1.3 Brief Overview

What is BlitzDms ?

BlitzDms is a

 fully featured

 Gui handler for the DMS disk masher system as popular with demo coders and magazines. There's one hell of a lot of these out there already, and we'd be the first to admit that we did this program just as an exercise in programming, rather than to beat some of those, although we have in fact done just that. Make no mistake, BlitzDms is better than any other gui that performs the same functions, and we hold that opinion until anyone else can prove otherwise. And we've both seen more than a few in our time :-)

This gui window has been specifically written to work with multiple versions of

DMS

, something that no other window has ever offered to my knowledge, ←
and

is just one of the reasons why we make the bold claim above. If you have a version of DMS that is not supported by BlitzDms then please tell us about it and we'll add support into a future version. We welcome any suggestions that will help us improve BlitzDms to its maximum potential.

BlitzDms supports all of the functions that can be used from the shell for DMS, including test file and view file information, as well as reading a DMS file from hd and writing it to a disk, and compressing a disk to a file on hd, or another floppy. Note that the commands available depend upon what version of the DMS executable you are using, and the program automatically reflects this with the options available via the

Main GUI
, the
Config GUI
,

the

menus
or the
Tooltypes
.

The gui also has options to bypass validating the disk (if you feel brave enough), not display text files stored in the dms file when writing to a disk (such as those all-too-common BBS adverts) and other bits like removing delay prompts such as press return to continue, if you're all set to go and don't want to hang around. In fact every feature of BlitzDms from the font type (BlitzDms is font sensitive of course) to the sizing of the console window can be customised via the gui, menus or tooltypes. The features are many and varied which was a deliberate effort on our part. A dms gui is meant to simplify use of DMS, and BlitzDms does this to the maximum.

Requirements

Reqtools Library by Nico Francois. Freely available and included with the archive.

PackDev1.3+ - © 1994-1995 Christian Wasner, freely distributable and FreeWare.

Lzx V1.0+ - © 1995/96 Johnathan Forbes - Not included. Available as an evaluation archive from any good bbs, or the Aminet.

Kickstart 2.0+ and Wb2.0+ are required to run BlitzDms as it uses a GadTools gui system. We love Mui. But not THAT much :-)

This program has been tested on an A500, A2000, A3000 and an A4000. It should work just fine on any Amiga, and we've yet to find one it doesn't like yet.

1.4 The Main Window Gadgets

Here's a break down of the gui gadgets and what they do.

Main Window

Load o Selects a file to load in for decompressing to disk

Note: this gadget is ghosted when BlitzDms is in Read/Append mode as this information is not needed.

Save o Selects a file to save to when compressing a disk to a file.

Note: this gadget is ghosted when BlitzDms is in Write Mode as this information is not needed.

Compress o This is the compression gadget. Cycle it to choose your preferred mode for DMS to work in. BEST,NONE,HEAVY1 or HEAVY2.

Drive o This gadget selects the floppy drive you wish to extract dms files onto. It will configure itself with all relevant devices available when you first run the program so if you have a Rad: device, and the dms version you are using supports it, then the option will become available. If you mount a device after you have run BlitzDms then it will need to be restarted to use the newly available list.

Density o If you have a high density drive then you can tell Dms to take that into account by using this gadget. Normally it would default to Double.

Note: We have been unable - at this time - to find a way of automatically detecting if a drive is high density or normal so this option's usage is entirely up to the user. If it doesn't work because you don't have a high density drive, then why bother trying it? :-)

Start o This button will start DMS off doing its stuff. If no paths are selected when this gadget is clicked then it will prompt you for a load or save path depending on whether you are in Read or Write mode. The same applies to the AppWindow functions which will automatically trigger the start button when a dms file or a disk icon are dragged onto the main window, and start in that mode. More on the AppWindow events later.

Preferences o This will simply switch you over to the BlitzDms Configuration window where you can set up even more options.

MX Buttons o This is the way to select what mode you wish DMS to run in. You can have Read,Append,Write,Repack,View,Test and Text. Some other gadgets may ghost out depending on what options your version of the dms executable supports. I.e. with SDS (DMS v1.11) selected, Append will not be selectable as it is an unsupported option with that version of Dms, so please don't make out a bug report :)

Prompt o Tick this for confirmation requesters when BlitzDms is about to go ahead with an action. This is a precaution for those who get confused as to the action of DMS in read or write mode, but as the n/a gadgets are ghosted when an option is invalid, then it's usually very clear exactly what DMS will do anyway. If you do have the program in Read mode, and the file it will write to already exists, then naturally BlitzDms will inform you that it is about to overwrite a file that already exists and you can abort if you wish.

