The neat trick the guys at A&G pulled off is the set of parser API's, which are also included in the package. They'll convert the recognized text into useful data types which are transparent to your application.

Ever get a desire to talk to your computer? NOW you can! Ever wish your computer could really understand you? Now it does, sorta, kinda, well almost! Fortune 500 multinationals like DuPont, Rockwell, Hewlett Packard, CIBA Corning, Andersen Consulting and others are using Custom Voice to develop real applications.

Would I Lie to You?

Custom Voice has made life a lot easier for Chad Burkey, a developer at Andersen Consulting. It has enabled Chad to integrate speech recognition using VB. Chad says that an arduous multi-step process has been reduced down to a few simple calls. He also states that "it truly makes natural language processing possible". - 4. Add your particular application level coding and use the parser API's to parse recognized text into basic variables as you wish......and oops You shoulda had a V-8 (only kidding).

The Paperless Office...

Remember that myth? Computers were supposed to eliminate paper. Hah! They simply make it possible to generate reams and reams of nicely formatted printed output so that we can get just *exactly* the right look.

The Paper Trail

Why is it then that we print so much? Because paper is still a much better medium for many purposes than a computer screen. Need to transmit information to a colleague? Paper is easier by far than diskettes. Need to edit a document? It's much easier to scribble notes on a printout. You don't have to have a battery or an AC outlet to read papyrus.

Print that Source

Programmers need to print out source code just like everyone else. How else will you ever understand that 1000 line routine the last guy wrote, or you wrote and forgot? Hit Page Down until you find it??? What about tracking down a logic bug? And providing your client with hard copy source code documentation? (You don't always do this?!? You should! It will increase their perception of your value!) Face it, sooner or later, you're going to have to print out your source code.

It's an Ugly Job...

Yes, when you print your source code from within Visual Basic, the output is just plain *ugly*. With all its *visual* orientation, VB doesn't provide any print formatting control at all. Certainly not useful for understanding and debugging, and it is definitely not the type of thing you want to present to a client at the end of a project! What's more, Visual Basic won't print individual routines or forms; it will only print .FRM and .BAS files in their entirety. Well. so much for the Rain Forests! :-(

Give VB a Makeover

Aardvark Software felt the same way about Visual Basic's printed output as I do, and that's why they created Pretty Printer, a professional tool for serious programmers. Pretty Printer is a stand-alone program that was actually written in Visual Basic; you don't even have to have Visual Basic loaded to print! The Aardvark programmers must have been mainframe developers in their former lives, and I think that they wrote Pretty Printer just to make their old mainframe buddies jealous!

Oooh! Aaah!

Pretty Printer can really wow your clients with its syntax highlighting (in color if you have a color printer), and its different fonts for different syntax components such as identifiers, keywords, literals, and comments. When did I print this module? Oh, there's the date and time right on Pretty Printer's output!

Let's Connect

Pretty Printer also uses statement connectors to help you see the logic within your routines. When you can trace the ENDIF that goes with the IF, errors really pop off the page at you!

Trying to be Green?

So you don't like to generate printouts that often anyway? Pretty Printer is much more than a print utility; it is an excellent source code browser as well. Load your source file into

Pretty Printer and you get to see your source exactly the way it would otherwise be printed.

My Next Project

I found Pretty Printer while looking for add-ons to include in VBxtras. I really wish I had found it from day one. Now I can turn over the source documentation for my next VB project to my client looking much prettier than ever before. Don't you think you should do the same? :-)

If you're like me, you're always looking for a weapon to add to your personal arsenal that can take your application to a higher level of professionalism without a lot of work. Have I got a bombshell for you!

Gantt/VBX allows you to add Gantt style charts to any application with just a drop of a control.

Not just for Breakfast Anymore

With Gantt/VBX you don't have to think of a Gantt chart for just project management software. Think of using it to graphically display and manage anything that has starting and ending times. Use it to create to-do lists, appointment scheduling, conference room scheduling, meeting time tables, work group scheduling, vacation scheduling... and on and on.

Visually Interactive

Let's say you want to change a start date for a particular task. Just grab your mouse and point at the starting bar end and click and drag it to the new starting time. Same goes for changing the duration and the progress. Resize list columns and header size.

King of the Hill?

So what network software do you think is the most widely used for IBM-PC compatible computers today? IBM-PC Lan Program? NOT! How about MS-Lan Manger? Sorry. Banyan? Yeah, right. Lantastic? Uh-uh. Windows NT? It may be feature rich, but it ain't got a big installed base.

