When **PowerCD** is loaded, the Feature Presentation automatically begins to play. It is a forty-five to ninety minute continuous <u>multimedia</u> program that allows you to explore the subject at your own pace and in the manner you choose. To pause the Feature Presentation, select the Pause Button located in the lower left corner of the screen. To continue playing the Feature Presentation, select the Play Button located next to the Pause Button.

In addition to the Feature Presentation, *PowerCD* contains a Presentation, Text, View, Question, and Quiz <u>mode</u>. Presentation mode contains other multimedia presentations that provide topical, in-depth studies of the material; these are not automatically played when *PowerCD* is loaded. Text mode contains numerous documents that provide information supplemental to what is found in the Feature Presentation and Presentation modes. View mode is a collection of selected views and corresponding audio captions (found in certain *PowerCD* titles) and can be played in an automatic sequence. Questions relating to the subject of the <u>title</u> can be found in Question mode, which help you reinforce what you have learned. If you would like to review your comprehension and test your knowledge of the subject, timed guizzes may be taken in Quiz mode.








Provided below is a view of View \underline{mode} . You can \underline{click} on any part of this $\underline{graphic}$ for a description of the selection and its $\underline{function}$.




Provided below is a view of Question <u>mode</u>. You can <u>click</u> on any part of this <u>graphic</u> for a description of the selection and its <u>function</u>.







File Menu

This is the File Menu. It contains the Save As, Print, Printer Setup, Save Positions, and Exit commands. In Feature Presentation mode, these commands allow you to save the current Feature Presentation document text to a file; print the text; set up printer options; save your current positions in all the modes except Quiz mode; and exit **PowerCD**.

Edit Menu

This is the Edit Menu. It contains the Copy and Find Word commands. In Feature Presentation mode, these commands allow you to copy the current Feature Presentation text to the Clipboard and find any word (excluding common words such as "or" and "the") within Feature Presentation, Presentation, and/or Text mode.

GoTo Menu

This is the GoTo Menu. It contains the Previous, Find Page, Learning Center, Feature, Presentation, Text, View, and Question commands. In Feature Presentation mode, these commands allow you to return to a previous document within **PowerCD**; find a page within the current Feature Presentation document; receive support and information on **PowerCD**; and go to Presentation, Text, View, and Question modes.

Contents Menu

This is the Contents Menu. It contains the Feature, Presentation, Text, View, Question, and Quiz commands. In Feature Presentation mode, these commands allow you to display the Feature Presentation, Presentation, Text, View, Question, and Quiz Table of Contents.

Reference Menu

This is the Reference Menu. It contains the Main Index, Local Index, Glossary, Show Reference, Open Dictionary, Review Quiz Results, Show History, and Show Answers commands. In Feature Presentation mode, these commands allow you to display the Main Index, Local Index, Glossary List, and Reference List; open the dictionary; review your last quiz results; show where you've been in **PowerCD**; and show possible answers to the current question. Please note that the Show Answers command only applies to Question and Quiz modes, and the Review Quiz Results command will not perform any function unless a quiz has been taken.

Controls Menu

This is the Controls Menu. It contains the Page Up, Page Down, Next Question, Pause, and End Quiz commands. In Feature Presentation mode, these commands allow you to page up and down, go to the next question, pause the Feature Presentation, and end a quiz. Please note that the Next Question command only applies to Question and Quiz modes, and the End Quiz command is only available in Quiz mode when a quiz is currently underway.

Help Menu

This is the Help Menu. It contains the **PowerCD** Help, About, and Copyright commands. These commands allow you to receive help in using this title, display information about this software, and display the copyright for this title.

Document BarThis is the Document Bar. It displays the name and duration of the Feature Presentation document that you are currently in.

Document DisplayThis is the Document Display. This is where the documents in Feature Presentation mode are displayed.

Pause Button
This is the Pause Button. Select it to pause the Feature Presentation.

Play Button
This is the Play Button. Select it to play or continue the Feature Presentation.

Mode DisplayThis is the Mode Display. It displays the mode (in this case, Feature Presentation) and document that you are currently in.

Time DisplayThis is the Time Display. It displays how long you have been in the current Feature Presentation document.

Main Index Button
This is the Main Index Button. Select it to display the Main Index.

Find Word Button

This is the Find Word Button. Select it to find any word (excluding common words such as "or" and "the") within Feature Presentation, Presentation, and/or Text mode.

