Preview

Kudo maintains a link between the thumbnail image in the catalog and the original file. While in Kudo use the Preview option to preview the original image file in a full-sized window.

1. Select the thumbnail you wish to preview.
2. Choose Preview from the Image menu.
3. Kudo will find the original image file and display it in a full-sized window.
4. Double-click the Control menu to exit the preview.

To preview other image files, simply click their thumbnails while the Preview window is open.

Note: Kudo can not preview files stored on removable media (i.e. floppy disks, removable cartridges, etc.). If the file is not present in your system, Kudo will ask you to insert the correct disk.

Drag and Drop Images from Kudo

There are three methods for placing an image from a Kudo catalog into a document:

- Drag and Drop.
- Copy and Paste.
- You can also, of course, note the file name and location and use it to insert the image from within the target application.

Kudo takes advantage of Windows technology (DDE and OLE 2.0) which allows you to Drag and Drop images onto all popular graphics applications. Drag and Drop from your Kudo catalog to an open document will find the original image file and place it in the document of selected desktop publishing and other page layout applications, with pinpoint accuracy.

To Drag and Drop a thumbnail to an open document:

1. Select the thumbnail.
2. Hold down the mouse button and drag it to the open document.

Note: Pinpoint accuracy requires an OLE 2.0 client application or a special Kudo Place Module. Place Modules are included for MS Word, PageMaker, QuarkXPress, and Word Perfect.

Note: The Place Module for the application you are using must be installed in the Kudo directory. The format of the file being placed must be supported by that application. The cursor will indicate a plus (+) or a document symbol (q) if the target application supports the file being placed and the "not cursor (!)" if the target application does not.

Note: For Microsoft Word users, Word will indicate that you can drop the image only when the cursor is over the Word application tool bar or the status bar (along the bottom of the window). When the image is dropped, it will be inserted at the exact location of the Word "I-beam" (insertion point). Release the mouse button and Kudo will find the image file and place it into the document.

Sorting

When you open a catalog, Kudo lists the thumbnails according to when they were added to the catalog. Use the Sort menu to list the thumbnails by file size, date or even location. For example, sort by "Modification Date" to see which image files have been recently updated or sort by "Kind" to group images by file type. You can sort the catalog using the same criteria found in the [Find feature](#).

Sort and Find use the same criteria but they affect the catalog differently. With Find you use the criteria to determine which thumbnails Kudo should display and which it should hide from view. With Sort you re-arrange the thumbnails that are displayed.

When you close and re-open the catalog, Kudo shows all the thumbnails in their original order.

To sort your catalog:

1. Select sorting criteria from the Sort menu.
2. Kudo will automatically re-arrange the thumbnails and display them in their new order.

Printing Your Catalog

Use the standard [Printer Setup](#) and Print commands to print part or all of your catalog. The Print feature always prints the current selection of thumbnails. For example, to print all thumbnails in a catalog, use [Find All](#) to find "everything" (the default), and then select print from the File menu.

To print thumbnails with file name and size only, select [Gallery View](#) prior to printing your catalog. Printing a catalog in Gallery View prints the maximum number of thumbnails per page. To print thumbnails with complete information, including file location, select [List View](#) and then print the catalog. Printing a catalog in List View provides more text information on images but prints fewer thumbnails on each page.

Using Copy and Paste

You will be able to drag and drop images to all leading graphics applications. They all support Windows Drop-onto, and for pinpoint accuracy, many even offer OLE 2.0 (client) support. For other applications and older Windows 2.x applications that do not have these capabilities, you can still place an image using copy and paste.

To use Copy and Paste:

1. Select the thumbnail image.
2. Choose "Copy Thumbnail" under the Edit menu.
3. Kudo will find the original image file and copy it to the clipboard.
4. Open the target document.
5. Choose "Paste" under the Edit menu of the target document.
6. Your target application will paste the image onto the document page.

Note: When you use copy, the entire original image file is placed on the clipboard. Be sure you have enough RAM to support this action.

Sort Menu

- Name - Sorts thumbnails by their eight character file name
- Size - Sorts thumbnails by the size of the actual image size
- Kind - Alphabetically groups thumbnails by their image type (extension)
- Date - Sorts thumbnails by the date the image file was Last modified
- Location - Sorts thumbnails by the image file's location pathname
- Notes - Sorts thumbnails by the first word in the Notes Box

Window Menu

- Cascade - Displays open catalogs in standard Windows Cascade view
- Tile - Displays open catalogs in standard Windows Tile view
- Arrange Icons - Organizes all iconized catalogs in the Kudo window
- Close All - Closes all catalogs open and returns to Kudo window

Print Setup

Print Setup, as in most Windows applications, gives options to select available printers and change their options.

Exit

The Exit command closes and saves all open catalogs then closes Kudo.

Get Info

Get Info gives you quick access to a thumbnail's information. This option tells you the file kind, volume, size and any notes you have attached to the thumbnail.