Come on, you know which one is used more than any other... Novell NetWare. We're not talking which one is the best; I'll stay out of that one. We're talking the one with the most users. If I had to venture a guess, I would say that around 70% of PC networks currently in use are Novell. And it doesn't look like that is about to change anytime soon.

They Want it All!

It's not like it used to be. These days users expect compatibility. And they expect support. They won't stand for printers that are not supported. They don't want to have to switch to another program to change printers. They don't want to have to type in a user ID for every application they run.

Users want their network programs to recognize who they are and remember their individual and station configurations. They don't want to have to deal with mapping drives and setting paths. They want their programs to be able to communicate with other users on the network. Quite frankly, today's users want it all. And more and more often, they are getting it.

Bury your Head in the Sand?

So, are you going to stick your head in the sand and ignore the rising tide of user wants and needs? Or are you going to write your programs to support the environment that your users operate in? If you choose the latter (for your sake you'd better!), then there is no better way with Visual Basic to support Novell than with the NetWare Client SDK from Apiary!

The NetWare Client SDK is a VBX custom control and a collection of .BAS files declaring all structures, constants, and functions needed to support the Novell API. It has a Windows help file documenting and cross-referencing every function, and giving numerous examples of Visual Basic projects.

Overwhelming? Not at All!

Anyone familiar with Novell programming knows that the API has over 800 functions which can be inundating at best. But, Apiary has somehow managed to make the API conceptually manageable. When you install the NetWare Client SDK, it creates a program manager group with an icon for 20 categories of NetWare services. Click on any icon and you load Visual Basic and an example project that demonstrates the use of the selected group of NetWare API functions.

Love that Clipboard

Want to add support for, say, capturing local print ports to NetWare print queues? Just click on Print Capture, run the example program to get a feel for it, study the code for the program, then cut and paste the code you need into your application. That's all there is too it! No lengthy time spent pouring over manuals or scrolling through a Windows Help file (although the included help file is excellent).

What Else?

NetWare Client SDK provides support for all your NetWare servers 2.x, 3.x, and 4.x. It works with NETX and the VLM requester. The Help file even provides syntax for C and C++ programmers making this the only on-line NetWare reference for C and C++ programmers.

Picking up Where the VB Debugger Leaves Off

Debugging? Sigh. We all have to do it, and the tools are never quite good enough for us to do the things we want to do. We all know that the Visual Basic debugger doesn't give us many of the features we need during debugging.

What's worse, it even changes the way our programs behave at times. Sadly, there isn't a better alternative. Or is there? PinPoint from Avanti Software is *exactly* that tool!

So, What's Happen'n?

One of the toughest parts of learning VB is understanding the event-driven model. It's different from a sequential model where things happen one after another. It's different from the underlying Windows model, which is based on messages. Instead, Visual Basic deals with events.

Sure you can figure out the order of events (does LostFocus occur on one control before GotFocus on the next?) if you're patient and willing to single step through your application and take careful notes. Not fun. So why do all that work?

Do you Know Where you're Go[sub]ing To...

With PinPoint's Visual Tracer $_{\text{TM}}$ you can determine the event order as it happens, and with minimal impact on your program. It includes a utility that lets you select which source files to add trace statements, and then does so automatically. Wanna remove them when you're done? No problem! Done automatically.

By the way, you don't need to remove the calls unless you want to. The tracer code is smart enough to do nothing if the tracer server isn't present!

See the Forest Among all the Trees

Events, Methods, Subs, and Functions, boy-oh-boy can it get confusing. With Visual Basic, you will no doubt wonder what is happening and in what order, and what values are stored in arguments and variables. You could single step (*ugh*) or embed Debug.Print calls throughout your source code. But if you're going to go that far, why not take the easier route and use Visual Tracer?

You'll find the trace file has all the information you need to unravel the complex interrelationships of code and objects. You'll find that with PinPoint, you can understand what's happening when and what the data values are.

Optimize your Optimizations

Haven't discussed Visual Profiler™ yet, have we? If Visual Tracer is the *bagel*, Visual Profiler is the *cream cheese*! Visual Profiler takes the trace output and uses it to analyze the performance of your application with one millisecond resolution! The Visual Profiler tells you how many times each event or Sub or Function was called, what the Gross and Net times were (total and average), and even shows you a pretty graph!

With this info, you can intelligently identify (I might say PinPoint, but I won't) what aspects of your application to optimize! You can optimize by improving your Visual Basic code, by writing it in C or C++, or by using another third party tool like MicroHelp's Muscle (also available in VBxtras!) By the way, PinPoint works with C and C++ too.

