### Shareware Notice & Registration

Quick Boot is a small and handy utility designed to automate the tasks of exiting and rebooting Windows 95, as well as restarting the system. It can be configured to exit Windows 95, reboot Windows 95 and/or logoff the current user from Windows 95 automatically at up to 30 different times and dates. It also doubles up as a on-screen clock and an alarm clock for up to 10 different times and dates. It has an option to remain on top of the screen so that you can easily access it at all times.

New features in this version include:

- # Supports command line parameters:
  - REBOOT for immediate rebooting of system
  - SHUTDOWN for immediate shutting down of Windows
  - LOGOFF for immediate logging off Windows
  - FORCE for unconditional action stated above.

e.g.

wqb265.exe REBOOT FORCE to reboot unconditionally immediately.

wqb265.exe LOGOFF to logoff immediately.

### **Shareware Notice & Registration**

### **Shareware Notice & Registration**

If the Unconditional option is not used, the rebooting sequence is safe regardless of the Confirmation setting. All unsaved work within the current session will be detected and Windows 95 will ask you if you wish to save your work.

If the Unconditional option is used, Quick Boot will force all applications to close and reboot Windows 95.

Quick Boot is SHAREWARE. You are entitled to evaluate Quick Boot for a period of up to 14 days. If after that time you intend to continue to use this program, you must register it. If you do not intend to continue to use the program you must delete it from your system. Failure to comply with this condition is a violation of United States and international copyright laws.

### **Alarm Times...**

Use this option to set the alarm. Enter a valid time (eg. 2:00pm) in the first dialog box to set the alarm. If you wish, enter a valid date (the format of the date should follow the format specified in the International settings under Control Panel) in the second dialog box. If you do not wish to set the date, simply leave the second entry blank. You have up to 10 different times and dates to set.

### **Exit Times...**

Use this option to set the time and date (if needed) at which Quick Boot will automatically exit Windows 95. You will not be prompted for confirmation if you do not check the Confirmation option (see below). You have up to 10 different times and dates to set. By selecting the Unconditional option, Quick Boot will perform an unconditional exit, meaning all applications in the background will be forced to close without further notice.

### **Reboot Times...**

Use this option to set the time at which Quick Boot will automatically reboot Windows 95. You will not be prompted for confirmation if you do not check the Confirmation option (see below). You have up to 10 different times and dates to set.. By selecting the Unconditional option, Quick Boot will perform an unconditional reboot, meaning all applications in the background will be forced to close without further notice.

### **Logoff Times...**

Use this option to set the time at which Quick Boot will automatically logoff the current user from Windows 95. You will not be prompted for confirmation if you do not check the Confirmation option (see below). You have up to 10 different times nad dates to set.. By selecting the Unconditional option, Quick Boot will perform an unconditional reboot, meaning all applications in the background will be forced to close without further notice.

### **Logoff Now**

Asks Quick Boot to logoff the current user now. You will not be prompted for confirmation if you do not check the Confirmation option (see below).

### **Always On Top**

Checking this option will allow you to see Quick Boot at all times. This will give you a handy system clock on your screen all the time. You can also exit Windows 95 instantly by clicking on 'Exit' any time you wish to quit Windows 95.

### **Confirmation**

Specifies whether Quick Boot will prompt you when exiting Windows 95, rebooting Windows 95 or logging off the current user. By default, Quick Boot will not prompt you for confirmation.

### **Unconditional**

Specifies whether Quick Boot will exit, reboot or logoff unconditionally. By selecting the Unconditional option, Quick Boot will perform an unconditional reboot, meaning all applications in the background will be forced to close without further notice.

**Save Settings Now**

Saves the current settings into the Windows 95 registry.

**Save Settings on Exit**

Checking this option will make Quick Boot save the current session's settings when the program ends.

Shows the copyright message, version and licensing information for Quick Boot.

## **What is Shareware?**

### **Shareware Notice & Registration**

What SHAREWARE is:

Shareware describes a method of distributing copyrighted software in which a user is allowed to fully evaluate the software before purchasing it. After an evaluation period, the user is required to register the product if s/he decides to keep using it.

Shareware distribution addresses all of the legitimate complaints that users have with commercial software distribution.

Shareware allows a user to fully evaluate a product, free of charge, in his or her home, BEFORE deciding to buy it.

Shareware programs can circulate freely on Bulletin Boards, through Shareware disk distributors, or through user groups.

Because Shareware distribution reduces the need to advertise, Shareware is less expensive than commercial software.

Shareware authors can often be more responsive to users' requests for help or bug fixes than large software companies.

Shareware software, needless to say, is never copy-protected.

In short, Shareware is a user's dream come true. Users show their appreciation to developers for this extremely flexible distribution scheme by registering their software. Without user registrations Shareware software would gradually disappear. It is not sufficient to simply let the "other guy" pay the registration. You are the other guy's "other guy".

What SHAREWARE is NOT:

Shareware is not "free" software. Shareware is not Public Domain software. The fee that you may have paid to receive a Shareware program does not mean that the software has been paid for. This money was paid to a Shareware disk vendor, User Group, Bulletin Board Service or retailer to cover their cost of getting the program to you. Shareware software is paid for by registering your copy with the author.

Quick Boot supports the following command line parameters:

#### **REBOOT**

Reboots system immediately.

#### **SHUTDOWN**

Shuts down Windows 95 immediately.

#### **LOGOFF**

Logs off current user from Windows 95 immediately.

#### **FORCE**

Performs any of the above actions unconditionally.

For example, if the line below is entered into Win95 Explorer's Run dialog box,

[wqb265 REBOOT FORCE](#)

Windows 95 will immediately reboot unconditionally without further ado.
