIS</u> use for their downloads. (TapCis users will find these files in their <u>Download File Path</u> directory).

<Forum>.Dow

This is the script file containing commands for <u>TapCis</u>. This file is read when the catalog file is opened, and is written (or overwritten) if there are files to download.

<Forum>.Lxr

This is the download command file used by <u>GoCIS</u>. This file is read when the catalog file is opened, and is written (or overwritten) if there are files to download.

~VB????.Tmp

Temporary files are occasionally created and deleted. These files are created in a temporary directory (if any) or in your root directory (so you can easily find and delete them).

. (All Files)

You can create files using CisLib by selecting *Save As...* option in <u>Menu File</u> or checking the *Save Discarded Filenames* in the <u>Discard Form</u>.

Features Checklist

Basic functions

- Reads CompuServe <u>Catalog files</u>.
- Shows a list of filenames and the long description of selected files.

• Discards single file titles or all duplicate file titles (<u>Discard Form</u>) or older file titles from your Catalog File. Optionally saves discarded filenames in a separate file (<u>Discard Form</u>).

- Saves with user specified filenames and deletes unwanted catalog files. (<u>Menu File</u>).

• Time and date are shown in national formats according to settings in International section of Control Panel.

- ToolTips available on <u>Button Bar Commands.</u>
- Expected / Recommended action is shown in Status Bar (CisLib Main Window).
- Most recent Catalog files are directly accessible from Menu File.
- Shows updated (never or not yet opened) files. (<u>Menu File</u>).
- Setup for Font, Tooltips, Sound.
- Minimize, Maximize, Resize, Restore original size of window.

• It is possible to set up a preferred sort. For example Sort by Library AND by Date AND by Submitter.

Error management to avoid GPFs.

Environment

• It is possible to create the program manager icons (and, eventually, a new group) for CisLib and its help file.

- It is possible to copy text from the description window to the clipboard.
- CisLib accepts file names on the command line. I.e. It is possible to associate CisLib to the files with <u>CAT</u> extension (see *Menu File in Windows File Manager Program*).

• CisLib is a File Manager *Drag&Drop* Client. Drag a filename from File Manager to CisLib and drop on it. CisLib reacts as if File Open has been selected.

CisLib saves its current position even when it is minimized.

• No file is created in either the Windows directory or in the System directory. Windows initialization files are not modified.

Uninstall instructions available.

Extended Features (TapCis and GoCIS users)

Extended Features for TapCis Users

Automatically retrieves <u>TapCis</u> directory (<u>Setup ...</u>).

• <u>Initial position</u> is calculated according to TapCis rules (that is TapCis and CisLib open files in the same position) and is enabled in the *Goto* option.

• File date and time is never updated, so TapCis can correctly calculate days in <u>Library Search</u> option.

If any exist, opens scripts files (<u>DOW file</u>) and <u>Section files</u> connected to opened catalog file.

<u>Script files</u>, Library and Messages sections are shown in proper windows (<u>Menu View</u>).

Activates the *Download* command button to create <u>Script files</u> for automatic downloads.

• Optionally creates <u>description files</u> for files that are downloaded. These files are created in the same directory used by TapCis for its downloads (as defined in <u>Download File Path</u>), so downloaded files and their descriptions lie in the same directory.

Optionally creates a History file for files to download.

Extended features for GoCIS Users

Automatically retrieves <u>GoCIS</u> directory (<u>Setup ...</u>).

• <u>Initial position</u> is calculated according to GoCIS rules (that is GoCIS and CisLib open files in the same position) and is enabled in the *Goto* option.

• If any exist, opens download command files (<u>LXR file</u>) and <u>Sections files</u> connected to opened catalog file.

Library and Messages sections are shown in proper windows (<u>Menu View</u>).

• Activates the *Download* command button to create <u>download</u> command files for automatic downloads.

• Activates the Update GoCIS Button menu item to Update the GoCIS.Btn file.

• Optionally creates <u>description files</u> for files that are downloaded. These files are created in the same directory used by GoCIS for its downloads, so downloaded files and their descriptions lie in the same directory.

