The AT&T WorldNet Service Cybercathlon is a fully interactive video game comprised of eight Track and Field events. Through full-motion animation, it gives you a chance to test your skill in Olympic Games from Javelin to Pole Vault. As you complete each event your scores are recorded and posted automatically. Go for your personal best in each event!

And, of course the CD-ROM includes AT&T WorldNet Service software, which provides everything you need to become a service member. The QuickStart Guide, included in this package, provides complete system requirements and instructions for how to install the software. MINIMUM SYSTEM REQUIREMENTS

All of the software files on this CD-ROM have been designed to run exclusively on Microsoft (R) Windows (R) 95. [NOTE: It is NOT compatible with Windows 3.1 or Windows for Workgroups 3.11.]

To run only the AT&T WorldNet Service software, your PC must meet these minimum requirements:

- an IBM compatible 386SX computer (486 recommended)
- CD-ROM drive
- Microsoft Windows 95
- 8 MB of RAM (or more for better performance)
- 11 MB of available hard disk space
- 14,400 bps modem connected to an outside phone line

To run only the Olympic Games software, your PC must meet these minimum requirements:

- an IBM compatible 486 computer (Pentium recommended)
- a double-speed CD-ROM drive
- Microsoft Windows 95
- 8 MB of RAM (or more for better performance)
- 34 MB of available hard disk space
- VGA Card and monitor capable of displaying 256 colors

- a Sound Blaster (TM)-compatible audio card

To run ALL of the software on the CD-ROM, your PC must meet these minimum requirements:

- an IBM compatible 486 computer (Pentium recommended)
- a double-speed CD-ROM drive
- Microsoft Windows 95
- 8 MB of RAM (or more for better performance)
- 45 MB of available hard disk space
- VGA Card and monitor capable of displaying 256 colors
- a Sound Blaster (TM)-compatible audio card
- 14,400 bps modem connected to an outside phone line

HOW TO INSTALL THE SOFTWARE

To be prepared to run AT&T WorldNet Service software, make sure your modem is ready to go -- that it is turned on (if external) and configured for Windows 95. Once Windows 95 is running, close all open applications and folders, including 'Dial-Up Networking', on the desktop and taskbar.

[NOTE: Complete instructions for installing and using AT&T WorldNet Service software are provided in the QuickStart Guide.]

To begin the installation:

1. Insert the CD-ROM in your drive. Software installation begins automatically, click 'Next'.
2. To install the Olympic Games software in the recommended 'Destination Directory', click 'Next'. [NOTE: If you are installing the AT&T WorldNet Service software, you may change the recommended directory later.]
3. If you choose, you may install all of the software on the CD-ROM at this point. Select the software modules you want to install, then click 'Next'. [NOTE: If you do not install AT&T WorldNet Service software at this time, you may install it from the AT&T WorldNet Service section of the virtual reality foyer later.]
4. Click 'OK', then 'Install' to install the QuickTime(TM) for Windows drivers.
5. When prompted, select 'Yes, I want to restart my computer now', then click 'OK'.
6. After Windows 95 has been restarted, double-click the 'AT&T WorldNet Service CD' icon on your Windows 95 desktop to run the Olympic Games CD-ROM.

HOW TO REMOVE THE OLYMPIC GAMES SOFTWARE

To remove the Olympic Museum tour and Cybercathlon game files from your PC --

1. Click 'Start' on the Windows 95 taskbar.
2. Select 'Programs'.
3. Select 'AT&T WorldNet Olympic CD-ROM'.
4. Select 'Uninstall Olympic Games CD'.