Open Dictionary ButtonThis is the Open Dictionary Button. Select it to open the dictionary.

<u>Backtrack Button</u>
This is the Backtrack Button. Select it to go to a previous document within *PowerCD*.

Learning Center ButtonThis is the Learning Center Button. Select it for information on other **PowerCD** titles, customer service, and technical support.

Status DisplayThis is the Status Display. It displays concise, context-sensitive help for the various buttons located at the bottom of the **PowerCD** window. Simply place your cursor over the button and read the display.

Page Up Button
This is the Page Up Button. Select it to move back a page within the current Feature Presentation document.

Page Down Button
This is the Page Down Button. Select it to move forward a page within the current Feature Presentation document.

Page DisplayThis is the Page Display. It displays the current page and the total number of pages that the current Feature Presentation document contains.

File Menu

This is the File Menu. It contains the Save As, Print, Printer Setup, Save Positions, and Exit commands. In Presentation mode, these commands allow you to save the current presentation text to a file, print the text, set up printer options, save your current positions in all the modes except Quiz mode; and exit **PowerCD**.

Edit Menu

This is the Edit Menu. It contains the Copy and Find Word commands. In Presentation mode, these commands allow you to copy the current presentation text to the Clipboard and find any word (excluding common words such as "or" and "the") within Feature Presentation, Presentation, and/or Text mode.

GoTo Menu

This is the GoTo Menu. It contains the Previous, Find Page, Learning Center, Feature, Presentation, Text, View, and Question commands. In Presentation mode, these commands allow you to return to a previous document within **PowerCD**; find a page within the current presentation; receive support and information on **PowerCD**; and go to Feature Presentation, Text, View, and Question modes.

Contents Menu

This is the Contents Menu. It contains the Feature, Presentation, Text, View, Question, and Quiz commands. In Presentation mode, these commands allow you to display the Feature Presentation, Presentation, Text, View, Question, and Quiz Table of Contents.

Reference Menu

This is the Reference Menu. It contains the Main Index, Local Index, Glossary, Show Reference, Open Dictionary, Review Quiz Results, Show History, and Show Answers commands. In Presentation mode, these commands allow you to display the Main Index, Local Index, Glossary List, and Reference List; open the dictionary; review your last quiz results; show where you've been in **PowerCD**; and show possible answers to the current question. Please note that the Show Answers command only applies to Question and Quiz modes, and the Review Quiz Results command will not perform any function unless a quiz has been taken.

Controls Menu

This is the Controls Menu. It contains the Page Up, Page Down, Next Question, Pause, and End Quiz commands. In Presentation mode, these commands allow you to page up, page down, go to the next question, pause the presentation, and end a quiz. Every **PowerCD** comes with a full <u>hypertext</u> glossary. This glossary lists terms that are helpful in understanding and learning the material contained in the <u>title</u>. These terms appear throughout **PowerCD** as <u>green text</u>, which can be selected with your mouse to display an explanation. To display an explanation:

▶ <u>Select</u> the green glossary term

Or


- 1) Choose Glossary from the Reference Menu or use the Ctrl+G key combination.
- 2) Select one of the terms in the <u>Glossary List</u> or type the word and select the OK Button or press Return.

To browse all of the explanations in the glossary:

- ▶ Select the Page Up or Page Down Button in the Glossary Dialog Box.
- ▶ Press the Page Up or Page Down Button.



This is the Glossary List. To display it, $\underline{\text{choose}}$ the Glossary $\underline{\text{command}}$ from the Reference Menu or use the Ctrl+G $\underline{\text{key combination}}$. $\underline{\text{Click}}$ on any part of the $\underline{\text{graphic}}$ for a further explanation.



Control Menu Box
This is the Control Menu Box. It is a standard feature of Windows. Click on it once to open the Control Menu, which you can then use to move or close the Glossary List. You can also double-click on the Control Menu Box to close the Glossary List.

Glossary List
This is the Glossary List. To display an explanation for one of the entries, select it.

Entry WindowThis is the currently highlighted entry in the Glossary List.

OK ButtonThis is the OK Button. Select it to display the currently highlighted entry in the Glossary List.

Cancel Button
This is the Cancel Button. Select it to close the Glossary List.

scroll barThis is the scroll bar. Click on either of the arrow buttons or on the bar itself to move up and down the Glossary List.