The Bottom Line!

The bottom line is that Visual Tracer and Visual Profiler are indispensable! You won't use them every day; I'd be lying to you if I said you would.

But and this is the real bottom line when you need the information you can get from PinPoint, there's no other tool that can do the job! None, nada, zilch, bupkis.

Fortunately for all us Visual Basic developers, PinPoint not only does the job, but does it quite nicely, too!

Waddayamean Type Mismatch?!?!?

I don't know about you, but I've gotten pretty tired of having users tell me that the program blew up and all it said was 'Type Mismatch.' ARGH! Or maybe you got the infamous Invalid Use of Null? No program is perfect, and many are data driven and data dependent. What's a poor developer to do?

On Error Shoot Foot

I find the Visual Basic error handling to be somewhat less than intuitive. It tends to frustrate me when an error occurs in one place, but gets trapped in another.

Maybe it's reasonable, but it's not obvious! And I'm not particularly fond of putting those #*&# On Error Whatever statements in by hand - it's just too bloody time consuming.

VB/Rig Does It!

VB/Rig does the work that I don't like to do. It examines my project and then, based on what I tell it, puts the error handling code in for me! That's right, it does the work.

If you've used PinPoint, also from Avanti Software, you may have come to appreciate the automatic code insertion and removal tool. VB/Rig takes the same approach.

The author, Brad Kaenel, clearly must have thought to himself Why do this stuff more than once? Why not write the code once, and then let it do the work?

Brad has included a simple mission statement in VB/Rig:

VB/Rig's mission is to make runtime error-handling so easy to implement that you'll do it every time, all the time, as part of your normal development. You know what? He may just have succeeded!

Stack'em Here

Here's how it works. As your program runs, VB/Rig maintains a procedure stack. Yup - it keeps track of where you've been in your code and where you are now - it's almost as good as your mother!

When a runtime error occurs, VB/Rig first traps it so your program doesn't die. Then, up pops a window showing the error number, some explanatory text, and a nice, clear procedure trace for your user to look at. Finally, VB/Rig Pro time-stamps all that error information and writes it to a log file so you can review it later.

What does this mean to you? It means that instead of having to guess or figure, you <u>know</u> which Sub or Function was executing when the runtime error occurred. And you can collect this information while the program is running out in customer-land! Pretty cool, huh? But there's more!

I Wanna Do It Myself!

I know - you don't just want that automatic stuff - you want some real error handling. You wanna write it yourself, or it doesn't count.

VB/Rig includes some handy options, including one that will insert a nice template (Select Case) for you to do your own thing.

So... What Am I Saying?

Don't worry - VB/Rig won't take any of the fun out of it (hahahahaaaa) - just the drudgery. VBxtras has a great price...so why wait?

Picture This!

For those of us who grew up in the pre-GUI era, the old DOS TREE program created a nice visual with directories and sub-directories all laid out in an Outline format. Nowadays, word processors such as Word for Windows and PIM's like ECCO Pro incorporate outliners as a standard part of their products to allow thought processing. Haven't you ever wanted to incorporate similar concepts into your VB apps and couldn't find anything that gave you the flexibility and power to pass on to the user? Now you can use TList!

Recordsets created through VB/Link can be visualized as a grid with each column a retrieved field resulting from the query. Given its likeness to a grid, the recordset can be sent to a grid or a listbox by using a set of functions included with VB/Link. No code is needed to iterate through the recordset with Additems for each record.

Joining Data

It is fairly easy to join columns of NotesData resultsets to VB dynasets. The joins are accomplished through a function call that creates a resulting recordset sent to a standard VB grid, with field names of the resulting dataset represented in each column of the grid.

A Different Way...

Standard Notes behavior dictates that views be created to work with data stored in Notes databases. These views are generally rigid due to their pre-defined nature. I have a client that has a home office and many remote branches. She wanted to put in a WAN so she could consolidate reporting, and transfer work back and forth on a project. She then looked at the price of the WAN. She had complete sticker shock.

I proposed that I would create an automated communications server that would automatically send information to the home office at a scheduled time or on demand. If you can't guess yet, I was not the hero here. PDQComm was the hero. I was able to save the customer TONS! of money, by not putting in a WAN. Let there be Code

The Good Old Days

This is not a story about your Grandpa who had to walk 3 miles to school. (Up hill both ways!) But, I remember the days when I would upgrade my customer's programs by sending them a single .EXE That was it! Those were the days...

