

The Wandrei family contributed two pulp authors to the world, brothers Donald and Howard. Of the two, while Donald may be better known today, it was Howard who contributed to the spicy pulps. While much of Howard Wandrei's fiction appeared under the name H.W. Guernsey, his spicy output appeared under the penname Robert A. Garron, a name whose initials perhaps shed some light on Wandrei's true feelings about the spicy pulps. Three Garron stories were reprinted in SPICY DETECTIVE ENCORES NO. 3, published by Winds of the World Press in 1987: "All Right, Murder" (March 1941), "Clues All Over" (February 1938, pictured here) and "The Thin Dame" (May 1937).
