

Directions for use:**Windows:**

To install The World Factbook 1995 Edition in Windows

1. Choose "RUN" from the File menu in the Windows Program Manager.
2. Type "(drive):\install.exe" to install Icons in Windows for the World Factbook 1995 Edition.

-OR- Add a program manager icon:

1. Choose the program manager group to add into.
2. Make a new program manager item in that group.
3. Set the properties to:
Description: "World Factbook 1995"
Command Line: "E:\windows\wfb1995.EXE"
4. Add a second item and set the properties to:
Description: "World Factbook 1995 Textware"
Command Line: "E:\windows\twlitew.exe wfb.TWC"

(Where "E" is the drive letter of your CD-ROM drive)
(exclude the quote marks "")

If you want to print any of the photo's, regional maps, charts, or flags open the book for each item.

The Files names for the seperate books are:

Subject	Book Name
Photo's	Photos.TBK
Regional Maps	Region.TBK
Charts	Charts.TBK
Flags	Flags.TBK

If you wish to open one of these books, select "Open" from the "File" menu. Then choose one of the books and click "OK." To view the next image once you have one of these books open, hold down the "ALT" and press the right arrow key.

To view the previous image, hold down the "ALT" key and press the left arrow.

If you do not have a sound board and wish to remove the error messages regarding this you can use the World Factbook 1994 and uncheck the Sounds menu item under OPTIONS.

DOS:

The batch file on the root: WFB.BAT will get you started.

Steps required:

1. You must be in the drive that contains the CD.
(Do this by typing the letter that is the CD drive,
E.G. type "E:"
where E is the letter you assigned to the CD drive.)
2. Type "WFB"
This is a batch file begins TextWare, which allows you to access the World Factbook indexed database.
3. If you have trouble viewing the images, exit the World Factbook and on the command line type: SET TWTMP=C:\, then press the Enter key.
Now launch the World Factbook again by typing WFB.
Can you view the images now? If not call Wayzata Technical Support.
Note: This solution is for the DOS based World Factbook only.

Macintosh:

Double click on the World Factbook 1995 file for general access.
Double click on the WFB.TWC file to access the indexed database.
Help is available under the "Help" Menu.

World Factbook 1995**Detailed information about getting around in this program:**

The First "Main" screen allows you to choose how to access the information about the 266 world entities.

Click on the astronaut for additional help!

7 choices:

**** (1) Photographs.**

View 220+ photographs from around the world. See the countries up close! Play a slide show of all the images (click the slide show button) or select the image by name (scroll the list of images and click on the text to view).

**** (2) Maps/Flags.**

Access regional maps, detailed country maps, or flags for each country. View a slide show of the flags, or scroll and click the list of countries.

**** (3) Charts.**

See comparison charts and rankings of all 266 countries for 23 statistics compiled by the CIA. Click the slide show button to see them all or click on the statistic text to view and inspect individual rankings.

**** (4) Travel Topics.**

Get detailed information compiled by the State Department on 31 special topics and the activities of 39 terror groups.

**** (5) Search.**

Access any one of the 266 countries directly, search for a country, search all the text for a search string. (Macintosh only: switch out to TextWare rapid search and retrieval.)

**** (6) Help.**

Provides tips and techniques for using this program.

**** (7) Search the world geographically by clicking on one of the 7 continents on the Main screen. This has each country's geographic location, size etc. in relation to its neighbors and allows access that country's text description as compiled by the CIA and State department information, as well as its Map and Flag, and Photographs (if available).**

At the bottom of each screen (except main) is standard set of options, including a way of getting back to the main screen.

Using the "Go Back" button for repeated accessing of information from the same screen. Some examples:

From the "Main" screen click on a continent such as "Africa",
Click on "Southern Africa", now click on a country button.
View the information/maps etc. Click "Go Back" to return to
"Southern Africa", now click on another country button.

From the "Main" screen click on the "Charts" button, now scroll
the list of comparison statistics/charts and select one to inspect
by clicking on its text. Read the rankings/search/view the charts.
Now click on "Go Back" to return to the "Charts" listing.

Features:

- * Information on 266 countries, territories etc. compiled by the CIA.
- * Extracted numerical rankings for 23 statistics from the CIA
with bar charts. Statistics include: population, growth, economics, etc.
- * Information from the State Department on most countries, including:
Entry Requirements (documentation needed to get into a country),
Travel Advisories (what to watch out for when you get there),
Consular notes (general notes on the country),
and other:
General Information topics (HIV, Adoption, Abduction, etc.), and
Terror Group Profiles.
- * Maps for the 266 countries, territories etc.
- * 23 Region Maps.
- * 16 Regional Maps + world time zones.
- * 220+ photos from selected countries.
- * Various search tools.
- * Help.
