Musik.ger

The Fido echo MUSIK.GER, known (and feared) far beyond its borders, has become a part of my life since end of '93. Since mid '94 I am the MotherFAQer, excerpts:

"Hi, I'm interested in music and I think that I have found just the right place." (Udo Dieckmann, February 9th, 1995)

"I don't believe anyone takes this echo serious. I'm just reading it because I don't receive vomits. Ger" (Frank Hiss)

If you are interested in musics in the Fido net area, you will sooner or later come across a conference with the promising name "Musik.ger.". If you now enthusiastically order that conference, hoping to meet fellow musicians with whom you can discuss the pros and cons of twelve tone music or ask someone for the composer of the title song from "Wayne's World 2", you will soon stand corrected.

Musik.ger is one of the most active public conferences (also called echos) of the Fidonet. Every day about 200 E-mails are flooding into this area. The Frequently Asked Questions, or FAQ for short (a sort of guideline for the conference), has the impressive size of 300 KBytes. Only a fraction of this information pile has to do with discussing music of all kinds. In the Fidonet politeness, tolerance with regard to the opinion of others and staying close to the topics of an echo are pretty important. The rules for Musik.ger say that insults more than the "usual lot" are a no-no. It continues with the words:

"Tolerance is the next echo - this is Musik.ger.". This conference is definitely different - a kind of antithesis with regard to the rest of the Fidonet. And it makes its impression on everyone: either you love it - or you hate it.

Once you have made your way through the FAQ, you don't understand a single word. The title song from "Wayne's World 2" is "I love Rock'n'Roll" and is performed by Nirvana. No, it's not from the

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Beatles. Or is it Mariah Carey? There is this programmer from the North ;-)))) whose mails are only two or three lines long. The majority of the women being active in Musik.ger have (for reasons unknown) a first name of "Andrea". The person in charge of the questions&answers list calls himself "MotherFAQer". And most of the active writers meet several times a year for a "real" conference which sometimes even has to do with music.

Many newcomers enter the conference, look around horrified, protest against the rude behaviour and leave after two weeks. Others get accustomed to the rough tone and become virtual parts of Musik.ger.

It has to be noticed that Musik.ger is not less polite than other echos in Fidonet. But whereas the discussions in other conferences are - well, just the way you would conferences to take place, Musik.ger is rather a family meeting whose members like bashing a little at each other and devoting a lot of their time to making newbies April's fools.

And somehow Musik.ger even has something to do with music, of course. However, it's the readers' task to find that out himself. The Musik.ger FAQ is available for request as "MGFAQ" at (e.g.) 2:2494/325 and 2:245/5519. The conference should be available at every Fidonet node. A thick skin is advised.