To display a thumbnail's information:

1. Select a thumbnail.
2. Select "Image-Get Info"
3. Kudo will display the information in a floating window.

You can also display the Info Window using the Info Button. When the Info window is open, click other thumbnails to display their information. Close the window by double-clicking on the window's Control menu.

Find

Use the Find feature to search the catalog for thumbnails with specific characteristics. Kudo searches the catalog and displays the thumbnails that were identified in the search. All other thumbnails are hidden from view.

For example, if you search the catalog's notes for a client name, Kudo only displays the thumbnails with that information only. Kudo does not delete or edit the remaining thumbnails; it just hides them from view. To return to the full catalog, use Find to search the catalog for "Everything" or select "Find-All" from the "Image" pull-down menu.

When you select the Find feature, Kudo displays the Find Image dialog box.

- Use the first combo box to tell Kudo the thumbnail characteristic it should search. You can search by name, size, date modified, notes or location.
- Use the next combo box menu to tell Kudo how to search the catalog. The selections in this combo box will become available after you make a selection in the first combo box.
- Use the edit text box to tell Kudo what words or information to search for. Wild card characters such as "*" or "?" are not necessary.

You can also choose the Find option using the Image menu. For example, you may have a catalog that includes a series of aircraft clip art images. You can use the Find button to search the catalog for any thumbnail records whose notes contain the word "Plane". To return to the full catalog, use Find and choose "Everything" or select Find-All from the Image pull-down menu.

Find All

Find All searches for and displays all thumbnails in the active catalog. This feature is also used to restore all thumbnails after a [Find](#) operation. Find All is equivalent to executing a Find "Everything" using the [Find Button](#).

Rotate Thumbnail

The selected thumbnail will be rotated 90 degrees clockwise. The last thumbnail position will be saved when the catalog is closed. The image file is not affected by the feature.

Flip Thumbnail

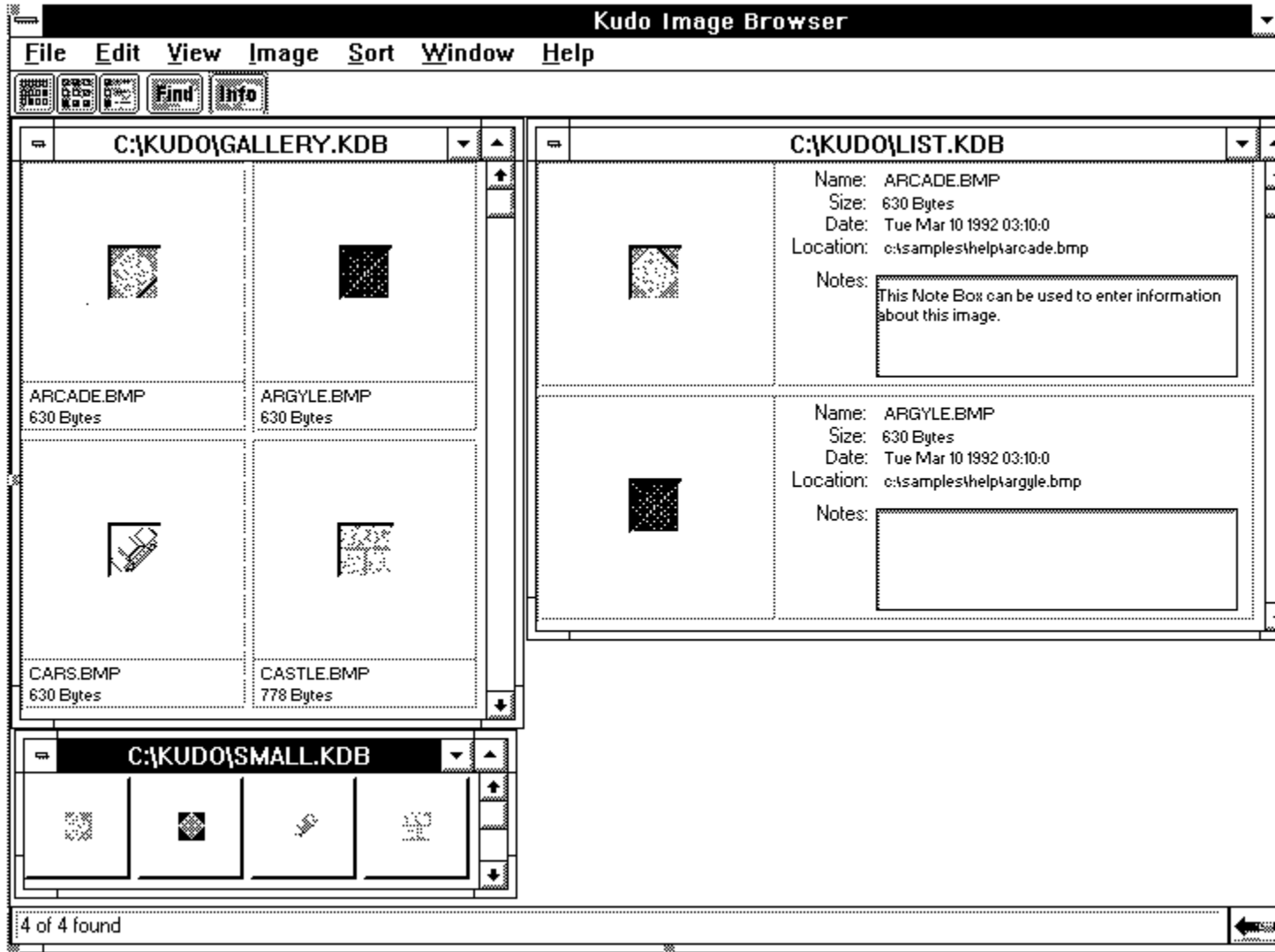
The selected thumbnail will be flipped (reversed) horizontally. The last thumbnail position will be saved when the catalog is closed. The image file is not affected by the feature.

