1.3 Program Description

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

MUI_WBPattern allows your Amiga to have different backdrops appear every time you boot up. The program can be run in two different modes:

1. Displays an interface to allow you to create lists of images you want for backdrops for the Workbench, windows, and screen.
2. Quietly choose the backdrops to be used next time you boot.

SYSTEM REQUIREMENTS

Requires Kickstart 2.0 or higher.
Requires Magic User Interface (MUI) Version 3.2 or higher.

Any Amiga from A500 to A4000.

FEATURES

- Allows random or ordered backdrop changes every time you boot.
- Pictures can be anywhere on your system that is accessible when the Workbench is started.
- If you have OS 3.0 or higher, any pictures you have datatypes for will work. (GIF, JPEG...)
- Small, under 30K. Just one executable and two icons, no other files are created or installed.
- Uses MUI.
- Preferences are saved as icon tooltypes.
- No system patches.

1.4 Installation

INSTALLATION

Just double-click the "Install" icon...

OR if you would rather install it manually:

1. Drag the MUI_WBPattern icon from the Prefs drawer to your SYS:Prefs drawer.
2. Drag the MUI_WBPattern icon in the WBStartup drawer to your SYS:WBStartup drawer
3. Make sure the 'Default Tool' in the WBStartup icon is set to point to the prefs program.

1.5 Program Usage

PROGRAM USAGE

Prefs Mode

The program may be run in two different modes, Prefs Mode and Startup Mode

.

Prefs Mode is used when the MUI_WBPattern preferences icon is double-clicked or the program is run from a shell with no arguments. Running the program in Prefs mode opens the the GUI.

MUI_WBPattern's interface has three similar pages. The pages are "Workbench", "Windows", and "Screen". They refer to the same three backdrop types as the WBPattern program.

Each page has the following gadgets:

Selection Method:

- "Single File/No Change" - This method will not change the picture or pattern when you reboot.
- "Random Files" - The next picture will be selected randomly from the list.
- "Files in Order" - The pictures will be selected by the order of the files in the list. (Currently the files are alphabetized.)

File List:

This is the list of pictures that will be used as backdrops. The files may be located anywhere in the file-system, and repeated several times to increase probability of being shown. Each page has its own file list. You can drag and drop icons from the Workbench onto this list, and even sort

the list yourself using drag and drop.

- "Add" - Clicking this button will pop up a standard ASL file requester. Select the files you want to add to the list. This requester supports multiple file selection using the shift key.
- "Test" - Tests the currently selected file in the file list. The system will attempt to load the file as a backdrop. A file may also be tested by double-clicking its name in the list.
- "Remove" - Removes the selected file from the list.
- "Clear" - Removes all files from the list.
- "Sort" - Alphabetizes the list by pathname.

The following gadgets underneath the pages will quit the program:

- "Save" - Saves the file lists to its icon and keeps the tested backdrops on the screen.
- "Use" - Uses the current backdrops from testing files. Does not save any changes to the file lists.
- "Cancel" - Restores the backdrops used before you ran the program.

Startup Mode

The program will run in Startup Mode if a project icon with its default tool set to MUI_WBPattern is double-clicked, or if it is run from a shell with an argument (for example, "sys:prefs/MUI_WBPattern quiet" could be put in your s:user-startup script instead of using the WBStartup icon.)

This second mode automatically selects the pictures that will be displayed next time you startup your computer, and saves it in the standard "ENVARC:sys/wbpattern.prefs" file. When the startup icon is in your SYS:WBStartup directory, a new backdrop will be chosen every time you boot your computer.

1.6 Hints

HINTS

- Test each file before saving the lists.
 - If you have a pattern (instead of a picture) saved with the system standard WBPattern prefs program, then the "Single File/No Change" option for a list type will preserve it. This program does not allow you to select or modify these 16x16 pixel patterns. Once a file list is saved
-

with a different selection method, the pattern will be lost.

- Should you decide MUI_WBPattern is not for you, just delete the MUI_WBPattern icons in your Prefs and WBStartup directories. No other files are created by this program.

1.7 To Do

TO DO~

- May implement a NO REMAP feature. It is a flag supported by the OS which will prevent Workbench from remapping the backdrop.
- Show lists simultaneously allowing drag and drop features between lists.
- Add NewIcons style icons.

CP-3 CONTROL PAD ADAPTER:

We have a working prototype of a device which allows TWO Sega Genesis controllers to be plugged into ONE Amiga game port. Yes, that's two controllers in one port! This leaves your mouse free for use while playing 2-player games. This adapter also detects all the buttons on a "6-button" controlpad. Not only can you read directions, but also A, B, C, Start, X, Y, Z, and Mode buttons (and from both controllers plugged into one port!) Our prototype has been tested and works on an Amiga 4000 and Amiga 500. (Hardware and software by Randall Richards and myself).
