Setting Up Microsoft® Musical Instruments

To set up Microsoft Musical Instruments:

1. If you haven't already turned on your computer and started Windows™, do so now.
2. Place the Musical Instruments disc in the CD caddy (if required) and insert it into the CD-ROM drive.
3. Open the Program Manager window (if necessary), click File to display the File menu, and then click Run.
4. In the Command Line box, type the letter of your CD drive, a colon, a backslash, and the word SETUP (for example, type **d:\setup**).
5. Click OK.
6. Follow the instructions that appear on the screen.

Starting Musical Instruments

To start Musical Instruments from within Windows:

1. Place the Musical Instruments disc in the CD caddy (if required) and insert it into the CD-ROM drive.
2. From the Program Manager window, double-click the Musical Instruments icon. The icon is in the Microsoft Multimedia group window or in the group window you specified during Setup.

Navigating Through Musical Instruments

To use Microsoft Musical Instruments, you click pictures, icons, buttons and red text. Sometimes a click opens a pop-up window. To close a pop-up window, double-click the icon in the upper-left corner, click outside the pop-up window, or press CTRL+F4.

Getting Help

For complete instructions about using Microsoft Musical Instruments, click the Help button, then choose Contents or How to Use Help from the menu. After reading a Help topic, click the Contents button to return to the main Help screen. To close the Help window, do one of the following:

- Microsoft Mouse or compatible pointing device.
- Headphones or speakers.

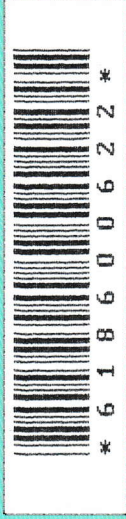