Pause o If this is ticked then BlitzDms will pause after every action has been completed so you can see the console output. This means you will need to close the shell window manually after a disk has been written for example, but it means you can see what has happened at your own pace with a utility such as KCon with a scrollbar shell buffer which BlitzDms works with. It also acts as the DMS NoPause switch to avoid the "Press Return" after a Banner was shown.

Pause is never automatically used for operations such as test and view, as the drag and drop capabilities of BlitzDms mean you can test multiple files by dragging them onto the BlitzDms window.

The

Binary Systems

logo on the BlitzDms window actually functions as an AppWindow so you can drag .dms files onto it and they will appear in the load path and BlitzDms will startup in Write mode, whereas dragging a disk icon onto it will put BlitzDms into Read mode and start going. If you don't have filepaths set up when you do this, you will be prompted to select them before Dms begins.

1.5 The Config Window Gadgets

Here's a break down of the gui gadgets and what they do.

The Configuration window

Banner o If the text gadget is ticked, then this filepath becomes active and you can select a text file of any kind to add into the .dms file when it is created. Naturally this is of no use when you are decompressing a file to a disk.

Text o Tick this to suppress output of any of those text files when you are decompressing a disk. If you have it ticked in Read mode then BlitzDms will use an ascii banner, which is defined in the Banner filepath, to store with the created .DMS file that will be viewed when it's decompressed normally. If this banner does not exist and Text is ticked, then you will be prompted.

Password o If you have the Crypt gadget ticked, then you can put a password into this string gadget and it will be used to encrypt/decrypt the .dms file as it is created/read. Remember the password though, as you will need it if you ever hope to decompress the disk file again.

Crypt o If you tick this gadget then you will need to enter a password to compress a disk to a .dms file in the Password field. If you're Decompressing a file to a disk and it is encrypted with a password, then tick this option and put the password into the password field. If you don't know the password then I'm afraid that's beyond the capabilities of BlitzDms to help :(

Run o If you use KCon: as an alternative console device, and don't have it mounted as a Con: replacement, you can select it here. If you do have it set up to automatically replace the Con: device, then just select Con: as the CLI window will be correct anyway.

Note: in a later release we hope to be able to use this gadget for running dms as a background task enabling multiple operations asynchronously and progress monitors. The gadget is here for that purpose and functions as a console device selector until we put support for that in.

Vers o This is a cycle gadget to select the version of DMS

you wish to use with BlitzDms. If BlitzDms has no path set up ←
for the Dms executable then cycling to the relevant version will prompt you to select it via a file requester before continuing. The same applies if it can not be found whenever it is selected in future, so you can reselect it if you moved the program since last using BlitzDms.

Custom Font o Clicking in here will let you select the font you want to use for the BlitzDms gui window. Remember that BlitzDms is font sensitive, but it will default to topaz 8 if it can't use the defined font, it doesn't exist, or the gui would be taller than the screen by using it.

NoVal o This gadget tells dms to not validate the disk after it has been written to. This means workbench will automatically update it on the screen without having to remove, and insert the disk again after an operation.

NoZero o Ticking this option will tell DMS to not display the bootblock of a disk as it is worked on.

NoVrfy o Ticking this gadget will tell dms to NOT verify each track of the disk as it reads or writes to it. From DMS v1.53 upwards.

Load o Click on this to load the prefs defined in the icon. Handy if you don't like how you've just configured it and want the last saved.

Use o Click on this to use the current settings. They won't be written to disk so you'll have the old configuration when you reload the program. The same thing can be done by clicking the close gadget

while in the prefs window, and also note that the quit confirm requester will not be displayed if you quit the main program after selecting use.

Save o Click on this to save the current configuration to the icon file. This will save all of BlitzDms' settings, including window positions, paths to all the executables of DMS itself, the paths (but not filenames) of the load and save gadgets and the gadgets current settings.

Note: Saving configuration in the unregistered version will not work. You can still customise the program by editing the tooltype lines manually, but registering the program to receive a keyfile will let you save the config from the gui which is so much more practical :-)

Slider o The slider gadgets are used to define the start and end track from where DMS should work on the disk.

Note: If you select Hi-Density then the slider gadgets will automatically update to allow for the extra tracks available on your disk drive.

XDM: Mode o If you have the Dms version gadget toggled to XDM, then you can select the way XDM will work on the disk when writing to a file.

ALL - XDM will crunch all of the tracks.

DOS - XDM will compress only valid dos tracks, ignoring empty tracks.

TRK - not implemented.

LowMem o This is a setting for LZX and will only become active when DMS version is selected as XDM. If you are low on memory, or run a very tight ship, then clicking on this will prompt for a temp dir for LZX to use instead of Ram: while compressing a disk image. In order to satisfy LZX, a Device path has to be used, choosing a directory or Assign will not be accepted. This setting and path are saved with the rest of the configuration so you don't need to set it every time.

