## Over View:

The Spelling Quizzer is designed for children between 1st and 6th grades to help them with their weekly spelling words. It allows the student or parent to enter the spelling words along with a sample sentence and/or word definition. The student can then study the words, and when he/she feels he is ready, can take the quiz. The quiz will display the sentence and/or definition and the student will have to enter the spelling word. When the student ends the quiz it will display his score.

## List Menu:

This menu allows you to create new spelling lists, open existing spelling lists, save your list to a file, display the list, print the list, and exit the program.

## Word Menu

This menu lets you add, delete, edit, or study the spelling words on your list.

## Quiz Option

Allows you to configure the spelling quiz for you options and then tests you with those options. Options for Order are sequential or random. You can include sentences, definitions or both in your quiz. You also get a score report after completing the quiz.

# Student Menu

# Open

## Save As

Lets you store your spelling words on a disk file under any name. If you created a new list, you would want to use this option.

## New

This option lets you start a brand new spelling list. NOTE: the list will not be save to a disk file until you do it.

The Dialog box that comes up for this option allows you to enter a spelling word, definition, and sample sentence. Pushing the next word button, or the finished button on this box enters the word into memory. Pushing the last word button allows you to view or change previous words in the list.

# Display

Display a list of all spelling words. This box has four buttons: [view/edit](#)

# Print

Prints your spelling word list to the printer. Only five words fit on each page, so make sure you have enough paper.

## Exit

This choice lets you quit the program.

## Sentence

When you enter a sample sentence into the spelling quizzer, the quizzer will automatically search the sentence for your spelling word, and replace the word with the underline character "\_\_\_"

# Sequential

This means your spelling words will displayed in the same order they were input.

# Random

This means your spelling words will be asked in a mixed up order. NOTE: Spelling word 1 is always displayed first.



# Format

The way a file is save to a disc, ASCII, binary, etc. The spelling quizzer uses binary.

# Delete

Erase a word from the spelling list.

# Cancel

Closes the current dialog box without making changes.

## Add

This option lets you add words to your existing spelling list. NOTE: the list will not be save to a disk file until you do it.

The Dialog box that comes up for this option allows you to enter a spelling word, definition, and sample sentence. Pushing the next word button, or the finished button on this box enters the word into memory. Pushing the last word button allows you to view or change previous words in the list.

## Edit

This menu choice shows you a list of words, and allows you to choose a word by clicking on it (or double clicking on it) and edit the sample sentence, definition or spelling word.

# Study

## View/Edit

This option lets you change words in your existing spelling list. NOTE: the list will not be save to a disk file until you do it.

Pushing the last word button allows you to view or change previous words in the list. Pushing the change button enters your changes into memory.

# Scores

Your score is saved into a file in this order:

Your Name

Number of words you got right.

Number of words you got wrong.

Total number of words in the list.

Your average for the words you tried.

The file name of the list.

The date you took the quiz.
