How To Install A TerraGlyph Product

Place the CD into the CD-ROM drive

Windows 95 will automatically detect the disk and display a startup screen.

If the startup screen does not appear automatically, you need an updated software driver or need to enable Autorum in the Control Panel>System>CDROM>Settings screen.

Alternatively, you can refer to Problems with Installation

The first time you insert the CD, the startup screen will give you the following choices:

- Install Click on this button to install the game on your computer. After a successful installation, the game will automatically start. If the installation was not successful, refer to Problems with Installation.
- Quit Click on this button to leave the startup screen.
- Play Click on this button to play the game after the game has been installed.
- Help Click this button to access a help file specific to the game.
- About Click here to get information about the game, such as the version number.

Problems With Installation

If you inserted the CD into your CD-ROM drive and the startup screen did not automatically appear, you may need updated software <u>drivers</u> or may need to <u>enable Autorun</u>.

Another possible reason is a hardware malfunction. Microsoft has provided a troubleshooting guide to help determine the nature of the problem. Refer to the Microsoft Windows 95 <u>Assistant Help File</u> (If your CD is not the D: drive, this hyperlink will not work, but you can look up and click on the ASSIST.HLP file on your CD)

The installation program will check your system to make sure that you have the minimum RAM, sound and video configurations needed to play the product. If you do not, a message will appear during installation to advise you of your options.

If the game still does not run, contact TerraGlyph Customer Support.

Problems When The Product Starts

If you experience a problem starting the product after what appeared to be a successful installation, try the following suggestions:

First try to install the program again to make sure you didn't miss any warning or error messages the first time.

If the installation program seems to work, but the game still does not run, test your main system components. Go to the control panel and check the following icons:

- System Click on the Device Manager tab and check to see that you have at least 8 MB of RAM.
- **Sounds** Click on a sound and then on the "Preview" button to see if your sound system is functioning properly.
- Display Click on the Appearance tab to ensure that your system is set to 640x480 resolution and 256 colors. (If you don't have a choice of 256 colors, you may need an updated video driver from your manufacturer. See <u>Video Adapter List</u>

If the game still does not work, click on the symptom you are experiencing for more help.

General Tips

Here are some hints on how to upgrade your PC for the best performance

- New computer programs require more and more <u>random access memory (RAM)</u>. Go to your local computer store and see what is in their most popular models. If it has 16MB and you have 8MB, talk to them about an upgrade. Adding memory will generally have a big impact on performance across a wide spectrum of software.
- CD-ROM drives are another area where you can dramatically improve performance with one small change. Double-speed, Quad-speed, 6X and 8X drives are all available. Check to see what make and model your CD-ROM drive is, and write down all related information, such as where it is plugged in. You may be able to find a faster CD-ROM drive that uses the same connectors as your current drive.
- Video adapters can make or break a system. As programs use higher resolution and try to update larger
 regions of the screen, you will tax the capabilities of your video board. Call the manufacturer of your video
 adapter and ask them how fast yours is in relation to the latest models. You can also check a few magazine
 benchmark tests for a more objective view. PCI computers and video adapters are currently the best. As with
 any purchase, compare performance between PCI video adapters, since some run significantly faster than
 others.
- Lastly, there is the central processing unit, or CPU, the heart of it all. Several times a year, new processors are
 introduced that can upgrade existing machines to improve performance. Call your computer manufacturer or
 Intel to see what you can do. You may be able to triple your computer's performance for a couple hundred
 dollars.

If you need to obtain drivers electronically, Microsoft offers an Windows Driver Library for sound, display, printer, network, and others. The library is updated as more drivers become available to Windows 95. If you do not have access to a modem you may obtain an individual driver by calling (206) 637-7098.

To download a file from the Windows Driver Library

- 1. Locate the device in WDL.TXT file. You need to download this file from your download service.
- **2.** Create a sub-directory if you are downloading to a hard disk. If you are down loading to a floppy disk it must be a formatted blank disk. **IMPORTANT:** Do not download files directly into your Windows directory. Doing so could overwrite files essential to the proper operating system.
- **3.** Follow the downloading procedures used by your downloading service. The file you download is the executable (.EXE) file that you have already idenified in step 1. This file contains all the files you need to support your device. Download the .EXE to your floppy disk or the new subdirectory you created to your hard disk.
- **4.** Change to the floppy disk drive (or the sub-directory on your hard disk) that contains the .EXE file. At the MS-DOS prompt, type the filename and then press *enter*. When the .EXE file are finished running, all the files you need to support your device, are set up. You have all the files including the .TXT file that contains the instructions for installing the device drivers (or other software) and the licensing agreement.

Skipping digital audio or fast animations

If you have a Creative Labs Sound Blaster 16 or AWE 32, you can use the <u>drivers</u> on the Windows 95 installation or upgrade CD.

