Thank you for trying BOING!, the sound button. BOING! is being distributed as Shareware. It is my hope that you find BOING! useful/fun, and that you register your copy of the program. This screen is there just to remind you that the program is Shareware and that use beyond the evaluation period requires that you register with me, the author. Registered users of BOING! will receive a registration number that will disable the reminder and a bonus disk with over fifty WAV files.

BOING! is a program for the Microsoft® Windows™ operating system that will allow you to play sound files (WAV format) with the click of a mouse button. The neat thing about BOING! is that it sits as an icon on your desk top, or on top of other windows, and when you click on it with your right button the sound file that you indicated will play. And since you click it with the right button, the application that you have active does not become inactive. You can run multiple copies of BOING! so you can have lots of sounds just a click away. Be just like those wacky morning radio DJs with crazy sounds livening up your conversations. If you have a sound card, or even just the pc-speaker driver, you'll love BOING!.

The purpose of this help file is to provide you the information necessary for you to make full use of this program, and to tell you about the other programs available from Bob's Software. Please go through the rest of this on-line document to find out more about BOING!, and the other programs available from Bob's Software. Single Click Playing of Sound Files

BOING! allows you to play sound files with a single click of your mouse button. When BOING! is <u>minimized</u> use the right button. When BOING! is <u>full sized</u>, press the "Play Sound" button.

Program Manager Command Line

You can specify the name of a sound file by using the Program Manager command line parameter. The parameter is entered after "BOING.EXE" in the "Command Line" entry in the program manager "Run" dialog box of the "Program Item Properties" dialog box. Use the file's full path when specifying a file name (i.e. "C:\WINDOWS\CHIMES.WAV" instead of "CHIMES.WAV").

Saving of Option Settings

BOING! saves your settings for the "Always on Top" and "Play when opened/dropped" features in the private initialization file - $\underline{BOING.INI}$.

Always on Top

When this menu item or check box is checked, BOING! will display on top of other windows, even when BOING! is inactive or <u>minimized</u>. This allows you to have BOING! stay visible at all times. The check status of this option is saved when you exit the program in the file <u>BOING.INI</u>.

Drag and Drop

Drag and drop allows you to select a sound file in File Manager and drag it to the BOING! window and drop it. That file will now be the <u>current wav</u> file. Drag and drop will work if BOING! is <u>minimized</u> or <u>full size</u>.

Other files, BBS/disk vendor advertising, etc., may have been added, but all of the above files should be there.

BOING.TXT

This is a text file containing basic information about BOING!.

FILE_ID.DIZThis is a description file used by some BBSs.

DESC.SDI

This is a description file used by some BBSs.

VENDOR.TXT

This is a text file that contains information for <u>Shareware</u> distributors and disk vendors. The same information can be found in the <u>Vendor Information</u> section of this online document.

VENDINFO.DIZ

The vendinfo file format allows the author to communicate a great deal of product and distribution policy information to shareware distributors. Distributors can then automate distribution rights testing and information extraction. The VENDINFO.DIZ file contains a normal, "human-readable" section, followed by a compressed data record.

Installation

BOING! is very easy to install. Copy the files <u>BOING.EXE</u> and <u>BOING.HLP</u> to any directory on your hard disk. Be sure to copy both files into the same directory. After copying the files, add BOING! to a Program Manager Group. Please refer to your Windows^{M} documentation on how to add a program to a Program Manager group.

BOING.EXE

This file contains the BOING! program.

BOING.HLP

This is this help file.

De-Installation - Removing BOING! From Your System

If during, or at the end of, the <u>evaluation period</u> you decide that you do not wish to <u>register</u> BOING!, you must remove it from your computer. To remove BOING! do the following:

- 1. Make sure that BOING! is not running.
- 2. Remove any Program Manager entries you made for BOING!.
- 3. Delete the following files: <u>BOING.EXE</u>, <u>BOING.HLP</u>, and <u>BOING.INI</u>.

BOING! does not make any entries in your WIN.INI or SYSTEM.INI files.

BOING.INI

BOING.INI is the private initialization file BOING!. More...

Evaluation Period

The evaluation period is the time that you can try the program without registering with the author. The evaluation period for BOING! is 30 Earth days.



BOING.INI is the private initialization file for BOING!. This file lives in your Windows™ directory. BOING! uses this file to save your settings from session to session. Your BOING.INI should look something like this:

If this file is deleted, your settings will be lost and default settings will be used. The file will be recreated when you close BOING! If you had registered BOING! you will need to re-enter your name and registration number. If you lost your registration number, <u>contact</u> me and I will send it to you again.

AlwaysOnTop=1
This entry saves the state of the <u>"Always On Top"</u> menu item and option check box. A "1" indicates that "Always on Top" is checked. A "0" would mean that it is unchecked.

DropPlay=1

This entry saves the state of "Play when opened/ \underline{d} ropped" check box. A "1" indicates that "Play when opened/ \underline{d} ropped" is checked. A "0" would mean that it is unchecked. If this is check, the sound file will play when dropped (see \underline{D} rag and \underline{D} rop) or when it is opened.

Registration=X#0%*()+\$#0[{+=

This entry saves your registration number after you have registered. Each time that you start BOING! it will check to see if a valid registration number is in this entry. Please keep your registration number in a safe place in case BOING.INI is deleted or damaged. If you do lose your registration number contact me and I will send it to you again.

Name=Joe User

This entry records your name when you register.

Known Bugs and Limitations

BOING! uses the Windows $^{\mathsf{M}}$ sndPlaySound() function. This function loads the sound into memory before playing it, so, if the sound file is very large it may not fit in available memory.

If the sound file is invalid, or if the playing of the sound failed for some reason, BOING! will sound the default beep for your system when you try to play the file. There is no visible error message.

BOING!'S Main Window



The BOING! window displays the name of the current sound file, allows you to play that file, and select options.

Click on any item when the mouse pointer looks like this: $^{\begin{subarray}{c}\begin{s$

Allway On TopToggles the Allways On Top feature. More...

Current wav file:The name of the currently selected wav file is displayed here, and, when BOING! is minimized as the window title.

Clicking on this picture will do nothing.

Play when opened/droppedWhen this is checked the sound will play when the file is opened, or dropped from File Manager. This setting is saved in the private initialization file <u>BOING.INI</u>.

Play SoundThis button will play the current sound file.

Stop SoundThis button will stop the currently playing sound.

Minimized BOING! Window

The minimized BOING! window will be displayed when the program is started.



You don't need BOING!'s main window unless you want to change the "Play when opened/<u>d</u>ropped" option. The minimized BOING! window is a button for playing the selected sound file. Click on the button with the right mouse button to play the sound. Clicking with the left button will activate the system menu, like most Windows™ programs.

You can select a file by dragging it from File Manager and dropping it on the BOING! window.

After you register (send me \$10) you will receive your registration number. Enter your name and registration number in the registration dialog box and the next time that you start BOING! the About box will be changed, and the reminder screen will be suppressed. If you enter an invalid registration number, or do not enter a registration number, you will need to press "Cancel" to close the dialog box.

What is Shareware?




