The Multimedia Player is an easy-to-use multimedia player and jukebox. Although its main purpose is to quickly play and organize MIDI music files (\*.MID, \*.RMI) it can also play (and organize) wave files (\*.WAV) and movie files (\*.AVI, \*.MOV, \*.MPG, \*.FLI). This program relies on the Media Control Interface (MCI) to play media files.

The Multimedia Player is distributed under the ShareWare concept that means that you may try this software for 30 days. If you would like to use it beyond that period you must register.

**NOTE:** The Multimedia Player was designed to be easy to use. Therefore, this helpfile is not very comprehensive. If you do not understand how to use a specific button, please rest the mouse pointer on it a few seconds to get help by ToolTips.

# Albums

This feature is designed to let you easily organize your favorite multimedia files into different albums. You can then start playing an album, minimize the program and then listen to your favorite multimedia files while you do other things.

You can add multimedia files to an album in two ways:

- Drag and drop files on the Multimedia Player window from, for example, the Windows 3.x File Manager or from the Windows 95 Explorer.
- Use the filelist together with the *Add*, *Add All*, *Remove* and *Remove All* buttons.

You could, for example, go into one of your directories containing multimedia files, mark the files to be included in the album and then press the *Add* button. Then you can repeat this procedure in other directories. If you would like to remove some of the files in an album, mark the files to be removed and press *Remove*. The *Remove* and *Remove All* buttons does not delete the files from your hard drive, only from the album.

You can control how the Multimedia Player plays your files in a variety of ways. Please go into the Preferences dialog and rest the mouse pointer a few seconds on an active topic in the Playlist section to find out more about this.

# Main window

The main window consists of two main parts: The playlist to the left and the filelist to the right. The filelist to the right is designed to let you quickly browse your directories containing multimedia files and play them. The playlist to the left is designed to let you organize your favorite multimedia files into albums. You can then start playing an album, minimize the program and then listen to your favorite multimedia files while you do other things.

At the bottom of the window is a status bar which tells you the length of the current file, the position in it, how much time is remaining and the name of the current album. At the top is a toolbar which provides quick mouse access to the items found in the menus. Finally, a scrollbar is located in the toolbar that gives visual feedback of the current position and also lets you easily change it.

# Preferences dialog

The preferences dialog consists of two tabs. The General tab contains all the options related to running the program. This is the only tab that you have to worry about if you are happy with the appearance of the Multimedia Player. The Appearance tab contains the options regarding the appearance of the Multimedia Player, such as the background.

**NOTE:** Please rest the mouse pointer a few seconds on an active topic to find out more about it.

# File menu

## **Preferences...**

Brings up the Preferences dialog

## **Exit**

Ends your Multimedia Player session

# Audio menu



## **Play file from filelist**

Plays the selected file in the filelist



## **Play file from playlist**

Plays the selected file in the playlist



## **Pause**

Pauses / unpauses the current file



## **Stop**

Stops playing the current file



## **Rewind**

Plays the current file from the beginning



## **Next**

Plays the next file or the next randomly selected file



## **Previous**

Plays the previous file or the next randomly selected file

## **Loop**

Continuously plays the current file



## **Mixer**

Starts the mixer application specified in the Preferences dialog

# Album menu

## **New**

Creates a new album. The program warns you if you have unsaved changes in a previous album

## **Open**

Brings up an open dialog box which enables you to open a Multimedia Player album file

## **Save**

Saves the current file

## **Save As...**

Saves the current file under a new name

## **Delete...**

Deletes the current album

## **Sort Alphabetically**

Sorts the current album in alphabetical order

## **Move Up**

Moves the selected file in the playlist one step up

## **Move Down**

Moves the selected file in the playlist one step down

# Help menu

## **Contents...**

Brings up this help file

## **About...**

Brings up a dialog box where you among other things can find the version number and copyright information



# Uninstalling The Multimedia Player

The Multimedia Player is very easy to uninstall. Simply remove all the files in your Multimedia Player directory. This program stores its setup information in a private .INI file, located in The Multimedia Player directory. This program does not overwrite any system DLLs or change your registry (if you are a Windows 95 user).

The Multimedia Player is distributed as ShareWare. No warranty exists, either expressed or implied. No liability is assumed for any damage or loss resulting from the use of this program.

# Registering The Multimedia Player

The Multimedia Player is distributed under the ShareWare concept. This means that you may try this software before you buy it. You may evaluate this program for 30 days. If you would like to use The Multimedia Player beyond that time, you **MUST** register.

You will receive a registration code (based on your name) by regular mail or by e-mail upon registering. This code will "unlock" the program, which will enable you to enter the program without having to wait 20 seconds. This registration code that you will receive will work with **ALL** future versions of the Multimedia Player.