Place

Place copies an image file from the clipboard places (pastes) the image into a Kudo supported document.

Exploring the Kudo Image Browser Window

This is a typical Kudo Window displaying two catalogs. The catalog on the left is displayed in Gallery View and the catalog on the right in List View. Explore the Kudo Window by clicking an item in the Kudo window below.

Drag and Drop Compatibility

Drag and Drop can be used from Kudo Image Browser onto the following applications:

All graphics applications that support Drag and Drop from the File Manager. This includes virtually all leading applications.

All graphics, desktop publishing, and multimedia applications that are OLE 2.0 clients. OLE 2.0 clients provide pinpoint accuracy when dropping onto a page layout.

In addition to the above, Kudo includes Place Modules for the following applications that are not OLE 2.0 clients, but could benefit from Drag and Drop with pinpoint accuracy:

- QuarkXPress version 3.12 , 3.2 and 3.3

- Aldus PageMaker version 4.2 and 5.0

- Microsoft Word version 2.0

- Word Perfect 6.0

Troubleshooting

Nothing happens when you drag a thumbnail into a PageMaker or QuarkXPress document.

Applications such as PageMaker and QuarkXPress only support the importing of specific file formats. If a file format is not supported by the application you are using, nothing will happen when you drag the Kudo thumbnail into the application document. Consult the documentation provided with the application to determine which file formats are supported, or copy and paste the thumbnail from Kudo.

Un-installing Kudo

To un-install Kudo Image Browser, simply delete the following:

- The Kudo directory and all of its contents.
- The Kudo program group item.
- The Kudo program group from the Program Manager.

Warning: please make sure that any catalogs and/or other files you wish to retain are moved from the Kudo directory before it is deleted.

Welcome to Kudo Image Browser

Welcome to Kudo Image Browser, the new way to organize your image files. Kudo is an image catalog. Just as you consult an office supply catalog for desk calendars, legal pads or pens, consult your Kudo catalog for your logos, clip art, illustrations, Microsoft Videos, QuickTime movies and Kodak Photo CD pictures.

Kudo catalogs your image files using thumbnails. Think of a thumbnail as a miniature photo of your image file. It looks like your file, but it's a replica that takes up very little memory. Kudo uses the thumbnail in its catalog and leaves your image file, untouched, in its original form and location. With these compact thumbnails, Kudo catalogs your image files in a convenient, accessible way.

The thumbnails provide a visual reference for each image file. Kudo adds additional information, such as the original file's name, location, size and file type, to complete the catalog.

Why Use Kudo

You have hundreds of clip art, logos and other graphic image files on your computer, all created using different applications. Unfortunately, to look through your images, you must find and open each file.

With Kudo, you can:

- Zoom through the catalog to locate the image file's thumbnail.
- Reference the image file's location, size and format.
- Preview the full-sized image in a floating window.
- Place the image into another document.

Kudo saves you hours of time. You've been there . . .

You want to find a graphic file so you search, open a file, close it. Search, open another file, close it. And on and on. That's the old way to find an image.

As a graphic design professional, you have hundreds, or even thousands, of images created for projects or collected from commercial clip art sources. You may subscribe to services that provide images monthly, stored by the hundreds, on CDs.

You have a photograph or piece of artwork in mind that would fit perfectly in your new layout. The question is: "Where did I see that image?". While you have seen it a hundred times, can you find it now? Would it be faster to re-create the image or use another that you can find that is "close enough"? Kudo Image Browser is a time-saving tool designed to allow more opportunity for originality and design because less time is spent searching for images.

You need the image of a sunset for your current project. Kudo presents you with thumbnails of all your image files. Now you can see exactly what the image in each file looks like. Using the Riffle Control, you quickly zoom through the catalog until you see the one you want. The search has become as simple as riffling the pages of a photograph album.

Once you find an image that will work, you preview it with a simple menu selection. When you are satisfied with the selection, you simply Drag and Drop the image directly into your favorite graphics or desktop publishing application.

Selecting artwork from a catalog has become a visual search. With Kudo Image Browser, you quickly browse, preview and select graphics and multimedia files. Your attention can now be focused on content and creative tasks, rather than wasting time locating the right image file.

