3.0 Reason for Patch

This patch must be loaded onto a GTS 2.2.0 network in order to prepare the network for a TMS 4000 Controller. This patch supersedes patch 24, as a problem was discovered where CDAs in the local node went to boot when the TMS 4000 Controller was connected to the node running GTS 2.2.0.

4.0 Loading Instructions

Before loading this patch, obtain the Username and Password of the GTS 2.2.0 Controller. You will need this information during the upgrade procedure.

To load the Patch #30 software, follow these instructions.

1. With the GTS 2.2.0 Controller still connected to the network, go to the “TMS Main Menu” screen and select the “Controller Maintenance” option.
2. Insert the first Patch 30 diskette into the disk drive.
3. Install the patch software by placing the cursor on the “Load a Software Release” pokepoint on the “Controller Maintenance” screen and pressing <Enter>.
4. Insert the second Patch #30 diskette into the disk drive.
5. Place the cursor on the “Load a Software Release” pokepoint and press <Enter>.
6. Remove the diskette from the disk drive.
7. Reboot the GTS 2.2.0 Controller by placing the cursor on the “Normal Controller Shutdown” pokepoint and pressing <Enter>.
8. When the Controller reboots, log onto the online network and enter the “Download” screen.
9. Go to “Modify Software Revision List” from the “Download” screen and select ONLY the following:
 - a) ESCM: select version “2.2.0D” to be stored
10. Exit the screen saving the new stored list.

Nodes will begin to load the ESCM 220D file.

NOTE: To minimize network disruption, disable IAR before activating the stored code.

11. After all nodes have the file, as viewed in the “Software Integrity” screen, select “Activate Stored Software Files” from the “Download” screen. It is IMPORTANT that the above file be downloaded and activated before proceeding to the next steps.
12. Go to “Modify Software Revision List” from the “Download” screen and select the following:
 - a) ACM: select version “4.0.0_”
 - b) CCM: select version “4.0.0_”
 - c) CDA-E1: select version “4.0.0_”
 - d) CDA-T1: select version “4.0.0_”
 - e) DPV-CMN: select version “4.0.0-”
 - f) DPV-FAX1: select version “4.0.0-”

- g) DPV-CELP: select version “4.0.0-”
- h) EACC: select version “4.0.0_”
- i) ECIC: select version “4.0.0_”
- j) ESCM: select version “4.0.0_”
- k) ESCS: select version “4.0.0_”

GDC recommends that you de-select any software files that do not need to be downloaded (such as files for which there are no cards configured in the network); the de-selected files will be available in the TMS4000 controller if needed in the future. Not having to download unnecessary files improves download performance.

13. Exit the screen saving the new “Stored” list.
14. After all nodes have the files stored, as viewed in the “Software Integrity” screen, proceed to the “Upgrading (Converting) from GTS V2.2.0 to TMS 4000” section in Chapter 1 of the latest version of the *TMS 4000 Controller Operation Manual* (036R604-V200-02) for further instructions.