• Optionally creates a History file for files to download.

Menu File

Open

Opens a Dialog Box that allows you to choose the file to open. The default file extension is *CAT* for Catalog (or *LBR* for GoCIS users). The default directory is the directory of the last opened file, or the CisLib <u>starting directory</u>.

For TapCis users, the default directory is the Storage Disk Path directory.

For GoCIS users, the default directory is the CONTROL subdirectory of the GoCIS starting directory.

FindFile

Opens a new window with a list of files. The list shows the files never opened or not opened since the last catalog update. Next the list shows the files opened but not updated.

Save

Saves modifications on current file. File date and time are not modified so TapCis can correctly calculate days in <u>Library Search</u> option. If no filename is marked for Discard, only the Script file is updated.

Save As...

This function allows you to save current catalog file with another name. It is useful if you want a backup copy before discard option, or to move your catalog file without using File Manager, or if you want try CisLib without risks!!!

Delete

This function allows you to delete the current catalog file. It is very useful if you decide to delete a catalog file and do not want to use File Manager.

Recent Files (1 - 4)

These are the most recently opened files.

Exit

Closes all files and ends the program.

FindFile Form

The list shows the files never opened or not opened since the last catalog update. Next the list shows the files opened but not updated.

The *Open* button is not enabled until a file is chosen (to choose a file, click on it). Double-clicking a file in the list, selects and opens the file.

The date of last opening is updated every time a file is opened. Calculating the file date, we do not consider file time, so a file updated on current date will be shown in upper section for the entire day.

Menu Edit

Сору

Copies the selected text from the textbox to the clipboard. If no text is selected, this option is not active.

Find

Searches for a specified text string entered in the Find Window.

Find Again

This option is only active when a Find Panel is not empty.

Go To

Goto simplifies moving within a catalog file. The initial position is calculated according to TapCis or GoCIS rules. (TapCis and GoCIS fix their <u>Initial Position</u> based on the starting point of the most recent *Library Search* performed).

Discard

This option opens a new window to allow the discarding of unwanted file titles (It is possible to save these discarded files in a separate file).

Discard Form

Use this form to perform multiple discards in your catalog files. Options are self-explanatory.

Doubles.

This option allows you to discard all duplicate file titles.

If the check box (Discard files across libraries) is selected, then all duplicate files will be marked for discard even if in different libraries.

Date.

Discards filenames up to (but not including) a given date.

If the check box (Save Discarded Filenames) is selected, then you will be prompted for the name of a file in which to save the discarded file titles.

Important: Library file will be updated (and discards will be effective) only after a *File Save* operation.

Menu View

Files to download

This option is active only when a <u>Navigator</u> has been selected. It shows a window with a list of files marked for download (in same sort order as the list in Main Window) and an estimated download time. Expected Bytes per Second are calculated as Connection Speed / 10 (i.e. 2400 = 240 Bps). Upon double-clicking an item in the list, this window is closed and the description of the selected file is shown in the Main Window.

Forum Sections

This option is active only when a <u>Navigator</u> has been selected. It shows a window with Messages and Library Sections. No action allowed. It is only for information.



Script File

This option is active only when <u>TapCis</u> was found. It shows a window with the <u>script file</u> associated with the current <u>catalog file</u>. No actions allowed.

Show Statistics

Shows simple usage statistics.

Menu Sort

No Sort

Files are shown in order of arrival.

... by Library

Files are sorted by Library and by name. If a SEC file was found, the library name is also shown.

... by Submitter

Files are sorted by Submitter AND by name.

... by Contributor

According to new forum software, it is possible to sort even by contributor. The sort on the contributors name is done by considering the name as it appears in the Catalog File; no effort is done to distinguish, i.e. First Name from Surname.

... by Date

Files are sorted by Last available date (that is first submission date or Last Update, if any).

... by Downloads number

Files are sorted by the number of times they have been downloaded from CompuServe (In the file description this is *Count*:).