Find Button

Use the Find button to search the catalog for thumbnails with specific characteristics. Kudo searches the catalog and displays the thumbnails that were identified in the search. All other thumbnails are hidden from view.

For example, if you search the catalog's notes for a client name, Kudo only displays the thumbnails with that information. Kudo does not delete or edit the remaining thumbnails; it just hides them from view. To return to the full catalog, use Find to search the catalog for "Everything" or select "Find-All" from the "Image" pull-down menu.

You can also choose Get Info using the "Image" pull down menu. When the Info window is open, click other thumbnails to display their information. Close the window by double-clicking on the window's Control menu.

Scroll Bars

Use the Scroll bar to move forward and backward through the catalog.

Remember that Kudo will display the catalog based on the current Find criteria. If you have selected "Everything" in the Find feature, the entire catalog is available. However, if you have used Find to select a specific group of files, you can only scroll through those files. You must set new search criteria to scroll through your other thumbnails.

Thumbnail View Buttons

The Gallery View and List View buttons allow you to toggle between views. Switch between the views by clicking the view button you prefer.

The Gallery View uses a grid style layout showing several thumbnails and their file type at once. Click the [Info button](#) to view detail about the selected thumbnail.

The List View uses a vertical layout with fewer thumbnails in the window, but with more information about each file. The list view shows the thumbnails in a vertical column and the file information in a second vertical column.

Note: The list view also shows your notes or description of the thumbnail. With Kudo, you can edit these notes on-the-fly. Add, delete or change text by simply keying in your notes. Use standard Windows text editing commands to edit your notes.

Gallery View

The Gallery View uses a grid style layout showing several thumbnails and their file type at once. Click the [Info button](#) to view detail about the selected thumbnail.

The Gallery View and [List View](#) buttons allow you to toggle between views. Switch between the views by clicking the view button you prefer.

List View

Unlike [Gallery View](#), List View uses a vertical layout with fewer thumbnails in the window, but with more information about each file. The list view shows the thumbnails in a vertical column and the file information in a second vertical column.

The list view also shows your notes or description of the thumbnail. With Kudo, you can edit these notes on-the-fly. Add, delete or change text by simply keying in your notes. Use standard Windows text editing commands to edit your notes.

Small Gallery View

The Small Gallery View uses the same layout as Gallery, but with much smaller images allowing the user to view more images at once. Click the [Info button](#) to view detail about the selected thumbnail.

Help Menu

The Help menu displays this file and the Kudo "About" Window.

Status Bar

The Status Bar displays the number of thumbnails currently displayable out of the total thumbnails contained in the active catalog.

For example, the active catalog contains 100 thumbnails. After executing the [Find](#) feature, only 35 thumbnails met the search criteria. The catalog window will only display the 35 found thumbnails and the Status Bar will display "35 of 100".

To restore the catalog to the full 100 displayable thumbnails, use either the [Find All](#) option from the "Image Menu" or find "Everything" using the [Find Button](#)

Title Bar

A window's Title Bar displays the name of the open application (in this case, Kudo Image Browser) or the path/filename of the catalog or both application name and path/filename of catalog.

Control Menu

The Control Menu provides options to close the window and control its sizing.

Maximize & Minimize Window

The Maximize (up arrow) and the Minimize (down arrow) buttons are standard Windows options.

- Maximize enlarges the current window size to full screen.
- Minimize reduces the current window to an icon on your computer's desktop.

To display the window, click on the icon.

Thumbnail Information

In [List View](#), the thumbnail's information section tells you the file kind, volume, size and any notes you have attached to the thumbnail.

You can also display the Info Window using the [Info Button](#). When the Info window is open, click other thumbnails to display their information. Close the window by double-clicking on the window's [Control menu](#).

Copy Text

Copy Text copies text to the clipboard from the selected thumbnail.

Copy Thumbnail

Copy Thumbnail copies a thumbnail to the clipboard from a selected catalog.

Paste Text

Paste Text copies text from the clipboard into the selected application.

Paste Thumbnail

Paste Thumbnail copies a thumbnail from the clipboard to a selected catalog.

