Playing The Game

The object of Bible Memory is to get the highest score possible. The more spiritual you are, the more points you score!

To Start a New Game:

From the Game menu, choose New, or press F2.

To Answer a Question:

Click on the button displaying the answer you think is correct.

To Display Another a Question:

Click on the Next Question button or press Enter.

Rules Of The Game

Each player's turn consists of answering one question. A player must select a correct answer and press New Question to be awarded a score. A player forfeits his/her turn by pressing the New Question button before selecting an answer.

With more than one player, play alternates until the game is over. Player names are displayed at the bottom of the game window, denoting which player is up.

Scoring

Points are awarded for each correct answer as follows:

Non-timed Game:

- 0 + seconds 50 points

Timed Game:

- 0 - 3 seconds 150 points
- 4 - 6 seconds 100 points
- 7 - 9 seconds 50 points
- 10 + seconds 25 points

Strategy And Hints

This section contains helpful hints for playing Bible Memory successfully.

With the goal of achieving the highest score possible, the best strategy to use in Bible Memory is to maximize the number of questions answered correctly. To accomplish this, you should study your bible (II Timothy 2:15) on a daily basis (Acts 17:11).

Reasons why we should study the bible:

- It is commanded (II Timothy 2:15 & I Peter 3:15)
- It is inspired of God (II Timothy 3:16)
- It is necessary for faith (Romans 10:17)
- To keep us from sin (Psalms 119:9)
- To sanctify or set us apart (John 17:17)
- It is necessary for spiritual growth (Matthew 4:4 & II Corinthians 4:16)
- It symbolizes God (I Corinthians 5:7-8)
- God's word is necessary for life (John 6:63)

Toolbar

Game Menu Commands

New

Starts a new game of Bible Memory.

High Scores

Displays the Bible Memory High Scores table.

Exit

Exits the application.

You can exit at any time, even in the middle of a game.

Options Menu Commands

Colors

Lets you choose Window and Text colors.

Players

Lets you choose how many players (between 1 and 10) and player names.

Testament

Lets you choose which testament to use (i.e. Both, New, or Old).

Timed Game

Lets you choose whether to play a timed or non-timed game.

Tools Menu Commands

Compact Database

Over time, you'll find that the game database file may grow substantially, based on the amount of data added and deleted. You can use Compact Database to organize the data in the database contiguously so that disk space can be recovered.

Repair Database

If the game database is damaged, you can use Repair Database. This will validate a database that was left invalid by an incomplete data page read/write operation. This kind of corruption can occur when the system isn't shut down normally (such as a power failure). Repair Database method can't fix all possible forms of database corruption, so you should keep a back up your game files to avoid unrecoverable data loss.
