Shareware Contacting the Author

Instrument Selection

To select an instrument, use the scroll bar. The shareware version of AMF Organ will be limited to 10 instruments. The full version will have 127 instruments.

Volume

Use the scroll bar to change the MIDI volume. Please note: MIDI volume may be a feature not supported by your sound card or MIDI device.

Octave

Use the scroll bar to change the octave from 2 through 7. Many sound cards will not be able to produce sounds in octave 7.

Keys

Using the mouse, simply click on a key to produce a note in the selected octave, at the selected volume, on the selected instrument. You can hold down the mouse and drag it along the keys to produce different effects.

Status Bar

The status bar will keep you informed of the functions of the objects and buttons and the status of the organ.

Open and Play

Use this to open a previously saved .AMF file. The file you select will play.

Save

Use this to save a recorded AMF file.

Record

Recording is accomplished by pressing the record button and playing. The limit to the number of notes is approximately 3,500. Please note: due to certain system setups, timers are not always given attention, so the piece you record will not always be exactly what you record-- that is, the amount of time for a rest may change slightly. The pieces you record will probably be about 98% correct. To stop recording, press the STOP button. The record button clears its memory of notes each time it is pressed, so save your work.

Play

Use this to playback your newly recorded piece.

Minimize

This minimizes AMF Organ.

Exit

Use this to end the current AMF Organ session.

About

Shows the about box.

Help

Brings up the help for AMF Organ. This also may be accessed by pressing F1.

Note Bar

In the registered version, the registration reminder is replaced by a note bar which indicates the musical letter of the note produced by the key below it.

On/Off

Turns the organ on and off. Red indicates Off; Green indicates On.
