Stephen Rea (Viktor Burakov) was nominated for a Best Actor Academy Award for the acclaimed 1992 film "The Crying Game," directed by Neil Jordan. His recent feature films include "Ready to Wear," directed by Robert Altman, and "Interview with the Vampire," also directed by Jordan. His other movies include "Angie," "Bad Behavior," "Life Is Sweet," "The Doctor and the Devils" and the Jordan films "The Company of Wolves" and "Danny Boy." Rea received a Tony nomination in the 1993 season for his performance on Broadway in "Someone Who'll Watch Over Me." He has starred in numerous theatrical productions at the National and Royal Court Theatre in London.

Donald Sutherland (Colonel Fetisov), has starred in more than 80 films in 30 years. Among Sutherland's numerous feature-film credits are "Disclosure," "Six Degrees of Separation," "JFK," "Backdraft," "Ordinary People," "The Dirty Dozen," "Klute," "Don't Look Now," "1900," "M*A*S*H," "The Day of the Locust" and "Animal House."
