Quick Start Instructions:

- 1) Start Windows.
- 2) From Program Manager choose File and then Run.
- 3) On the Command Line Type D:\setup.exe
(replace D with the appropriate CD Drive letter).
- 4) Install QuickTime for Windows

Installing QuickTime for Windows:

- 1) Open the Swimwear Illustrated Interactive group window from within Program Manager.
- 2) Double click on the icon for QuickTime Setup.
- 3) Follow the prompts.
- 4) In instances where the QuickTime installer finds older versions of QuickTime on your system, only replace the files that it finds in your Windows\System directory.

You must install QuickTime for Windows for this CD to work properly. The movies on the CD are in the QuickTime format and require QuickTime in order to play.

Instructions for Using the Interface:

Directional controls:



Next Screen Button:

Click on the button at the top of the panel to go to the next screen.



Previous Menu Button:

Click on the second button to go to the previous menu.



Return Button:

Click on the third button to go to the main menu.



Quit Button:

Click on the fourth button to quit the program.

Morphs:



The directional controls do not auto-highlight during the morphs but are fully operable. This is done to optimize the performance of the morphs. Click on the left image to play the morph the slowest. Click on the middle image to pause the morph. Click and hold the mouse button to continue to pause the morph. Click on the right image to play the morph the fastest.

Movies:

SWI features digital video associated with each model in the model profile section. Below the television screen you will see three buttons. Click on the left button to play the movie. Click on the middle button to stop the movie. If a movie is playing, you must click on the stop button in order to proceed to another section. Click and hold down the mouse button on the control on the right to pause the movie.

ScreenSaver Quick Start Instructions:

- 1) Start Windows.
- 2) From "Program Manager" choose File and then Run.

CD ROM Installation --

3) On the Command Line Type "x:\scrnsavr\disk1\install.exe"
(Replace "x"
with the appropriate CD-ROM drive letter).

Floppy Drive Installation (ScreenSaver needs to be copied to floppy
disk first - see below) --

3a) On the Command Line Type "x:\install.exe" (Replace "x" with the
appropriate floppy drive letter).

*** If installing from CD, the installer program will prompt you to
install disk 2
of the ScreenSaver set. This is a normal occurrence and you can
bypass this
by changing the number 1 to 2 (for example, change "x:\scrnsavr\
disk1\ to
"x:\scrnsavr\disk2\). The rest of the procedure will then be
completed.

Also, you may copy the contents of disk 1 and 2 over to a floppy
disk.

***Copying ScreenSaver to floppy disks:

- 1) Launch File Manager from the Main group.
- 2) Log onto your CD ROM drive (click on appropriate drive letter icon
on tool
bar).
- 3) Change directories over to SCRNSAVER\DISK1 by double clicking
on the
subdirectories located on the left-hand side of File Manager.
- 4) Highlight all files within the current subdirectories by clicking
once on the
first file and then click on the last file while holding down the shift
key. (This
will highlight all the files at once.)
- 5) Drag all the files over to the floppy drive icon by clicking the
mouse button
down and holding it down. DO NOT LET GO OF THE MOUSE

UNTIL YOU DRAG THE FILES TO THE FLOPPY DRIVE YOU WANT TO

COPY THE FILES TO (a plus sign will appear in a little box next to the mouse cursor when the operation can be completed.).

6) Do the same for disk 2.

MINIMUM SYSTEM REQUIREMENTS:

486SX 25 MHz or better with 8 megabytes of RAM.

Double speed CD-ROM drive or faster.

256 color VGA card with 512K RAM.

8 bit sound card.

DOS 5.0 (6.0 recommended).

Windows 3.1 or later with a 256 color driver installed. SWI is compatible with the latest release of Windows 95.

INSTALLING 256 COLOR DRIVERS:

If you don't know how to install the 256 color driver for windows here is some information. (This is for the drivers that came with your video card).

1. Go to the "Main" Program Manager icon and open it.
2. Click on "Windows Setup."
3. Pull down the options menu and select "Change System Settings."
4. Click the arrow on the "Display" menu.
5. Scroll down to the bottom of the list and select "Other" (OEM).
6. Place the video driver floppy disk that came with your video card in

your floppy drive, and enter the path where the disk can be found on the command line.

7. Once drivers have been copied to the Windows directory go back to the list of drivers on the "Display" menu scroll bar and select the 256 color driver that came with your video card. Restart Windows so that the driver can be loaded.

8. If you're having a problem, call the manufacturer of your video for assistance.

The general information above is the best information that we can provide regarding video. Specific questions about driver settings can be best answered by the manufacturer of your particular card.

Known compatibility problems:

Many CD-ROM discs are created with Macromedia Director which is not supported by a certain line of Cirrus Logic video cards. Cirrus Logic video cards that use the 5422 through 5428 chipsets combined with the 1.42 or 1.43 video drivers can cause problems with CD-ROMs created with Director. Error messages can range from "Call to Undefined Dynalink," "GPF: SWIXXX caused a General Protection Fault in Module SWIXXX," "Cannot Read From Drive X," or others. Most manufacturers, such as Packard Bell, Gateway 2000, and "high end" clones use these cards in their computers. To find out if you fall into this category, you can run Microsoft's' Diagnostic utility to get your system configuration. To run the program, it would be best to exit to DOS and type in "MSD" at the C: prompt. This will give you information on your video card and drivers being used. If you have an outdated driver, you should be able to download it from their BBS at 510-440-9080, or you can contact Cirrus Logic directly at 510-623-8300.
