How To Register

Global Mines is shareware. That means that if you want to continue use the game after you have checked it out you should pay the shareware fee to the author. Paying the shareware fee will support me and encourage me to improve this game and make other software.

You may wonder 'Why should I register?'. Well, first of all... This is your chance to say 'Thanks for this great game!' and your support will let the author of the game continue with improvements and producing other cheap software. With a registred copy of the game you will also get rid of all dialog boxes and your highscore will be saved. You will also be able to fully participate in the Global Mines Hall of Fame on the Internet.

The shareware fee is only \$7 US Dollars.

If you pay the shareware fee you will become a registred user and you'll receive a registration code which will unlock your copy of the game. All hidden and non-working functions will then be available (saved highscore for example). You will NOT need to register again to unlock future versions of *Global Mines*.

There is some different ways you may register. Choose the alternative which is the most suitable for you.

Together with the game there is a program called **register.exe**, please use this program and follow the instructions. You may **pay by check, cash, creditcard** or in some other ways. You may also **pay online** via a secure SSL server, go to this page: http://order.kagi.com/?3SK and then follow the instructions.

These payments are handled by a payment service called Kagi. See http://www.kagi.com for more information about payment.

You may also send cash directly to me, please, DO NOT SEND CHECKS to me, if you want to pay by check, use the Register program. This alternative is for those who thinks it's easier to send cash directly to me. For example, if you live in Sweden this alternative may be better.

How to Play

The goal of the game is to find all mines on the playfield as fast as possible. When you start a new game the field is covered. When you click on a square that square will be uncovered. If the uncovered square is empty and has no mines next to it all adjacent empty squares will be uncovered too. A number on a square says how many mines the adjacent squares contain (a maximum of eight).

With a little bit of logical thinking you can figure out and mark the squares covers a mine. To mark a square you click with the right mouse button and a flag will appear. If you are unsure if a square cover a mine or not you may put a question mark on it, click twice on the right mouse button to do that. Click again and it'll disappear. You may turn off question marks in the menu.

The game is finished when all squares are uncovered except those who covers a mine.

If you got a highscore you are asked to enter your name. You will also get a score code, this score code will let you participate in the Global Mines Hall of Fame on the Internet. This hall of fame is a kind of international highscore list. People from all over the world may compete with each other and see who is grandmaster of Global Mines. The webpage where you should enter your score code is located at:

Hint: When you've marked a square and there is no adjacent mines, you may hold down the left mouse button and click the right (ie click both buttons at the same time) to uncover all adjacent squares. But be careful so there is no unmarked adjacent mines.

About Global Mines

Global Mines is yet another version of the classic XBomb and MineSweeper idea.

The reason why I decided to do my own MineSweeper clone is simple - I simply didn't found the Microsoft Minesweeper game which came along with the OS good enough.

The biggest problem is when you should compare your score to your friends score. No one believe you if you've got a really good time. The .ini file which contain the highscore is easy to edit, a screenshot is also easy to manipulate. But not in *Global Mines!* When you get a highscore, you will see a special code which represent the game you've just played. You may then enter this code on a dedicated webpage together with your name to be included in the global Hall of Fame. So, you may compete with people all over the internet, that's why the name is **Global** Mines.

Global Mines was programmed by Stefan Pettersson (stefpet@kagi.com). Latest version is v1.0.

Features:

- Global Highscores (compete with others on internet)
- Saved Highscores (top 10)
- Custom levels
- Both mouse buttons click (clear around a marked square)
- Safe Start

Note: Global Mines include all features of Microsoft Minesweeper.