Every **PowerCD** is fully indexed, which allows you to search for specific topics quickly and easily. All the documents in the $\underline{\text{title}}$ are listed and can be accessed through the various indexes. To display the $\underline{\text{Main Index}}$:

- Choose Main Index from the Reference Menu.
- ■Use the Ctrl+I key combination.
- Select the Main Index Button located at the bottom of the **PowerCD** window.

Using an index:

- Select one of the entries to go to it.
- Select the Previous Button to return to a previous index.
- Select the Main Button to return to the Main Index.
- Select the History Button located at the bottom right corner of index to find out which indexes you have covered while in the current **PowerCD** session.
- Select the Printer Button to print the contents of an index.
- Select the Cancel Button or press the Escape key to <u>close</u> an index.


In addition to the Main Index, some documents within **PowerCD** may contain their own Local Index. To display this index:

- **■** Choose Local Index from the Reference Menu.
- Use the Ctrl+L key combination.

When a Local Index does not exist for the current $\underline{document}$, the last index you were last in will be displayed.



This is the Main Index. To display it, choose Main Index from the Reference Menu, use the Ctrl+I <u>key combination</u>, or <u>select</u> the Main Index button located at the bottom of the **PowerCD** <u>window</u>. <u>Click</u> on any part of the <u>graphic</u> for a further explanation.





References are documents in **PowerCD** that are related to the current <u>document</u> or page. These references can include questions, enlarged views, entries from an encyclopedia, or an index of related items. These references appear as blue text throughout **PowerCD** and can be selected with your mouse. To go to one of these references:

Select the blue <u>reference</u> term.



- 1) Choose Show Reference from the Reference Menu.
- 2) Select one of the references from the Reference List.

To <u>close</u> the Reference List, select the Cancel Button or press the Escape key.



This is the Reference List. To display it, choose Show Reference from the Reference Menu. <u>Click</u> on any part of the <u>graphic</u> for a further explanation.



Control Menu Box

This is the Control Menu Box. It is a standard feature of Windows. Click on it once to open the Control Menu, which you can then use to move or close the Reference List. You can also double-click on the Control Menu Box to close the Reference List.

Reference List
This is the Reference List. To go to one of the references in this list, select it.

OK ButtonThis is the OK Button. Select it to go to the currently highlighted reference.

<u>Cancel Button</u>
This is the Cancel Button. Select it to close the Reference List.

scroll barThis is the scroll bar. Click on either one of the arrows or on the bar to move up and down the Reference List.



<u>Word Search</u> is a feature of **PowerCD** that locates occurrences of a word. In this <u>title</u>, you can search for any word (excluding such common words as "the" and "or") within Feature Presentation, Presentation, and/or Text mode. To do this:


- 1) Choose Find Word from the Edit Menu or use the Ctrl+F key combination.
- 2) Type the word you would like to search for in the Find Word Dialog Box.
- 3) Select which modes you would like to search in.

Using Word Search:

- Select the Find Next Button to go to the next occurrence of the word.
- Select the Find Previous Button to return to a previous occurrence of the word.
- Select the List All Button to list all the locations where the word was found.
- Select the OK Button to remain in one of the locations where the word was found. To return to your previous location from one of these locations, choose Previous from the GoTo Menu.
- Select the Cancel Button to cancel the search.



This is the Find Word Dialog Box. This dialog box is displayed after you have chosen Find Word from the GoTo Menu or used the Ctrl+F <u>key combination</u>. <u>Click</u> on any part of the <u>graphic</u> for a further explanation.



Control Menu Box
This is the Control Menu Box. It is a standard feature of Windows. Click on it once to open the Control Menu, which you can then use to move or close the Find Word Dialog Box. You can also double-click on the Control Menu Box to close the Find Word Dialog Box.

Entry WindowType the word you would like to search for here.

Select this box to search for the word in Feature Presentation mode.

Select this box to search for the word in Presentation mode.

Select this box to search for the word in Text mode.

Find Word Dialog BoxThis is the Find Word Dialog Box. Use this box to define and control the search you would like to perform.

Find Next ButtonThis is the Find Next Button. Select it to find the next occurrence of the word you were searching for.

Find Previous Button
This is the Find Previous Button. Select it to return to a previous occurrence of the word.

List All ButtonThis is the List All Button. Select it to list all the locations where the word was found. To go to one of these locations, select it.

