This read-me file documents the revision history of WatchWork and where the program is headed.

Known Bugs

- Only 'synthesized' sounds work properly. Though the sounds provided with WatchWork fall into this category, others (such as the system 'simple beep') do not and will appear dimmed in the Sounds menu.
- Incomplete Screen Saver. The screen saver works fine when WatchWork is the 'current' application. When it's in the background in Multifinder or System 7, it tends to just 'save' the screen behind the current application. If this is confusing, I'd just turn off the screen saver 'til a fix is available. The screen saver is not meant to compete with some of the staggeringly beautiful alternatives available today. If you have one of these commercial programs I would use it instead.

Fixed Bugs

- If more than two urgent alarms 'come up' at the same time, I only get one notification (fixed 10/17/91).
- When I use the 'Months' pop-up menu in the alarm editor, my Macintosh portable screen gets 'smeared' (fixed 9/15/91).

Enhancements I'm Considering

- Would you allow the creation of multiple alarm files so that I can manage the appointments of others?
- When I delete an alarm could it go into a completed alarm file so that I can use it to document my appointments?

Completed Enhancements

- Could you make the chimes in the 'background' so that I can keep typing when they go off? (asynchronous sound added 11/03/91).
- Would it be hard to add a screen saver to WatchWork? (yes! harder than I thought, anyway. A simple one was added 10/26/91 though it needs some

work).

- Could you add a more traditional sound like a grandfather clock or Big Ben that would chime four times on the hour, once on the quarter hour, etc.? (no sweat. The 'Big Ben' sound and option was completed 10/5/91).
- When you delete a re-occurring alarm, would WatchWork give us the 'reschedule' option before just deleting the alarm? (completed 11/25/91).