Files, Files and More Files!

Things have sure changed a lot since then, with the component method of software development that Windows supports. Add a .VBX here, call some .DLL's there and... SHAZAM! Go Figure...

I love Visual Basic and the opportunities it has given me. I am amazed at the ease in which a powerful Windows application can be created, especially with the database capability provided with VB 3.0. However, I often wonder what those at Microsoft who designed Visual Basic were thinking when so much standard Windows functionality was not provided.

Enter the .VBX

Thank heaven for the .VBX hooks that Microsoft left in Visual Basic. Third party vendors rapidly filled in the feature's gap with an assortment of custom controls, and MicroHelp, Inc. has been at the forefront providing tools for Visual Basic development. Many of us have used MicroHelp products since 1985 with Peeks & Pokes, and VBTools since the days of Thunder.

Where do I Begin?

VBTools 4 is bursting with tools for Visual Basic: 54 custom controls and utility functions in all! The newest version, 4.0, contains several new controls including FPGrid10, MhTAB, and MhTip. Grid/VBX from Farpoint Technologies is a database grid that is really fast when it comes to database data. I like the ability to directly type in a grid cell and have the tab key wrap to the next line. You can use Check Boxes for Yes/No for logical data, and Combo Boxes for cell selections. The MhTAB control allows the creation of a tabbed set of windows similar to those presented in Word 6.0 and Excel 5.0. Since MhTAB is a container control with an alignment property, it can be used on MDI forms to create an interface consisting of folders. Other controls can then be placed on the individual folders.

MhTip creates those neat little pop-up help windows for icons that are so popular today. All you do is set the interval property to the delay time for displaying the tip, and set the tip caption in the *SetCaption* event which is the only event MhTip has.

Bind that Control!

VBTools 4 contains 22 controls that can be bound to a Visual Basic data control. Also, if you want to use a control that does not have binding capabilities, VBTools has MhOutOfBounds, which can bind any control. Many controls in VBTools 4 are enhancements for standard VB controls. Mh3dCombo and Mh3dList are bound listbox controls with multicolumn capabilities. VB does not provide list box controls that are data aware nor have multicolumn capability.

Darn those #\$%& Users

You know those users of your application. They type in stuff that you have to validate. Where should you put your validation? *Not* in the LostFocus event. For this, VBTools provides six custom edit controls for handling specific data types: integers, dates, real numbers, and an enhanced textbox control with any number of customized input/output properties and special masks. I find MhInput more flexible than MSMasked in VB Pro because it can be used more like a standard text control for output with edit masks as needed.

A Day to Play!

One very interesting control is the Mh3dCalendar control (similar to the pop-up calendar in Quicken), which displays a calendar with buttons for changing year and month.

Mh3dCalendar can be bound to a date field in your database. Other unique controls are

MhCard for displaying cards and MhDice which creates dice images. These game controls are unique VB add-ons.

Obviously, one page alone does not provide enough room to describe all the controls. Extensive examples are provided, and the on-line help is so good that you might not even need the manual!

The Leader of the Pack

MicroHelp stated VBTools 4 is meant to be the *ultimate* custom control add-on product, with more controls for a lot less money than anyone else. I think they more than accomplished their goal!

VBGraphix is a one of a kind add-on for Visual Basic. There are simply no other products that do all of the things that you can do with it. With VBGraphix you can implement sophisticated charting, allow users to make drawings, present slide shows, and display animated drawings.

Functions in the DLLs allow you to: specify a form to be used for drawing; read and save files; set preferences; copy and paste using the Windows clipboard; change the current drawing function; change the properties of selected objects; group and ungroup objects; and many more functions.

Other functions will pop up a dialog box allowing the user to set many different values interactively.

Even Better than Picasso

The drawing tools are object oriented, in that they allow you to draw a variety of shapes including lines, curves, circles, and rectangles; and then interactively select the objects and change properties such as line style, thickness, or fill type.

You can group objects, move them around, scale, rotate, and perform similar transformations. A single function call to the VBGraphix API saves the drawing as an XScript, Windows Metafile, or Postscript file.

Design your own Symbol Libraries

VBGraphix also has a resource manager which allows users to insert new symbols into a drawing. You can create new resources and distribute them along with your application to allow your users to make custom maps, diagrams, etc. Or you may want to generate new objects based on data, and allow these objects to be used in drawings.

The possibilities are limitless! I used VBGraphix to implement a drawing module that is part of a pen computer application.