Riffle Feature

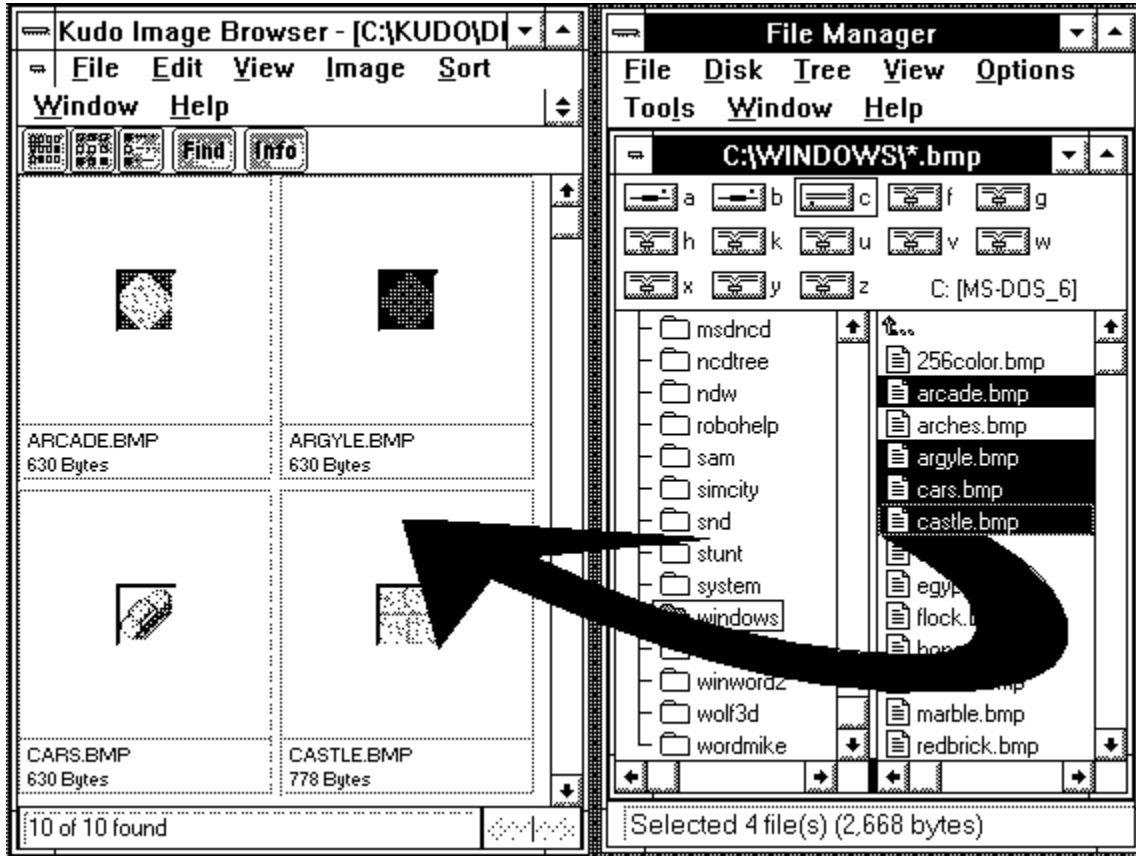
The Riffle feature displays the selected catalog's thumbnails one at a time in the lower right corner of the main window.

Control the Riffle speed and direction by holding down the left mouse button and dragging the control bar from the center to the left or right of the Riffle Control. Kudo will advance through the catalog until you release the control or until it reaches either end of the catalog.

When the mouse button is released or the control bar is returned to the center position, Kudo stops near the thumbnail that you choose and displays the surrounding thumbnails. Your reactions may be slower than Kudo's Riffle feature, so when you release the Riffle control, you may have to select a thumbnail that is a few frames ahead of the one you wanted.