OK ButtonThis is the OK Button. Select it to remain at one of the locations where the word was found.

<u>Cancel Button</u>
This is the Cancel Button. Select it to cancel the search.



Feature Presentation <u>mode</u> is the main <u>multimedia</u> program of **PowerCD** and automatically begins playing when you run **PowerCD**.

Consisting of selected documents containing text, audio, and images that are played in a pre-set order, Feature Presentation mode allows you to learn in an <u>interactive</u> and exciting way as you explore the material and shape the very way you learn.

To pause the Feature Presentation, \underline{select} the Pause Button located in the lower left corner of the **PowerCD** \underline{window} .



Presentation \underline{mode} contains selected presentations that are self-playing and which provide topical and in-depth discussions.

These presentations combine text, audio, and images to allow you to further explore the subject, as well as learn more about the **PowerCD** operating environment.



Text \underline{mode} houses volumes of information that complements and provides a background for the material found in Feature Presentation and Presentation mode.

<u>Choose</u> from the numerous text documents to explore specific topics, books, and writings that interest you. Everything you need is now just on one <u>CD-ROM!</u>

To change pages within Text mode, <u>select</u> the Page Up and Page Down Buttons located in the lower right corner of the **PowerCD** <u>window</u>.



View <u>mode</u> lets you view selected images that link to other modes. You can play these views and, on some titles, their corresponding audio captions in an automatic sequence, or just browse through them at your own pace.

This can be very useful for photographers and artists who are interested in studying the many photographs, paintings, and drawings found in **PowerCD** titles.

To pause or play this sequence and audio, <u>select</u> the Pause and Play Buttons located in the lower left corner of the **PowerCD** <u>window</u>.



Question <u>mode</u> includes several <u>interactive</u> questions about the <u>title</u> subject. These questions are a valuable asset in testing your knowledge of the material and for finding those areas in which further study is required.

To help you in your learning process, these questions are interactive and include full answers and explanations. It's like having your own personal tutor.



Quiz \underline{mode} contains several different randomized quizzes that cover all the subject areas of the \underline{title} material. These quizzes are timed and let you test yourself and your knowledge of the subject.

You can set the total time allowed for each quiz and the number of questions for each quiz, thus allowing you to adjust the quiz to your ability. Your complete quiz results are displayed in the Quiz Results <u>document</u>, which allows you to see how well you scored and return to those questions you missed.

To save the text of the current Feature Presentation document to a file:

- 1) Choose Save As from the File Menu or use the Ctrl+A key combination.
- 2) Type the pages you would like to save. (Please note that these are printer pages, which are approximately twice the length of **PowerCD** pages.)
- 3) Specify standard characteristics for the file, such as the $\underline{\text{filename}}$ and the $\underline{\text{directory}}$ in the Save As Dialog Box.

After the file has been saved, a dialog box will appear to confirm that it was saved.

To <u>print</u>, <u>copy</u>, or save a view while in Feature Presentation <u>mode</u>:

- 1) Enlarge the <u>view</u> by selecting the appropriate view from the Reference List. On some titles you can do this by selecting the Enlarge Photo Button.
- 2) Select the Printer Button located in the bottom right corner of the screen.
- 3) Select whether you would like to print, copy, or save the view and press Return or select the OK Button.

Please note that only the enlarged view will be printed, copied, or saved.

To <u>print</u> the text of the current Feature Presentation <u>document</u> directly from *PowerCD*:

- 1) Choose Print from the File Menu or use the Ctrl+P key combination.
- 2) Type the pages you would like to print and <u>select</u> the OK Button or press Return. (Please note that these are printer pages, which are approximately twice the length of **PowerCD** pages.)

While printing, a <u>dialog box</u> will appear to notify you of the status of the <u>print job</u> and to allow you to cancel it. After the print job has finished, a dialog box will appear to confirm that the pages were printed.

To set up your printer while in Feature Presentation mode:

- 1) Choose Printer Setup from the File Menu.
- 2) Specify the standard setup options you would like for printing in the Print Setup Dialog Box. You can choose the printer, the orientation of the printing, the paper size and source, and many other options.
- 3) <u>Select</u> the OK Button to save the settings so that the next time you <u>print</u>, the printer will be set up to your liking.

To save your current positions in all the modes except Quiz mode while in Feature Presentation mode:

- 1) Choose Save Positions from the File Menu.

