However, soon after that the Schneider CPCs became very popular and so I sold the C64 again and (using financial support from my parents) purchased a CPC 6128 at Christmas 1985.

After I had seen the graphics and sound capabilities of the Amiga on a friends' machine, I switched over to an Amiga 500 in 1988 (this timing paying it entirely myself) which I programmed quite a long time in AmigaBasic. This was later followed by Pascal (which I had learnt at school) and C, using freely distributable compilers from Fish disks. Later then I bought an Amiga 1200 (which my brother and mother are using nowadays) and a used Amiga 3000 which I work with today and won't give away so soon.