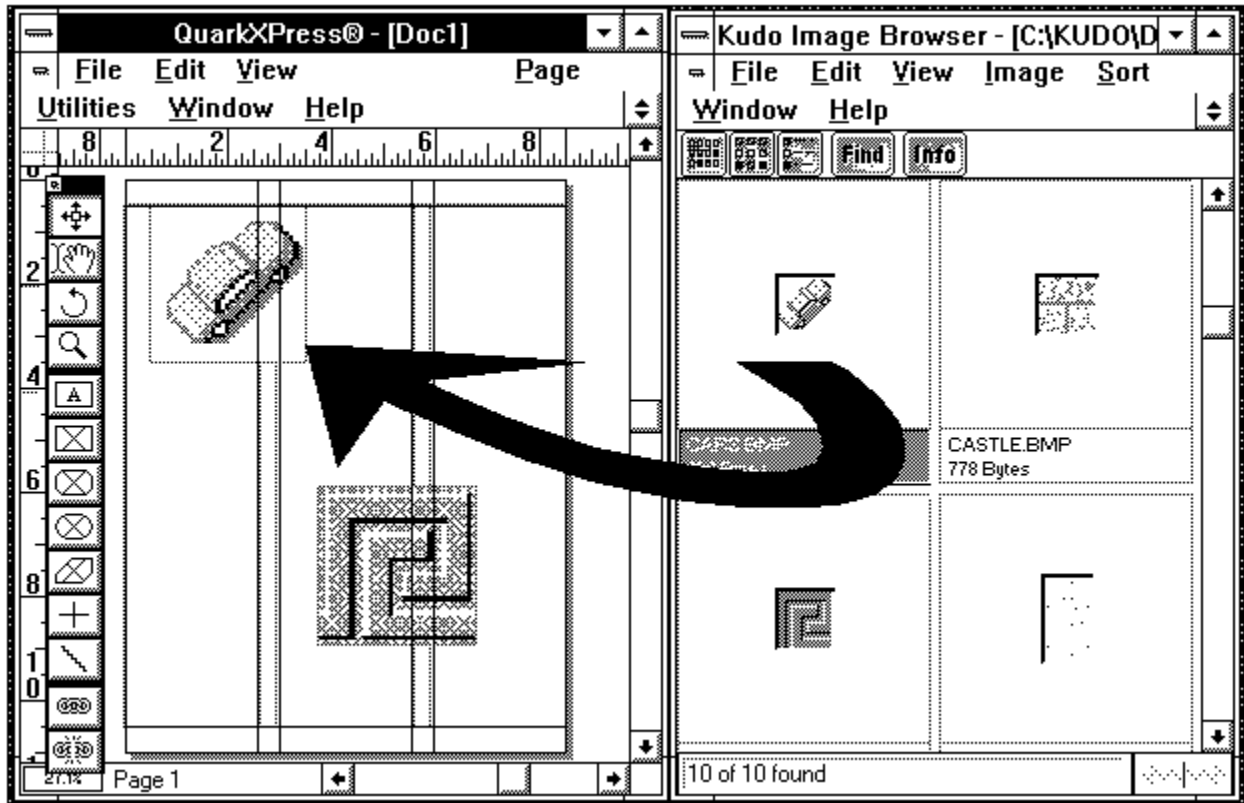
Using Drag and Drop with File Manager

You can Open/Create Catalogs and Add/Update file/s and directories by dragging them directly from the right side of the File Manager's split screen. (See changing Views in the File Manager Help). Simply click and hold the left mouse button on a file name or selection of files and drag and drop on Kudo.



Using Drag and Drop with Applications

You can drag and drop Thumbnails from Kudo into [applications which support](#) this feature. Simply click and hold the left mouse button on the thumbnail and drag it to the application and drop. Kudo will then search for the original image and place it into the application.

Self Contained Catalog?

When Kudo creates its standard Catalog it produces a list of thumbnail images including information about the location of the images, their size, notes etc. At this point you need to use Kudo Image Browser to open, view and search images.

When you use the "Make self contained" command in Kudo, the catalog is converted and becomes a stand alone catalog with a built-in Kudo. This allows any user to view the catalog and use many of the features of Kudo such as printing, searching etc. Once self contained however you cannot updated or modify the catalog, or use it to create new catalogs.

Example uses of a Self Contained Catalog.

Catalog Distribution

Image distribution

Custom LOGO.

Catalog Distribution.

A Self Contained Catalog can be downloaded by BBS users or given to clients on a disk so they can view a complete catalog of all the images you or the BBS have available.

Image Distribution.

True image distribution is an expanding industry due primarily to the popularity of CD ROM technology. Kudo Image Browser becomes a user friendly CD ROM authoring tool with the use of the self contained catalog.

If the images are to be distributed along with the catalog, the ability to preview them is dependent on having the relevant image filters. A perfect example of this would be to produce a Syquest or CD-ROM of textures and background images in tiff format and along with the catalog and files also the filter for tiff format in this case MTIF.FLT.

Using "Drag and Drop" graphic artists and layout specialists increase productivity. If this is the target market also included the place modules for that application.

Both of these examples benefit from the addition of an installation program. You may obtain an installer for use in CD ROM production free of charge for a limited time. If you plan you use self contained for image distribution and would like further information plus an installer please contact Tech. Support for further details.

Custom LOGO.

This feature allows you to add a personal touch, your own custom opening screen for your self contained catalogs. Include a BMP file 500w x 308h pixels named SPLASH.BMP, in the same directory as your catalog and this will become the startup screen when the self contained catalog is launched.

This document is intended to help Kudo CD Publisher users plan and create a content based CDROM for Macintosh and /or Windows users for sale, internal corporate distribution or image archiving. Additional information can be obtained by contacting Imospace Systems Corporation.

Overview

Creating a successful content CDROM for internal use or for sale to Macintosh and/or Windows users is not difficult.

1. The first step is deciding if a CDROM is the way to go.
2. Do you want to do it yourself or use a service bureau
3. Read this document and create a project plan
4. Design the CDROM based on a thorough understanding of the intended user
5. Get all the necessary licenses and releases
6. Prepare your content
7. Get your computer equipment setup and tested
8. Put the content on the hard drive volume that simulates the CDROM
9. Create a customized Kudo Self Contained catalog of the CDROM volume
10. Write the CDROM one off
11. Test the one off
12. Duplicate the one off
13. Feel a sense of accomplishment

If you plan to write CDs in your shop you will need a CD Writer in addition to a Macintosh and/ or Windows computer with at least 1.5 Gigabytes of free hard disk space. Your hard disk space should preferably be a single disk drive of at least 1.5 Gigabytes with at least 1 Megabyte per second actual data transfer speed.

Your computer should have a high performance 24bit graphics display system with 20 inch color monitor and enough system main memory to equal twice the size of your largest image.

If you plan to use an off site CD Writer you will need removeable media capable of storing 650 Mbytes, such as a DAT drive. Your CD Reader should be at least 2x and preferably 3x.