Preferred

Sorts file according to sort keys selected in the *More Sort* ... window. To change your preferences, Select *More Sort* option in <u>Sort Menu</u>, select your favorite sorts keys, then click on *Set* command button in the *preferences* area.

More Sorts ...

Allows you to choose a sorting criteria using up to three keys. It is also possible to set and retrieve preferred sort keys.

Reverse Order

This option allows you to immediately reverse current sort order.

More Sorts Form

You are allowed to choose a sorting criteria using up to three keys. It is also possible to set and retrieve preferred sort keys.

Menu Options

Restore Original Size

Use this option if you have changed the size of the main window and want to restore it to its original size (8940 x 7200 twips).

Create ProgMan Icons

Use this option to add to Program Manager the icons of CisLib and its help file. You can either use an existing group or create a new one.

Update GoCIS Buttons

This option is active only when <u>GoCIS</u> has been selected. It allows you to add CisLib in GoCIS.Btn file. Occasionally, you can also modify the current buttons order.

Setup

Opens Setup Form

Setup Form

This form controls all setup functions for CisLib. Options are self-explanatory.

Navigator.

Are you using TapCis, GoCIS or none of two? Select the navigator that you are currently using, and click on the *Find* button: The system will automatically search across all the disks.

Options.

Use these options for the fine tuning of CisLib.

In the first section (Files) you can choose to - Force the creation of <u>description files</u> for every file marked for download. These files are created in the same directory used by Navigators for their downloads;

- Force the creation and the updating of the History file (Mastering CisLib).

In the second section (General) you can choose:

- If activate beep on messages;

- If activate ToolTips on Command Button Bar

Fonts.

Choose fonts for the file description. *Change* Button will open a Dialog Box. Default Button gives default values (Ms Sans Serif / 9.75/ Bold / Not Italic)

After using (and hopefully <u>registering</u>) this program, you will certainly have some ideas on how to improve upon it. We are very interested in hearing them! Each version of CisLib has been shaped by its users - if there is something you want, we would like to know!

Registration

CisLib 1.02 is not public domain software, nor is it free software. You are allowed to use CisLib for a trial period. After this trial period, if you find CisLib easy and convenient to use, you are required to register.

Registration entitles you to use CisLib. We will provide you with the access code necessary to personalize your copy of the program. If you desire, we will mail you a registration confirmation notice to prove to your corporate auditors that the software has been legally registered.

CisLib can currently be registered in two ways:

- 1. Via the CompuServe Software Registration Forum (**GO SWREG #5733** fee is \$22.50). This is the easiest (and most convenient) registration method. When we receive notification of your registration, we will send you your access code via e-mail.
- 2. Print this page, fill in the order form and send with \$22.50 US currency (Cash, check or money orders only) to the specified address.

TapCisTapCis® is a CompuServe Navigator.It is very easy to install and to use.It works only in a DOS environment.

DOW files

Script files that have the same name as <u>Catalog files</u> (i.e. MSBASIC.CAT and MSBASIC.DOW). These files have mainly download instructions. There is some other information, i.e. *Library Search* information.

Visual Basic VBX

External control for special operations. As DLL's, many files can share VBX's. A VBX must reside in the same directory as the program that uses it or it must be in the <u>System Directory</u>.

VBRUN300.DLL

The runtime-module for Visual Basic programs. Usually it is in the <u>System Directory</u>. The Visual Basic runtime module is not included in the CisLib package due to its size. It can be downloaded from a variety of locations: We have uploaded VBR300.ZIP (a compressed copy of VBRUN300.DLL) in Section 17 of CompuServe <u>ITALFOR</u>.

Once you have downloaded Vbrun300.Dll, copy it to your System Directory or to the same directory as CisLib.

Catalog files

Catalog files have the CompuServe standard format for file lists. All automated forum processors can read this format. Catalog files have a CAT extension. CisLib reads and manages Catalog files.

Description file

A file with the same name of downloaded files and with DES as extension. It contains file description in text format.

