

WallPeep for Windows v1.11

INTRO

WallPeep for Windows lets you scroll through all the BMP, WMF, DIB, RLE and ICO files on your hard drive in a single list to see them previewed in tiled format as wallpaper.

You can choose to install a selected file as your wallpaper, or automatically open Paintbrush to edit it first. Files can also be located and listed by individual directory.

WallPeep requires VBRUN200.DLL and WIN 3.1.

INSTALL/STARTUP

Copy WallPeep.EXE to your hard drive, if you'd like, and create a Program Item for it with the Program Manager. Or, simply Run WallPeep.EXE from the Program Manager's File menu.

VBRUN200.DLL must be in your Windows directory to run WallPeep. This file is available in the Visual Basic-Win library of the MSBasic forum on CompuServe.

OPERATION

Click on a file name to see the file previewed as wallpaper. The files listed are those with extensions of BMP, WMF, DIB, RLE and ICO. Click 'Show all usable files' to list all the files with those extensions on the currently selected drive, regardless of directory.

Grab the bottom right-hand corner of the displayed image to resize it. Hold down [Shift] as you resize the image to retain its proportions.



Click 'Set as Wallpaper' to create a file called WALLPEEP.BMP in your Windows directory, and to set that file as your Windows wallpaper file.