You will need to purchase the Kudo CD Publisher software CD from Imspace Systems. Call for pricing and availability.

Using Kudo Image Browser as a CDROM Authoring Tool

Kudo CD Publisher catalogs can be distributed to other computer users as self contained applications. This allows users who do not have Kudo installed on their systems to use the Kudo catalog. A self contained Kudo catalog offers most of the features of a regular Kudo catalog such as preview original image files, print, Boolean find and drag & place and has a self executing built in viewer. A self contained catalog cannot however run or edit an AppleScript, create a new catalog, open other catalogs, nor may it be updated or modified.

To create a self contained catalog:

1. Create a Kudo catalog using Kudo CD Publisher.
2. Make a copy of your catalog.
3. Select Make Self Contained from the File Menu.

Your Kudo Self Contained Catalog may be distributed royalty free. Some examples of distribution media are CDROM, floppy diskettes, Syquest cartridges, MO cartridges or on line via email or BBS. Using a compression utility such as Stuffit from Aladdin Systems or PKZIP from PKWare, you can compress your self contained catalog to sizes that can quickly be sent via modem. CDROM developers can use Kudo CD Publisher to prepare cross platform CDROMs.

Experienced CDROM developers of content based material such as clip art, stock images, QuickTime movies or document images use an CD Publisher as a CDROM front end to provide easy access to the content. Good browsers have not been available or were too costly - until Kudo CD Publisher began offering the Make Self Contained feature. This new feature combined with a customizable opening screen, translator installer and special scripts for automating keyword management are designed to make Kudo CD Publisher the content developers CDROM authoring tool of choice.

Kudo helps meet the needs of content CDROM publishers for an attractive, intuitive, professional, and affordable front end that helps sell titles and gives users a pleasurable experience.

Step 1 - Plan Ahead

Imspace Systems has helped many CDROM developers through their first CDROM project. The first and most important step is the project plan. Proper planning can create a rewarding experience and lack of planning can cause missed deadlines and painful cost overruns.

Take the time to think about your intended CDROM user. Macintosh or Windows users or cross platform. Are your intended users professional illustrators, desktop publishers, movie buffs, voyeurs, art directors, scientists, physicians or magazine publishers.

CDROMs for Macintosh users can be created by most CDROM Writers driven by a Macintosh with a 1.5 Gigabyte hard disk and formatting software for System 7.1 available from many CDROM Writer vendors. Windows only CDROMs require a 486/33 PC with a 1.5 Gigabyte hard disk and the corresponding formatting software for Windows 3.1 and are also available from most CDROM Writer vendors.

The cross platform CDROM image should be created and written to the one off CDROM on a Macintosh driven CDROM Writer. Imspace Systems can recommend some reputable vendors. Please call.

One of the most important decisions regarding your CDROM is what format to use for your images or mixed media files. For Macintosh CDROMs we recommend the PICT format and for Windows CDROMs we recommend the BMP format.

For cross platform CDROMs we suggest using TIFF if the image is a raster image or EPS if the image is a vector image. These image formats are supported by most programs, on many different platforms, which eliminates the need for duplicating your images in several file formats. Remember that if this is going to be a cross platform CDROM, your file names MUST conform to the DOS 8.3 filename format (FILENAME.EXT).

If your images need to be large, say for print production, you may want to use the JPEG file format. The JPEG format does not yet have the broad support that TIFF, or EPS files enjoy but most major applications such as Quark, Pagemaker, and Photoshop can read them. JPEG drastically reduces your file sizes, allowing you to fit more images on your CDROM. If you use JPEG, we suggest you also include screen resolution TIFF images for quicker previewing.

Make sure you have the proper releases and licenses before laying out your CDROM. For QuickTime movies you should get a license to distribute the latest version of QuickTime for Mac and Windows from Apple to ensure your users of consistent and predictable performance.

Step 2 - CDROM Layout

Imagine you are a customer who just purchased a CDROM with 650MB of images on it, and you are looking for that one image that you need. This is when you realize how important it is to have Kudo CD Publisher prepare your CDROM, and how important it is to have your CDROM structured in such a way that your customers can find the image they need *quickly & easily*. The fewer folders you have on the root of the CDROM, the easier it is to use. We suggest two folders only, on the root, one called images and another called browser.

Step 3 - Creating Your Kudo Catalogs

There are some very important things to keep in mind before you start cataloging. Kudo makes a thumbnail of the original image, and stores the complete path back to the original. When you choose Preview or use Drag & Place, Kudo uses the original file. The path that is stored with each thumbnail in the Kudo catalog cannot be changed after you have cataloged the file. If you are using a hard drive as the mastering drive, you MUST make sure that you have it set up in exactly the same way as your final CDROM. Make certain that your master hard drive has the same volume name and file structure as your CDROM will, and do not change anything after creating your final Kudo catalog.

If you are creating a cross platform CDROM, and you want to put a Mac & Windows Kudo catalog on it, we have some time saving scripts to help you out.