- 1) Remove the SB16/AWE32 drivers from Device Manager:
- Go to the Control Panel and double-click the System icon.
- Click the Device Manager tab.
- Make sure 'View devices by type' is selected.
- Scroll down and double-click the Sound, video, and games controllers icon.
- Click each Creative driver icon and click the Remove button to delete each one.
- Click Ok
- DO NOT restart the computer as prompted.
- 2) Delete the driver files from your hard drive:

(This will prevent Windows 95 from reverting to the bad drivers.)

- Click the Start button, select Programs, and click MS-DOS Prompt
- From the DOS prompt, type CD SYSTEM
- Use the following commands to delete the driver files:

Error Message: Please insert CD-ROM...

If you have a problem with a recurring error message saying, "Please insert CD-ROM...", create a <u>shortcut</u> by following these instructions:

- Put the TerraGlyph CD-ROM in the drive you will be using to play the game.
- Right click anywhere on the empty desktop.
- A menu should appear. Select New, then Shortcut.
- A window will appear titled Create Shortcut. Type the following Command Line:

Start up screen keeps appearing during gameplay

This issue is caused by a combination of a fast (6x or 8x) CD-ROM and a low <u>oversampling</u> <u>rate</u>. The CD-ROM oversamples when it encounters read errors. If Autorun is enabled in Windows 95, whenever the CD-ROM reaches the oversampling limit and resyncs, the Autorun feature starts the game from the beginning.

First, check the underside of the CD-ROM (the side without printing) for any dust, dirt, smudges, or scratches. If you find any dust, dirt or smudges, wipe the CD from the center to the outer edge to clean the affected area. If the CD seems OK, you can try disable Autorun on your computer by performing the following steps:

- Click the Start button
- Select Settings>Control Panel
- Double click the System icon
- Select the Device Manager tab
- Double click the CDROM icon
- Select the Settings tab
- Under Options, there is a setting for Auto insert notification. If it does not have a check in the box beside it, it is already disabled. If the box has a check, click the box to disable Autorun. Then reboot the computer.

Once this change is complete, when the CD-ROM is inserted, the CD should be detected by the computer, and our product screen should appear with the options to Play, Uninstall, Quit, Help, and About available through buttons on the screen.

You may want to have the CD-ROM drive on your computer checked if you encounter this error. The drive may need calibration.

Screen saver appears during gameplay

If you have a screen saver, it is a good idea to disable it when running our product. If the screen saver is enabled and you do not move or use the mouse for an extended period of time, the screen saver may start running. This will cause problems such as the <u>color pallette</u> changing or the game ending abnormally. Also, you will not be able to save the game at that point.

A blank screen stays on display after installation

Error says "Not enough memory" but I have 8 megabytes of RAM

Drivers

A driver is a software program that allows your operating system (Windows 95) to communicate with the different parts of your computer hardware (eg CD-ROM drive). Before Microsoft released Windows 95, hardware manufacturers were requested to submit 32-bit upgrades to their software drivers in order to take advantage of the new features and enhanced performance of Windows 95. The manufacturer of the hardwarein question on your computer may not have submitted its 32-bit upgraded driver to Microsoft in time. You need to contact the manufacturer and request their latest 32-bit software driver that will allow you to use their hardware most efficiently with Windows 95. The drivers are generally available at no cost from the manufacturer. Refer to the CD-ROM Manufacturers List for phone numbers and information on CD-ROM drivers.

Shortcut

A shortcut can be created for nearly any file, program, folder, or disk drive on the computer. Opening a shortcut opens the object the shortcut "points" to. A shortcut icon differs from an actual program icon, and can be identified by the arrow in the lower left hand corner.

Oversampling rate

The number of times a CD-ROM drive retries a bad read before resynchronizing the CD and starting from the beginning.

Command Line

A command line contains information on where files required to run a program are located on a CD-ROM, hard drive, or floppy disk.

Color pallette

The set of colors that the program uses.	If the pallette changes, the colors will look strange
The sec of colors that the program ases	in the panette changes, the colors will rook strange

Smartdrive

Smartdrive is a file that helps your machine read and write to the hard drive, floppy drive, or CD-ROM more efficiently. This file is not needed in Windows 95 because Windows 95 handles Smartdrive features dynamically.

enable Autorun

If you have the latest drivers, you may need to turn on Autorun. Here are the steps for enabling Autorun:

- Click the Start button
- Select Settings>Control Panel
- Double click the System icon
- Select the Device Manager tab
- Double click the CDROM icon
- One or more CD-ROM icons should appear in a tree below the icon you just clicked.
 - Select the icon for the drive on which you want to enable autorun.
- Select the Settings tab
- Under Options, there is a setting for Auto insert notification. If it has a check in the box beside it, it is already enabled. If it does not have a check, click the box next to Auto insert notification.

Random Access Memory (RAM)

This is the memory where your computer loads programs to run. These are generally some ofthe fastest memory chips on a computer. Many companies list a minimum amount of RAM required to run their programs. This amount is given in terms of megabytes, or millions of bytes. To run a TerraGlyph product, your computer must have at least 8 megabytes of RAM.
