## File Formats and Compatibility

PhotoLib® images on this disk are stored in JPEG (Joint Photographics Expert Group) compressed format.

You can read or place the JPEG image files directly in any desktop publishing program or image processing supporting the JPEG file format. Ulead PhotoImpact is such a program.

For use with other software you may first have to convert the image file into the appropriate format such as TIFF by using the conversion facility of Ulead PhotoImpact Album. Or you could also use the Windows Copy and Paste facility.

- copy selected images to your hard disk for processing on the same computer

- install PhotoLib® on a second computer
- make a copy of any image for use on another computer
- manufacture products which are sold (for example a poster, a calendar, a book, a multimedia CD-ROM or similar). e.g. the final product which includes PhotoLib® images may not be sold.

## How to Use PhotoLib®

PhotoLib® images are stored in the directory SAMPLES\IMAGES.

All PhotoLib® images are cataloged in an image database in the Ulead PhotoImpact Album program (in the PhotoImpact 3 Images and PhotoImpact 3 Textures albums). The albums are in the directory SAMPLES\ALBUMS.

### The PhotoLib® Catalog and Image Database - Overview and Structure

We have tried to provide you with extensive search capabilities by recording a large number of keywords. But we can only strive to improve without ever reaching perfection. Keywords are recorded in the image description in the albums. Additional information about images (Copyright, Photographer, Originator,

Description, Usage Code and Order Code) are recorded in Windows Cardfiles (CRD extension) in the SAMPLES\CARDFILE directory.

Your comments on how to improve the image database are very much welcome.

### **Origin Keyword**

In the Ulead PhotoImpact 3 samples only images with the KAG keyword, i.e. the Kagemas copyright, are provided. Images from the other sources are available direct from Kagemas AG.

You can order PhotoLib® high-resolution images on Special Theme CDs. These are identified with the following keywords:

### **Keywords**

Other keywords describe the image content and related (associative) words. Dominating colors are added as keywords. Images with portrait orientation contain the keyword "vertical". Landscape oriented images are not identified by a special keyword.

### **PhotoLib® File Structure**

PhotoLib® Images are stored in the SAMPLES\IMAGES directory.

Image file names are structured as follows:

aaaannnA.JPG These images can be ordered individually in high-resolution format. aaaannn is the order number.

Using the Windows File Manager double-click on the desired CRD file. Or start the Windows Cardfile and OPEN the desired CRD file. The Microsoft Windows User Manual contains detailed user instructions for Cardfile.

### **Converting Images into other Formats**

You can import PhotoLib® Images directly into programs supporting the JPEG format. Ulead PhotoImpact is such a program. Other programs can read for example the BMP format. You can use Ulead PhotoImpact Album to convert the image into another file format.

#### **You can also use copy and paste into other applications.**

Using the clipboard you can also copy parts of an image. Once you found an image display it by double-clicking it's thumbnail. Using the mouse you can draw a rectangular selection on screen which you can copy to the Clipboard. You can paste this selection into most other applications.

**WARNING!** Once you have decompressed a PhotoLib® Image do not compress it again. JPEG is "lossy compression". Each successive time the image is compressed and decompressed information will be lost and the image will deteriorate. Always start processing from the original PhotoLib® file.