All of BlitzDms' configuration options are stored as tooltypes

so you can

manually edit them should you wish to do so, but saving config with the Config gadget will store the active configuration for all options anyway, including window positions for iconified and normal. You MUST keep an icon for BlitzDms with the main program for this reason alone. The save config button does not function in the evaluation version unless a valid keyfile is found!

1.6 The Menus

The Menu commands

BlitzDms

has several options available on the menus to avoid cluttering up the gui too much as we wanted it font sensitive, and some people have been known to prefer huge fonts :)

- LoadPath o Lets you select the load file. Same as the Load Gadget.
Key: RAmiga L
- SavePath o Lets you select the save file. Same as the Save Gadget.
Key: RAmiga S
- StartDms o Let her rip and stand back :) Same as the Start Gadget.
Key: RAmiga D
- MenuBar o Sheer cosmetics :-)
- Select font o Pops up a font requester so you can choose your preferred font for BlitzDms to use from the main window. See note about fonts in the prefs notes elsewhere in the documentation.
Key: Ramiga F
- About o Pops up a little information requester about the program, and will show registration details if applicable.
You can also call this by pressing Ramiga A, or Help.
- Quit o Will NOT let you quit the program :-)
Key: RAmiga Q

1.7 The Icon ToolTypes

ToolTypes available for customising BlitzDms

- FontName o Name of font you want the BlitzDms gui to use.
- FontSize o Size of font above. It must exist or BlitzDms will default to your system default font. Note that BlitzDms is fully font sensitive and will adjust its gui accordingly. If it

can not fit in the current screen size then it will default to the system default font.

- PubScreen o Name of preferred public screen to bump BlitzDms onto. Note that this is case sensitive and will default to Workbench if it can't find the specified one, or it isn't public.
 - WindowX o The X coordinate of the top/left BlitzDms window.
 - WindowY o The Y coordinate of the top/left BlitzDms window.
 - Icon_X o The X coordinate of the top/left Iconified window.
 - Icon_Y o The Y coordinate of the top/left Iconified window.
 - Con_Left o The X coordinate of the console output window.
 - Con_Top o The Y coordinate of the console output window.
 - Con_Width o The width in pixels of the console window.
 - Con_Height o The height in pixels of the console window.
 - Alt_Left o The top/left X coordinate of the zoomed console window.
 - Alt_Top o The top/left Y coordinate of the zoomed console window.
 - Alt_Width o The width in pixels of the zoomed console window.
 - Alt_Height o The height in pixels of the zoomed console window.
 - SDS_Path o The path to DMS version 1.11 - SDS software
 - PDX_Path o The path to DMS version 1.53 - Paradox software
 - TRB_Path o The path to DMS version 2.02 - ParCon software
 - PKD_Path o The path to the XDM binary PackDev. Normally C:
 - LZX_Path o The path to LZX. Normally C:
 - DMSVersion o Which version of
DMS
.
Currently supports: SDS,PDX,TRB or XDM.

* See notes on DMS later in this documentation.
 - Prompt o Yes or No. Do you want confirmation requestors when Start is clicked ?
 - DMSMode o READ,APPEND,WRITE,REPACK,VIEW,TEST,TEXT.

* These options are dependent upon what version of Dms is used. With Version XDM selected, Repack will Write a .DMS file to a floppy and repack it as a .xdm file.

- Compress o BEST/NONE/HEAVY1 or HEAVY2
- Drive o Default drive to use. Usually Df0:
- Density o DD or HD - double density, or high density.
- NoVerify o On or Off.
- NoVal o On or Off.
- Text o On or Off.
 - * In READ mode this will need a BannerFile configured.
- Banner o Full path/name of text file to include when writing a .dms file.
- Pause o On or Off. This will pause the shell instead of closing it.
- Shell o BRUN,\$^2\$ KCN:\$^1\$ or CON: to be used for output console.
 - \$^1\$ Normally use KCon: only if you have it mounted as a separate device, else it is only possible to use the Con: device.
 - \$^2\$ BRUN isn't implemented yet...
- XDMMode o TRACK,DOS or ALL.
- XDMLowMem o On or Off.
- VirtMem o Path to virtual memory device for LZX if applicable.
- LoadPath o Choose a default path gadget for Load
- SavePath o Choose a default path gadget for Save
- NoZero o On or Off. Suppress the bootblock display.

1.8 The Features

Features (The good bit :))

BlitzDms

has an impressive feature list, some of which is listed below. ↔
You'll

see just how powerful the program is on daily use, but we like to show off a touch :)

Font Sensitive. BlitzDms will autoadjust the gui dependent on the font type and size requested.