This will bring up a <u>dialog box</u> asking whether you want to exit **PowerCD**. <u>Select</u> the Yes Button to exit and the No Button to remain in **PowerCD**.

To copy the text of the current Feature Presentation <u>document</u> to the Clipboard:

- 1) Choose Copy from the Edit Menu or use the Ctrl+C key combination.
- 2) Type the pages you would like to copy and <u>select</u> the OK Button or press Return. (Please note that these are printer pages, which are approximately twice the length of **PowerCD** pages.)

Using the Clipboard, you will then be able to <u>paste</u> the text into other applications.

You can search for any word (excluding such common words as "the" and "or") within Feature Presentation, Presentation, and/or Text <u>mode</u>. This can prove very useful in searching for information on a specific topic within **PowerCD**. To do this while in Feature Presentation mode:

- 1) Choose the Find Word command from the Edit Menu or use the Ctrl+F key combination.
- 2) Type the word you would like to search for in the Find Word Dialog Box.
- 3) <u>Select</u> the mode(s) to perform the search in by selecting the appropriate box(es).

You can then either:

- Select the Find Next Button to go to the next occurrence of the word.
- Select the Find Previous Button to go to the previous occurrence of the word.
- Select the List All Button to display a list of all the locations where the word was found. This will display the Search Results Dialog Box. From this dialog box you can then select which location you want to go to.

If you would like to remain at one of the locations where the word was found, select the OK Button. To return to your previous location:

- Choose Previous from the GoTo Menu.
- Select the Backtrack Button located at the bottom of the **PowerCD** window.
- Press the Backspace key.
- Choose Show History from the Reference Menu and select where you would like to return.

If you do not want to remain at any of the locations where the word was found, select the Cancel Button.

activeRefers to a window or program that is currently available to the user for performing certain functions and operations.

applicationA program that allows the user to perform certain tasks and functions not specifically related to the computer's operation.

arrow keysThe UpArrow, DownArrow, LeftArrow, and RightArrow keys on the keyboard which allow the user to move the insertion point or select from a list or index.

blue text

Hypertext references, which when selected take the user to a similar topic within the current or a related document. These references also may take the user to an index of related items. To display a list of these references for the current page, choose the Show Reference command from the Reference Menu.

<u>button</u> A graphic that when selected by the user will perform an action.

chooseThe action of selecting a command from a menu. This can be done by using your mouse or the keyboard.

 $\underline{\textbf{click}}$ The action of depressing the left or right mouse button to initiate some function on the computer.

<u>Clipboard</u>
A designated notepad where information copied from one application can be temporarily stored for use in other applications or the same application.

closeThe process of placing a window into a condition where the information is not readily available. Re-accessing the information from a window would require the window to be reopened.

command

An instruction given to the computer to perform a function. For example, the command Print tells the computer to print certain pages from the current document.

<u>command button</u>
A button that contains a Print, OK, Cancel, or Close command.

context-sensitive

An application is considered context-sensitive if, when a certain key is depressed, the Help for the current topic or function is displayed. For example, if a user was viewing the Printer Setup dialog box and pressed the Help button, the Help file would bring up information describing the Printer Setup function.

<u>copy</u> The process of duplicating selected text, an image, or a document into the Clipboard.

dialog boxA box that appears on the screen and that requests information. This information must be provided before the computer can perform other operations.

<u>directory</u> An area on a disk where a collection of files and documents can be stored.

documentA file that contains text and/or images. A document can be displayed in any mode.

double-clickThe process of quickly depressing the right or left mouse button twice in succession to initiate some function.

<u>document display</u>
The area on the screen where you may view a document.

fileA collection of related information stored on a disk. This allows the user and computer to organize data in an orderly fashion.

filenameThe name assigned to a file. The name can have up to eight characters with a three-character extension.

function

An operational instruction usually activated by a user's action. For example, clicking on the Open Dictionary button will initiate a function that opens the dictionary.

graphicA bit-mapped image displayed on a computer screen.

green textHypertext links to glossary terms. When you select a green glossary term, a dialog box containing an explanation for the word will be displayed.

hypertextHighlighted keywords, which when selected will perform some action. For example, when green text is selected, the corresponding explanation will be displayed.

<u>icon</u>

A small graphical image that represents an application. By selecting an icon, the application will be initiated.

