Because of the flexibility of Ituner, controls might not appear in other faceplates. Also, this will affect the appearance and location of such controls. The best thing to do is experiment and try each control. We will a best effort in making these controls as recognizable and universal as possible!

Playing Local Clips

There are two ways to play local RealAudio clips

• From the Menu Button

- 1. Click on the **menu drop** button
- ⇒≡
- 2. Select the item **Open File...**
- 3. Click on a file with a type of either .ra or .ram
- 4. The clip will automatically start playing

• From the Desktop

- 1. Select a .ra or .ram file from the desktop's window
- 2. Drag and drop it into the Ituner Radio
- 3. The clip will automatically start playing

- From the Menu Button
- 1. Click on the **menu drop** button



- Select the item **Open RealAudio Location...**Click on a file with a type of either .ra or .ram 2.

Using Presets

It is very likely that once you have found a favorite RealAudio site, you probably would like to access it quickly during your next session.

Using Presets

Simply click on a preset to start playing a clip. The **Shift** button will roll through different banks of presets and update the preset labels.

Setting Presets

Each preset can be customized to play any local or network RealAudio file. See <u>Presets Preferences</u> for how to set it

Using Scan

Scan will play all clips stored in the presets for a certain amount of time. It will automatically skip presets that are empty.

Click on the **Scan** button once again to stop scanning. If audio is playing, then it will continue playing.

Scan Preferences

• Scan seconds

Length of time to play a clip before going on to the next preset

• Loop to beginning

When checked, the radio will scan back to the first preset after the last preset has finished playing its duration. If not checked, the scan will stop after the last preset is done playing.

• Skip errors

If this option is checked, proceed to the next preset if the current preset fails. Otherwise, cancel scanning.

Playback and Seek

Ituner provides extensive seek functions to quickly find sections of an audio clip.

Button	Function	Description	
	Play	Start playing clip	
11	Pause	Pause a clip	
	(in some faceplates, Play and Pause are the same button)		
→	Next Clip	Go to the next clip of a .ram file	
K	Previous Clip	Go to the previous clip of a .ram file	
	Stop	Stops the current clip from playing/stops network connection	

The following options are available only for pre-recorded clips:

*	Rewind Rewinds the starting position of a clip
→	Forward Forwards the starting position of a clip

Progress Bar A bar that shows how much of a clip has already been played.

The starting position may be changed by dragging on this area.

Window Controls

These buttons perform window functions.

<u>Function</u>	<u>Description</u>
Power	Quit Ituner
Minimize	Minimize the window
Help	Display help file
Caption Toggle	Toggle the display of the window title/caption

Presets Preferences

The listbox lists all the available presets for the current radio. Notice that there may be more presets listed than what is visible on the main window. Press the shift button to access the other presets.

To Set/Edit a Preset

- 1. Click on a preset item from the preset list.
- 2. Fill in/edit the following fields:
- Label
- URL
- Description
- 3. Click on **OK**.

To Erase a Preset

- 1. Click on a preset item from the preset list.
- 2. Click on Clear.
- 3. Click on OK.

To Clear All Presets

Note that this operation is irreversible!

- 1. Click on Clear All.
- 2. Click on **OK**.

Setting the Volume

Click on the following buttons to set the volume.

Button	<u>Description</u>
+	Increase volume level
-	Decrease volume level
MUTE	Toggle the volume between off and the previously set value

Connection Preferences

Set these connection settings to optimize your network connection.

Bandwidth

Set this value to the highest speed of your modem connection.

• Network Timeout Seconds

The number of seconds for the radio to try to connect via network, before giving an error message.

Ouality

If your machine slows down considerably while playing audio, you might want to set it to "Least CPU usage". As a result, the audio quality will not be optimal.

Otherwise, leave this setting to Best Audio Quality.

Send Statistics

Check this box to send the server information about your machine.

Proxy Preferences

If you are behind a firewall, proxies need to be used. To use proxies, check the Use Proxy checkbox and fill in the following fields.

- RealAudio Server
- RealAudio Port
- HTTP Server
- HTTP Port

Menu

Click on the Menu button to access the other features of Ituner.

• Open RealAudio Location...