Public screen. BlitzDms lets you choose a public screen via the tooltypes
. If
it can't be found when BlitzDms first runs, it will auto run on Workbench. Public screen names are case sensitive, so if it doesn't appear to work, then check that it is a valid name, and that the screen is set as public.

Multiple Dms. You can use just about every version of Dms out there with this program. Just a matter of selecting the right one with the gui. BlitzDms will also keep track of the file paths and names of every one of them, if you use several for some reason, and store this information within the config, so it knows instantly where the executable is, no matter where you keep them if they are in separate drawers/partitions.

Dms options. BlitzDms supports all the options available in DMS executables.
Obviously it won't let you dms to a high density drive if the executable you use doesn't have that option, and will ghost the options on the gui so you know instantly what's possible, and what's not. It handles all the usual commands such as Read, Write, Test and Repack. And will handle any compression method that the executable offers.

BlitzDms also supports the XDms idea by
Adam Chapman
of packing a device-image.

To use it, you will need to install PackDev v1.3+ and LZX v1.0+ on your system. Both these programs are freely distributable. PackDev, now v1.7, which reads a disk-image, is (c)

and Lzx, a new archiver to rival Lha and is

Johnathan Forbes
. are not included in this distribution as both have their separate distribution restrictions. You can pick up an evaluation version of LZX and the latest version of PackDev from most popular BBS', coverdisks, or ye-olde and faithful AmiNet.

1.9 How to Register

Registering BlitzDms

BlitzDms is distributed as
shareware
and while the evaluation archive is freely
distributable, you are required to register the program if you wish to use it
after a 14 day evaluation period. Registering the program with us will entitle
you to a keyfile which we will send to you by whatever means you require and
will unlock some of the BlitzDms options for your use. Please note that a
keyfile given to you on receipt of your registration remains our property, but
can be held by you indefinitely for using BlitzDms V1.0 and later
updates
as
long as the keyfile is kept for your use only, and is neither sold or passed
on to anyone else without the prior written permission of either of the BlitzDms
authors, and signed with a PGP signature. Our PGP public keys are available
on request.

When you receive your BlitzDms keyfile you should rename it to BlitzDms.key
and put it in the same path as the BlitzDms program to unlock the restrictions
of the program.

In the evaluation version of BlitzDms the option for saving the config file
is not available, and you have a forced requester which you can cancel 5-10
seconds after running the program.

Please remember that supporting shareware is the key to ensuring that the
Amiga, which we all know and love, has a long future. A lot of time and effort
has gone into making this program, and we're confident you can see the results.
Please

don't pirate
this program or attempt to hack the executable, as you are
not only ripping us off, but killing the Amiga as well.

BlitzDms has a registration price of 10 english pounds. You can send either
cash, PO or cheque (in English currency) to the either of the
addresses
below,

and receive your keyfile by any means you prefer, and we will endeavour to
process your registration as quickly as possible. Please note that if you
must send cash, then please send it recorded delivery to cover both yourself
and us, should it get mislaid in the post.

A print out of this document is available should it be required, but please
enclose an extra pound to cover the costs of mailing. When registering
BlitzDms don't forget to stipulate how you want the keyfile sent. If by email
then we will need your PGP Public Key so we can send it as a secure UUEncoded
message to your email address upon receipt of fee, or if you want it sent via
fidonet, then we will crash mail it to your point or node address also in
UUEncoded format. Should you wish for it to be sent by sack-mail then we will
post you a disk WB 2.04+ formatted with your keyfile, and the latest version
of BlitzDms on as well.

If requesting your keyfile via fidonet or Email, then please stipulate if you
want the latest version of the BlitzDms program sent to you as well and we
will do so.

Please note that all BlitzDms keys will work with future updates to the
program, but we reserve the right to discontinue work on BlitzDms at

any time, so you will NEVER have to pay more than once for updates no matter how many there are!

1.12 DMS Executables

DMS is used to literally compress every block on a normal floppy ↔ disk into a crunched block which is stored in a file. That file can then be stored on a hard drive, or multiple disks can even be put onto one disk as compressed files which makes it rather handy for transporting PD software via bulletin boards or magazines. DMS isn't a bad program to use from the cli, but it can be confusing as hell for beginners, so why make life hard for yourself when a Gui can be used instead to take the trauma out of the dreaded shell.

The versions as BlitzDms sees them:

- SDS - Dms V1.02, V1.03 and V1.11 by SDS software
- PDX - Dms V1.53 by SDS Software - Blackhawk/PARADOX
- TRB - Dms V2.02 Turbo by ParCon Software

- XDM - PackDev by Christian Wasner and LZX by Jonathan Forbes. Both available as archives from the AmiNet.