Copyright, trademark and additional ordering information can be inserted in the catalog as a PICT or BMP image of a one page document scanned or printed to disk with DISKPRINT (available on Imospace Systems BBS). This image should be no more than 72 dpi, 8 or 24 bit color depth, screen size and the first image in the catalog. Screen size depends on your intended user. Graphics professionals have 20 inch or 17 inch 24 bit color monitors - most corporate business presentation creators have 13 inch 8bit color monitors. Choose your image size and resolution according to the needs of your intended customers.

Once your catalog has been created, you will need to place it on your CDROM with all of the required support files.

On the Macintosh, you will need to put all the Kudo Place Modules in the same folder as the self contained catalog. You can obtain a translator installer for your self contained catalogs free of charge for a limited time. (Call us for details.) This translator installer will install the Claris Translators which are required in order to preview all of our supported formats.

For Windows, you will need to create a KUDO directory on your CD. Then put your catalog along with all the required support files listed in the Kudo readme, and redistributable components documents into the Kudo directory. For more information please refer to the Kudo CD Publisher readme, and redistributable components documents. You may obtain a free installer for a limited time, that will install the necessary OLE v2.0 support files. (OLE v2.0 files are required for Copy & Paste to work.)

A new feature available in Kudo CD Publisher v1.1 is the ability to replace the Kudo Self Contained opening screen with your own custom image. (e.g. Your corporate logo.) This feature adds a great deal of professionalism to your catalogs.

To insert your image on the Macintosh just place a PICT file named Splash in the same folder as your Kudo self contained catalog. The image dimensions should be 500w x 308h pixels. We suggest you use an 8 bit image, but you can insert a 24bit if you choose. The image you use MUST be under 500k and be a Macintosh PICT file. Dont forget that monitor screen resolution is 72dpi anything more is a waste because this image is meant for screen viewing only.

To insert your image in Windows just place a BMP file named SPLASH.BMP in the same directory as your Kudo self contained catalog. The image dimensions should be 500w x 308h pixels. We suggest you use an 8 bit image, but you can insert a 24bit if you choose. The image you use MUST be a Windows BMP file.

Here is a listing demonstrating a possible layout on your CDROM. This list only details the most important files. You should read the Kudo CD Publisher readme, and redistributable components documents for a more complete listing of all the required files.

Step 5 - Test, Test, Test...

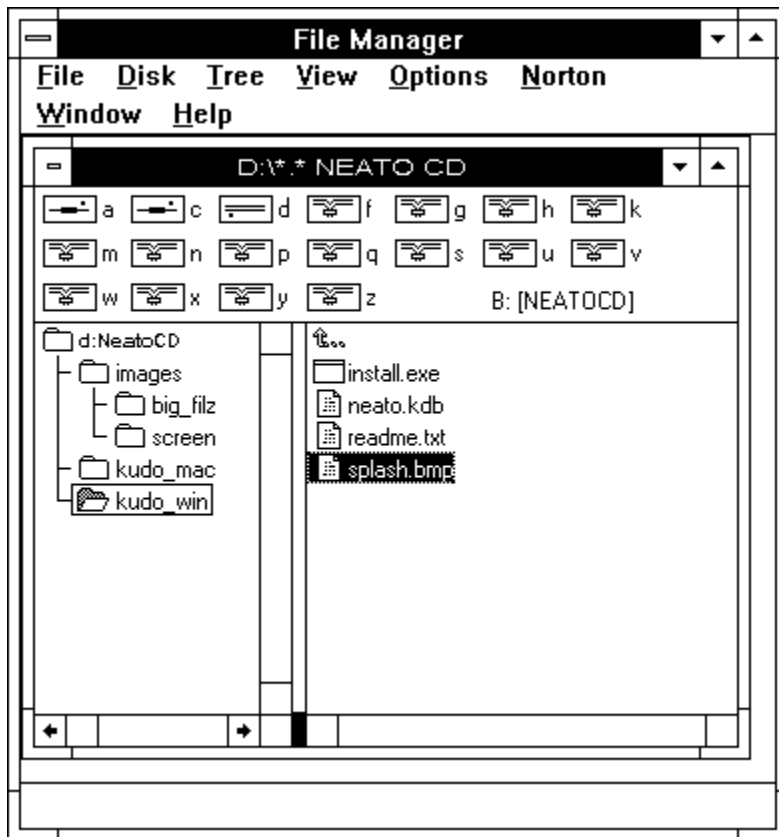
The final step in creating your CDROM is the testing stage. You'll save a lot of money, and anguish if you just spend a few minutes testing your one-off CDROM. Make sure the place modules are in the same folder as your self contained catalog. Try previewing a few images, to make sure you didn't change the path to the images. And when everything looks good, make enough copies for your first few months orders and no more. Find a duplication service that gives good prices on runs of less than 1,000 copies. You can always make more but it's expensive to throw away thousands of copies because of a mistake that wasn't caught in time.

The Splash Screen