Brings up a dialog box to go to a specific RealAudio location. Accepts both pnm: and http: prefixed locations. Locations must end with a .ra or .ram

Valid locations are played once they are loaded.

Open File...

Brings up a file selector from which a .ra or .ram file can be selected and played.

• Show Stats...

Brings up a list of statistics for the current connection

• Toggle Caption

Removes the Caption/Titlebar of Ituner, if it is there. If it is not there, it is added. Note that the radio can still be moved, by dragging on non-button and non-progress bar areas.

• Ituner Home Page...

Runs the default browser and brings up Ituner's home page

• Register Ituner...

Runs the default browser and brings up the register Ituner page

Faceplate Preferences

One of the most exciting features of Ituner is the ability to change faceplates. Please visit our web site for the latest faceplate packages. Faceplates allow a completely different look for the Ituner radio.

The faceplate preferences screen displays the title, author and other information regarding the faceplate.

Click on the **Change...** button to bring up the file selector, from where you can choose an faceplate file (.ifc). Click on **OK** to save the changes. You must quit and restart Ituner to see the changes take effect.

Troubleshooting

Q: What does RealAudio error #___ mean?

A: Go to http://www.real.com/help/errors/ to get a listing a troubleshoot this error message.

For a short summary of error messages go to RealAudio Error messages

Q: Cannot use volume, gives an error message.....

A: Your sound card does not support volume control.

Q: Can I still view RealMedia movies with Ituner installed?

A: Yes! Ituner will automatically bring up the RealMedia player when it detects a video file.

Panels, Indicators and Meters

Panels, Indicators and meters are graphic indicators that monitor the status of a RealAudio clip. (Note that some panel, indicator or meter objects may not appear on your screen. This depends on the current faceplate.)

Panels

The information panel gives the current RealAudio clip's title, author and copyright information. Another panel is the counter panel. This displays both time elapsed and length of a clip.

Indicators

ON

OFF

Indicators are similar to LEDs in that their state indicate whether a feature is on or has been activated.

Network
 Local
 On when the current RealAudio clip is being played from a network
 Do when the current RealAudio clip is being played from a local file

• Buffering Blinks when receiving audio in advance

Live On when the current RealAudio clip is a live stream
 Stereo On when the current RealAudio clip is in stereo stream

• Scan On when scanning is activated

Meter



Currently, there is only one type of meter available. The network strength meter measure the amount of incoming audio stream data. It is at rest when the needle is on the left side at '0' and maximum at 100, on the right.

Installing into Browsers

The following are steps to automatically launch Ituner as a default player for RealAudio files. If you use a different browser, please follow either set of instructions below, as most browsers have similar install steps.

The easiest way to get the browsers to automatically launch Ituner is to re-install Ituner, but just in case, here are the instructions for both Netscape Navigator and Microsoft Explorer:

Netscape Navigator

- 1. Click on the **Options** menu and select **General Preferences**.
- 2. Click on the **Helpers** tab.
- 3. Search for the entry, "audio/x-pn-realaudio" under the File Type list.
- If it doesn't exist,
 - a. Click on the Create New Type button.
 - b. Enter the following:

Mime Type: audio

Mime SubType: x-pn-realaudio

- c. Click OK.
- d. Enter ra,ram in the Extensions field.
- 4. Select the **Launch the Application** option.
- 5. Click on the **Browse** button and find the directory where Ituner is installed.
- 6. Click OK.

Microsoft Explorer

- 1. Click on the View menu and select Options.
- 2. Click on the **Programs** tab.
- 3. Click on the **File Types** button.
- 4. Under the Registered file types list, look for RealAudio File or RealMedia File and select it.
- If it exists, click on the **Edit...** button

Under the Actions list, select open

Click on the Edit... button

Click on the Browse... button

From the file selector, find the directory where Ituner is installed.

Click on OK

• If it doesn't exist, click on the **New Type...** button

Set the following fields:

Description of type: RealAudio File

Associated extension: .ra, .ram

Content Type (MIME): audio/x-pn-realaudio

Click on the New... button

Under Action, type open

Click on the **Browse...** button

From the file selector, find the directory where Ituner is installed.
