To install the Info+ resource into your system file you will have to use a resource editor. I am currently writing an installer that will automate this procedure. Use your resource editor to install the resource 'Info+ INIT resource' into your system 'INIT' file.

Info+ is now installed and just reboot for it to take affect.

During booting, the Info+ 'INIT' resource will run. It will try and install Info+ into the system. If any errors of any kind occur during this phase, Info+ will not be installed. This can easily be detected when Info+ never shows up in the menu bar. Careful consideration has been taken such as not to interfere with the normal flow of things as if Info+ was never installed to begin with. In fact, Info+ is really invisible to any application running.

Using Info+		

Info+ is very easy to use. If you wish to just see what time it is or how much disk space you currently have, just pull down the Info+ menu. To modify an option, pull down the Info+ menu and select one of the menu items. However, prior to releasing the mouse button, hold down the corresponding key combination as described below. The modification you've just made can be seen the next time you pull down the Info+ menu.

The following pages describe the features of Info+ and how to effectively use them.

The Info+ menu is installed into the current menu bar each time you enter an application. If you wish to temporarily remove the Info+ menu, hold down the command, option and shift keys together and then click the mouse anywhere in the menu bar. If the Info+ menu already exists, it will be removed. If the Info+ menu does not exist, it will be added back in. This is useful when your menu bar is full and you need one more spot for some other temporary menu (ie. DA) and Info+ is currently using that last spot. Just remove the Info+ menu for the time being and then add it back in when you want to. Simple! If the Info+ menu is removed and you enter another application, it won't appear unless you add it back in.

Launching an Application...

Command This will display a dialog box with

the application(s) that can be launched. Just

select the application of your choice and

Warning: This option must be

executed only when all files have been

closed! Some applications use temporary files which

will not be erased when that application is

terminated. This poses no threat other

than leaving an 'dirty' icon on your desktop.

Command-Option Flushes each volume, Ejects all

disks and restarts the system. This option

must be executed twice for the restart to occur. Toggle to the

next disk using the command key to disable

the restart. Do NOT execute when any files are still

open. Unknown results will occur.

Black Out...

Command This will turn your screen black.

The arrow cursor will just blink indicating your

Mac is still on. Just press the mouse or a key to restore

the screen to its' original contents.
Black Outs only occur on 'your'

Command-Option Toggles menu disable. If this

option is selected, the menus act normally

but when if one is chosen there will be no response. The

Info+ menu also displays 'Menus locked

Out!'. Use this one for kids.

Open DA...

Command

This option must be used only by experienced Mac users. This option will execute Desk Accessories which are not in the system file (ie. suitcase style). Just select the 'Open DA...' option and you will be presented with a list of DA's to open if some 'suitcase' DA's reside on a mounted disk. Info+ will do its' 'best' to bring the DA into existance. This means that some DA's won't run because of what I would consider non-Inside Mac specifications. I have done my best to trap all errors that could occur. The best thing to do is to put together a bunch of DA's and try them one by one to see how they react. Comments on problems are greatly appreciated! You will notice that if a normal DA is active (system file) and you open a DA thru Info+,. those DA's will disappear automatically. This came about because Info+ does not know anything about other installed DA's. If Info+ were to run a DA with the same reference number as one already running, funny things start to happen. Therefore, I just remove them myself. If you run a DA from Info+, do NOT run any other DA's by any other means, first close the active DA then do as you would. I do disable the apple menu whenever possible to help prevent you from doing it. Unpredictable things WILL happen if a system file DA is opened while a Info+ DA is active. I have experienced some DA's that simply don't work with Info+ but for the most part, I have had very little problems with using it.

Command-Option

This will bring the DA to the front. This is most useful when the DA was placed behind another window and you wish to use it again.

Notes:

- 1. Info+ works with 128K, 512K, Mac+ and MacXL.
- 2. The Task Timer can be used as a simple timer. When starting a specific task which requires timing, reset it. When finished with the task, look at Task Timer again. You can easily determine when you started that task.
- 3. Using a Sort menu routine with Info+ will bring about unpredictable results. In other words, don't use one.
- 4. All options are saved into Parameter Ram where applicable.
- 5. The current disk volume shown can also have the following attributes. The attributes appear to the left of the volume names. The '°' character represents a hardware write protected disk. The '•' character represents a software write protected disk. The '\(\frac{1}{2}\)' character represents both a software and hardware write protected disk. No character will appear when the disk is not write protected.
- 6. Never run a DA thru Info+ that opens DA's. This causes very weird things to happen and very unpredictable results.
- 7. Don't use the DA in Switcher unless you close the DA before moving to another application. Trust me on this one!
- 8. If I never hear from anyone who has obtained Info+ and has had problems, I will never know about the problem(s). If you have trouble or even suggestions for future releases please send comments to:
- 9. If you have the blink rate set for menus, beware that you must hold down the keys until the last blink has occured. Otherwise no modifications will take place (this is to make sure that you really wanted to make the modification).
- 10. The cache option can be modified by all Macintosh's but only the Mac's with HFS ROM's can recognize and use these settings. The settings are used internally by the operating system. It also recognizes a 512K or 1024K Mac. This becomes important when setting the maximum amount of 'cache-memory' available in the system. 512K Mac's are limited to 384K and 1Mb's to 896K.