Only CisLib creates description files (DES extension is not a standard).

Library Search Option of TapCis program that allows the capture of the file titles matching certain criteria (i.e. new files, only files with certain keywords, etc.).

Section files

In the Section Files are enumerated all the messages and library sections of a given CompuServe forum. If a Section file is present, CisLib can show the name of a library (not only the number).

Initial Position

When the last *Library Search* is executed, the Navigator marks <u>Catalog files</u> to retrieve the position of first new item.

CISLIB.INI

CisLib Initialization file. Keep this file in the same directory as CisLib (recommended) or copy to your <u>Windows directory</u>.

ASP

ASP. The Association of Shareware Professionals is a not-for-profit corporation dedicated to furthering Shareware (try before buy) as a unique software marketing alternative to commercial distribution. ASP Members agree to follow strict rules on shareware requirements and guarantee their registered users with the acceptance of <u>Ombudsman</u> decisions.

Windows Directory It is the directory (usually C:\Windows or C:\Win) in which the Windows program is installed. Generally initialization files (*.INI) are in the Windows directory.

System Directory It is the System subdirectory of Windows Directory (usually C:\Windows\System or C:\Win\System). In this directory are all system files such as VBXs or DLLs.

CIS:ITALFOR

It is the home forum for CisLib. In File Section 17 (Computer) you will always find the latest version of CisLib, more documentation, Newsletters, etc.

DLL (Dynamic Link Library) An external module containing functions required by the main program and usable, at the same time, from all active Windows programs. Usually DLLs are in the <u>System directory</u>. Before deleting a DLL in your System Directory, be sure that no program uses it.

CisLib Starting Directory The directory in which CisLib.Exe resides. (i.e. C:\Wintools).

Storage Disk Path It is the directory (i.e. C:\Tapcis\Down) in which are stored all files created by Tapcis (i.e. <Forum>. MSG - captured messages, or <Forum>.CAT - Catalog of forum files).

Home BBS

A Bulletin Board System dedicated to distribution and support of a software program. The word *home* refers to the program.

Initialization file

A file that contains all the parameters needed by a program. Example: A list of most recent files, the main window position, all setup options, and so on.

Initialization files have an INI extension and are found in the <u>Windows directory</u> or in the starting directory of the program.

CisLib.Ini is the initialization file of CisLib 1.02

Win.Ini and System.Ini are the main initialization files of Windows.

Download File Path

It is the directory (i.e. C:\Tapcis\Files) in which are stored all files downloaded by Tapcis.

GoCIS

Navigator

Navigator or Forum processor or Off-Line Reader (OLR) is a computer program that automates the actions required to obtain required information from CompuServe. There are many navigators available. Some names are:

- CIM and WinCim
- TapCis OzCIS
- GoCIS
- AutoSIG

GoCIS.Btn

From GoCIS HelpFile: The GoCIS Button Bar permits you to handle certain GoCIS functions, macros, and call outside applications via one-click buttons or icons.

LXR Files

GoCIS Download Command Files. These files have command strings to generate, when connected, download scripts.

List of file titles

A vertical scroll bar and a horizontal scroll bar appear the currently selected file is marked for download and/or marked for discard.

Description of Currently selected file On the top of this area there is the name and the length of file. In the text box there is the *long* description.

At the bottom of this area the words *Download* and *Discard* appear when currently selected file is marked for download and/or marked for discard.

Button Commands

Bottom Bar

Description of expected action String to find Actual position / total files Current time

Option List Click to select your first, second, third key. You may select whatever keys you desire, even the same key three times, if you wish.

Current Preferred Selection

These are the three keys currently used for *preferred* sorts.

Load Button

Use this command button to load the preferred selection in the Option List.

Save Button

Use this command button to save the selection in the Option List as your preferred sort. Saving the preferred sort is not affected by a subsequent *Cancel* button.

Ok Button

Catalog file is sorted according to the current selection in the Option List.

Cancel Button

Current sort is not modified. This command button does not cancel modifications to the parameters for Preferred Sort.