Now drawings and maps can be created in the field while data is being collected. And because VBGraphix is royalty free I can include the drawing module as a bonus feature on

Because the design environment in VB is so visual, I found myself designing screens on the fly. Life was great. But it later turned into a love-hate relationship. You see, I kept moving things around the forms, trying to line things up. I thought I would scream if the user asked me to change the tab order on one more screen. I know it is not good to scream at customers, but I was going crazy!!!

Welcome to Code Improvements!

Then ToolThings by Pinnacle Publishing came roaring to the rescue. This Thing is AWESOME! I now know how Tim Allen feels on Home Improvements when he wraps his hands around a world class, high performance, super charged tool! But this is not just one tool, it's a whole box of tool (thing)s.

No More Mr. Grouch

One of my favorite tools in the toolbox is the Tab Thing. You can pop up a single dialog box, and set the tab order for all the controls on the form without going into each individual control's property. I can even smile at my customers now when they ask me to change a form, because I know I can so easily change all the THINGS on the form (and still charge 'em big bucks!)

Like a Rabbit out of a Hat...

Watch me pull another THING out of my toolbox. The nudge thing. Move a THING or a group of THINGS all at the same time one pixel at a time, Align them, make them the same size, total control! I can't imagine life without it!

Does the Drudge Work

ToolThings also has tools that take the drudgery out of programming. It has tools that let you easily design and preview forms, message boxes, and common dialogs; set all the properties, preview them, then have it generate the code for you! Not only that, but you can save settings into templates to use in different projects. If this product came only with the tools mentioned, I would buy it in a minute. But it doesn't stop there.

What VB Should Have Included But Didn't

How about being able to highlight a block of code and push the Blockout Thing and comment it out, or un-comment it. Or how about pushing the Dent Thing to re-indent that block, or re-indent the whole project! Or push the Call Thing to get a picklist of all your user-defined functions. Press Type Thing to scan your projects for global and constant declarations; then when you are ready to ship, press the Compress Thing to remove all unused routines, variables, and constants for smaller faster .EXE's.

Pinnacle's Only Mistake

I don't think Pinnacle was thinking when they decided to market this one. Yeah, all the tools were designed to work together, and they all have the same look and feel. But they could

have sold them separately for \$50 - \$100 bucks each! This THING is a steal- buy it before they come to their senses.

The Pen Is Mightier

For thousands of years humans have used signatures as a source of unique personal identification. But then pen and paper went out the window, replaced by the computer and awkward passwords or Personal Identification Numbers (PINs).

I Forgot my Password!

The problem with PINs is they are too easy to lose or forget. Also, these numbers can be stolen very easily. A recent client told me of how they gave a clerk a new password and within the day, that password was being used on the other side of the country to gain access to a system because it was a lot easier that way! Power to the People!

Adding charts and graphs is a great way to spice up and add value to your application. When you add built-in charts, you save your users the hassle of having to fire up another program such as Excel to graph their data.

As you know, Visual Basic Professional makes this pretty easy, right out of the box. Add the graph VBX to your project, drag the control, set a few properties, and you've got a working chart.

Problem is, the chart you provide may not be the chart that your user really wants. Instead, you can use Chart FX. The beauty of Chart FX is the way it opens itself up to the end-user.

Instant Toolbars

Before I got Chart FX, I had an app that used a chart or two. Sure, it was easy enough - I dragged a Chart object into one of my forms, grabbed the example out of the help file, and had a 3D pie in a half hour. But when I was ready to ship, the marketing department wanted much more pizzazz than I had first incorporated. Then I got Chart FX and with this one simple VBX, I tripled the pizzazz value of my app by givin' em a chart with toolbars! Instead of simply displaying the chart, the user is now able to print, save to disk, change colors, select chart types, configure legends, and rotate.

All that I needed to do to add this flexibility was to replace the standard VB Pro graph control and make a few code changes. Aside from the one line of code to OpenData (which I stole from one of the seven example apps), the translation from the VB Pro syntax to the Chart FX is nearly one-to-one. And the result is amazing; I suddenly have a fully user-customizable fancy 3D chart piece in my app.

Chart FX provides a great choice of chart types, including 3D ribbons and Spline charts. And the built-in runtime balloon helps too.

So You're a Control Freak You Say?

Yeah, it was a good idea to open up the graph so my users can customize things. But there are some things I don't want them to do, changing the data being one of them. Chart FX has a data editor on the toolbar that presents a grid to the user, in which they can change the values that make up the chart. In my case, I don't want them to mess with the data. No problem. At design time, I can turn off any of the toolbar buttons, with a simple dialog box off the properties box. And not only are they then not functional, they don't even show up! No grayed-out mystery buttons to provoke calls to your support line.

