Open command (File menu)

Use this command to open an MPEG bitstream for playback. See also $\underline{1, 2, 3, 4 \text{ command}}$.

Shortcuts

Toolbar:

Keys: CTRL+O

File Open dialog box

The following options allow you to specify which audio stream to open:

File Name

Type or select the filename you want to open. This box lists files with the extension you select in the List Files of Type box.

List Files of Type

Select the type of file you want to open: (*.mpg;*.mp2; *.mpa etc.)

Drives

Select the drive where the streams that you want to open reside.

Directories

Select the directory where the file that you want to open is located.

Network...

Choose this button to connect to a network location, assigning it a new drive letter.

Close command (File menu)

Use this command to close the current opened stream.

Shortcut

Keys: CTRL+C

1, 2, 3, 4 command (File menu)

You can use the numbers and filenames listed at the bottom of the File menu to open up to four most recently opened MPEG audio streams. To do so, simply choose the number that corresponds with the stream you want to open.

Exit command (File menu)

Use this command to quit the audio player.

Shortcuts

Mouse: Double-click the application's Control menu button.



Keys: ALT+F4

Status Bar command (View menu)

Use this command to display and hide the Status Bar, which describes the action to be executed by the selected menu item or depressed toolbar button, and keyboard latch state. A check mark appears next to the menu item when the Status Bar is displayed.

Status Bar

The status bar is displayed at the bottom of the player window, which appears as



The left area of the status bar describes actions of menu items as you use the arrow keys to navigate through menus. This area similarly shows messages that describe the actions of toolbar buttons as you depress them, before releasing them. If after viewing the description of the toolbar button command you wish not to execute the command, then release the mouse button while the pointer is off the toolbar button.

Help topics command (Help menu)

Use this command to display the opening screen of Help. From the opening screen, you can jump to step-by-step instructions for using ADI MPEG Audio Player and various types of reference information.

Once you open Help, you can click the Contents button whenever you want to return to the opening screen.

Help topics command (Help menu)

About amaplay command (Help menu)

Use this command to display the copyright notice and version number of your copy of the ADI MPEG Audio Player.

Context Help command

You may use the Context Help command to obtain partial help on ADI MPEG Audio Player. When you choose the Toolbar's Context Help button, the mouse pointer will change to an arrow and question mark. Then click somewhere in the Player window, such as another Toolbar button or a menu item. The Help topic will be shown for the item you clicked.

Shortcuts

Playback command (Play menu)

Use this command to playback an opened MPEG audio stream.

Loop play command (Play menu)

Use this command to playback an opened MPEG audio stream in a loop fashion

Pause command (Play menu)

Use this command to pause the current playback in process.

Use this command to forward the current opened stream.



Display MPEG Information

Use the command $\underline{\text{Bitstream Info}}$ in the $\underline{\text{View menu}}$ to display information about the opened MPEG audio bitstream

Title Bar

The title bar is located along the top of the ADI MPEG Audio Player window. It contains the name of the opened MPEG audio stream in addition to that of the Player.

The title bar also contains the following elements:

- Player control-menu button Player window minimizing button
- Player Exit button (Windows 95)

You may move the Player window through dragging the title bar.

Minimize command (Player Window Control)

Use this command to reduce the Player window to an icon.

Maximize command (Player Window Control)

Not activated.

Volume down command (Audio menu)

Use this command to turn down the audio playback volume.

Size command (System menu)

Not activated.

Close command (Control menus)

You may use this command to exit the ADI MPEG Audio Player.

Double-clicking a Control-menu box is the same as choosing the Close command.



Shortcuts

Restore command (Control menu)

Move command (Control menu)



Note: This command is unavailable if you maximize the window.

Switch to command (application Control menu)

Use this command to display a list of all open applications. Use this "Task List" to switch to or close an application on the list.

Shortcut

Keys: CTRL+ESC

Dialog Box Options

When you choose the Switch To command, you will be presented with a dialog box with the following options:

Task List

Select the application you want to switch to or close.

Switch To

Makes the selected application active.

End Task

Closes the selected application.

Cancel

Closes the Task List box.

Cascade

Arranges open applications so they overlap and you can see each title bar. This option does not affect applications reduced to icons.

Tile

Arranges open applications into windows that do not overlap. This option does not affect applications reduced to icons.

Arrange Icons

Arranges the icons of all minimized applications across the bottom of the screen.

Slider Bar

You may use the slider bar to Fast Forward or Rewind the audio stream by dragging the slider to the right or to the left. This can be done even when the stream is being played.
