Installing

"Oi !" works best if you place it in your start-up folder and make it run minimized. This way it will always be running in the background whenever you run Windows but it will still interrupt you and pop up a message box when an event occurs.

Using "Oi !"

"Oi !" is a very easy to use reminder program. The main window shows you the list of all the events that "Oi !" is keeping track of for you. Events are shown in red if they are going to occur today, in green if this week and in black if later on.

To view a single category of events such as birthdays, meetings or appointments, click on one of the buttons at the top of the window.

To make a new event simply click on the 'New' button to bring up the 'New Event' dialog box. You can then type in the description and select the type of event as well as how often, and at what time and on which day or days the event occurs. The dialog box will show you the time and day of the event's next occurrence.

To edit an existing event, either double click on it or select it and click on the 'Edit' button.

To delete an event, select it and click on the 'Delete' button.

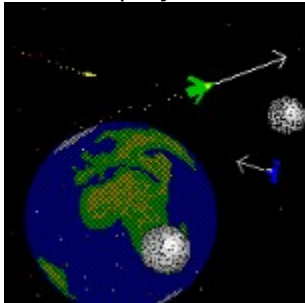