 $\frac{\text{index}}{\text{A collection of topics or subjects organized in a list.}} \ \, \text{An example is the Main Index.}$

interactiveRefers to an exchange of information between the computer and the user.

key combinationTo press two or more keys together on the keyboard. For example, in order to execute the Ctrl+P key combination, press the Ctrl key, and while pressing it, press the P key.

<u>menu</u>

A list of options or commands in a program. For example, the File Menu contains the Save As, Print, Printer Setup, Save Positions, and Exit commands.

menu bar

A series of connected menus usually located at the top of the computer screen. The **PowerCD** menu bar contains the File, Edit, GoTo, Contents, Reference, Controls, and Help menus.

<u>mode</u>

Refers to the method of viewing documents in **PowerCD**. **PowerCD** has six modes: Feature, Presentation, View, Text, Question, and Quiz.

<u>multimedia</u>
Multimedia refers to the combination of text, audio, images, animation, and/or video in an application.

 $\underline{\text{\bf open}}$ The process of reactivating a window to access the information contained within it.

pageRefers to the information that can be displayed in the Document Display at one time.

page downThe action of advancing to the next sequential page in a document. The Page Down key on the keyboard can be used to initiate this action.

page upThe action of going to the previous page in a document. The Page Up key on the keyboard can be used to initiate this action.

pasteThe process of inserting cut or copied information into a document. The cut or copied item usually is held in the Clipboard.

presentation
A presentation in PowerCD is an interactive program that contains text, audio, and images.

 $\underline{\textbf{print}}$ The action of a computer sending information to a printer so that the information can be printed.

print jobThe actual collection of characters sent to the printer for printing. A print job usually is one document that may contain many pages.

 $\begin{tabular}{ll} \hline \textbf{quiz} \\ A short, timed examination to test your knowledge of the title subject. \\ \hline \end{tabular}$

<u>reference</u>
A document within *PowerCD* that is related to the current document or page.

scroll barA vertical or horizontal bar that appears at the bottom or on the side of a window. It can be used to pan through and view the contents of a window.

<u>select</u>

To click on something, such as hypertext (for instance, a green glossary term) or a button (for instance the OK Button); to double-click on an entry from a list (for instance, a term in the Glossary List); or to highlight an entry from a list and press return.

<u>shortcut key</u>
A unique combination of key strokes that initiates a menu command.

<u>software</u>

Computer programs that allow the computer hardware to perform functions. There are two basic kinds of software: system software and application software.

 $\begin{tabular}{ll} \underline{\textbf{title}}\\ \textbf{A CD-ROM that addresses a specific subject or group of subjects.} \end{tabular}$

 $\underline{\text{view}}$ An image that appears in the Document Display.

<u>window</u>

A graphical section of the computer screen that can contain its own document and messages. Usually, a window is capable of being enlarged, shrunk, maximized, or minimized. Several windows often can be open at the same time.

Word Search
A PowerCD feature that locates occurrences of a particular word.

Alt keyA special function key on the keyboard, which, when depressed in combination with another key, will enable some computer function.

Backspace keyA key on the keyboard usually denoted by a left-pointing arrow or the word "Backspace." When depressed, it will delete the character to the left of the cursor.

CD-ROM

An acronym for Compact Disk-Read-Only Memory. A CD-ROM is a media that is capable of storing hundreds of megabytes of information, and is similar to audio compact disks.

Control key

A special function key on the keyboard, which, when depressed in conjunction with another key, will initiate some computer function. For example, while in **PowerCD**, depressing the Ctrl-Shift-Home key combination displays the Feature Presentation Table of Contents.

End key

A key on the keyboard that is used to advance to the end of a document or list. For example, while in **PowerCD**, to view the last term in the Glossary List, you would press the End key.

Escape key

A software-dependent key on the keyboard that is usually used to exit a procedure or terminate some function. The Escape key in **PowerCD** is used to exit the program or a dialog box.

Enter keyA key on the keyboard (usually the largest) that is used to initiate a selected function.

Home keyA key on the keyboard that is used to return to the beginning of a document or list. For example, while in **PowerCD**, to view the first term in the Glossary List, you would press the Home key.

To execute a program.

Shift key

A special function key on the keyboard, which, when depressed in combination with another key(s) will enable some computer function. For example, while in **PowerCD**, depressing the Ctrl-Shift-Home key combination displays the Feature Presentation Table of Contents.
