The anti-virus programs listed in the Known Removal Methods column are Dr. Solomon's Anti-Virus Toolkit 7, F-Prot 2.16,				
McAfee's VirusScan 2.1, and Symantec's Norton Anti-Virus 3.0.				
These four are the most popular anti-virus programs presently being used, not counting the anti-virus program already				
contained in MS-D	OOS 6.xx.			
They are by no means a comprehensive list, however. If you contract any of the listed viruses, try the latest				
version of your favorite anti-virus program before running out and buying a new one you never know.