It's All in Your Perspective

One of the really slick pieces of code in this VBX is the gadget Chart FX uses to change the charting perspective. It's hard to describe, but they display a window with a 3D picture of two intersecting plates, each with a marble on the edge. You use the mouse to drag the marbles around, and get a instant sketch of the new point-of-view. Much easier to use than the Excel way of dragging the corner handles around. Your users will think you are really clever to include such a nice piece of work.

Speedy Gonzoles!

With all the emphasis on end-user customizability, do you loose anything in terms of pure graph performance? Not at all; this VBX is fast. The graphs paint snappy and clean. And

Version control is one of those things that most of us never think about until it's too late. Kind of like the way most new users only learn about backups after they've just lost a major quantity of work.

Because I Said So...

More than Even COBOL...

How many DOS-xBase applications are out there today? Better yet how many will need to be converted to Windows? Let me tell you, TONS! I had a project to convert parts of an existing Clipper application to Windows. The powers that be did not want to convert the whole application at once because they felt it to be too big of a project. But Visual Basic 3.0 supports xBase file formats, right? NOT!

A Tower of Babel

The problem is that VB supports xBase data file formats, but not Clipper index files. Worse yet Visual Basic does not support Clipper's record locking on a Network. This is not good! If you had to pick one book to buy on Visual Basic, I'd say that this is the one. Why? Well, many reasons. Although size alone does not denote quality, it IS over 1600 pages! But in those 1600 pages more relevant material is covered about how to use Visual Basic than any other book I've come across lately.

What else? If you want to find out about a specific statement, function, object, property, method, etc. in VB Pro, the inside cover contains a jump-table that lists each of these and the pages on which you can find them.

In the back of the book is another two page jump-table of various task categories and subcategories such as OLE/Activate an Object, Keys/Trap form-level input, and DDE/Get information from a linked application.

Organized into 7 parts with 27 chapters, Visual Basic SuperBible covers everything from the basics of using objects and responding to events, to showing how to use DDE, OLE, and the data control, and everything in between. Sample code is provided for how to use practically every feature of VB, and a 3.5 diskette is included that contains all of the major examples in the book; one for each chapter. In most cases, this book is all that I'll ever need when it comes to using VB. Try it, I think you'll like it.

Database Developer's Guide\$39 with Visual Basic 3

In a recent reader survey, Visual Basic Programmer's Journal found that 77.5% of their readers do database development; that is a pretty powerful statistic! Visual Basic is really a great tool for developing database applications, but it ain't exactly easy if you don't already know how!

That is where the Database Developer's Guide comes in. Another large book, this one is over 1100 pages. It covers the entire realm of database development in VB (and nothing else; this baby is focused).

Database Developer's Guide covers a lot of ground in its 6 parts. Part 1 covers the data access object and related controls. Part 2 discusses database and query design including SQL. Part 3 addresses database front end design. Advanced programming with data access objects is found in part 4 including transaction processing. Part 5 covers multi-user database applications including networked and client/server databases as well as integrating with mail systems. And finally part 6 shows you how to distribute production database applications. And of course is includes a diskette that contains all of the source code from the example applications in the book.

So, if you happen to be a Visual Basic programmer who develops database applications, then you need this book, without a doubt.

Sometimes you just want to have some fun! Well if you agree, then this is the book for you! As the author states, computer games are a lot of fun to play, but are often a challenge for the programmer because of how difficult they are to implement. Well, this book provides 11 really neat games complete with background about the game, a description of how to play it, and a discussion of how to implement it.

The games include Boule (a variation of roulette), Deduce (a logic game), Fractal Puzzle (like a 2D Rubic's cube), Grid War (I didn't like this one; I couldn't even score!), Ludo (a neat board game - I beat the computer!), Peg Solitare (like those toys you see in a country restaurant), Queens (another logic game), Ringo (an 4 against 7 circular checkers-like game), TriPack (like Tetris), 3D Tic Tac Toe (the one with the first move should always win), and Word Squares (like a solitare scrabble).

Since each of these games is a complete, working game, you get to really see how they are implemented; many of the techniques are useful even if you're not writing games.

And, since all the games come on the diskette in both executable form as well as source, you may want to get it just for the completed games; to heck with the source code! So, for a fun and educational book, you can't beat this one.
