Best of... April Lea Bromley

February saw the introduction of a great bunch of revisions and new titles. Most of the additions and changes were in established series, however, a new group of limited editions have joined the group. There are four new disks aimed at those interested in programming and other more technical subjects. **Programming** contains, Acur Folder, APDA Catalog, Bugs Simulation, C Quick Reference, Copyright, DiskDoubler (decompression), Header Fkey 1.0a7, Inside Mac DA, MacInTalk 1.31, ResTools (folder) and Size (folder). **Tech Notes 6/90**, **8/90** and **10/90** are issues of technical information about the Macintosh.

Related to the more technical subjects is the availability of ResEdit 2.1 (on **Utilities II**), as well as its DA and (at last!), ResEdit Primer 6.0 (on **Utilities III**). This is the complete manual for ResEdit. It takes a laser printer (for the illustrations) some time to print. Now you'll be able to read a bit before you try something.

There were two new disks full of **Laser Fonts**. These two each have a high percentage of type 1 fonts (compatible with ATM) so you can size, distort, and generally have a lot of fun with them.

Also take a good look at the Virus disks. There are now a pair of them. **Virus I** has been updated with the latest available as of the date of issue (Feb. '91), and **Virus II** fills in a number of maintenance and repair applications.

The newest edition of the **Best of... Catalog** was available in March and includes descriptions of all the new and revised offerings. It is available for \$1.00 at the Best of... table (\$2.00 by mail).

Speaking of <u>mail</u>, the Disk by Mail service has been completely revised and all the Best of... and subsidiary titles (not hardware) will be available from Mike and me. The price remains \$3.00 per disk (\$6.00 for non-members) except as otherwise noted, plus postage. See the order blanks for postal rates, or call Mike or Lea at the above number. The **Catalog** will list and describe all software, and is updated quarterly (priced as above). The **Best of... Directory** will continue to be published with a complete list, updated just prior to each monthly meeting, and the price is still "free." A self-address, stamped envelope will bring the most recent edition of the **Directory** to you by return mail. Please be sure to send a #10 (long) envelope and first class postage.

**HyperCard 2.0** has been upgraded to 2.0v2. The new version fixes (I'm told a number of minor bugs in the first edition). For those of you who have not purchased the five disk set, the price is now \$10 and includes the newest version of HC. If you purchased your set before the February 21 main meeting, bring or mail your "Disk 1" and \$2.00 and we will give you the newest version (see the mail order form for information about postage). Sorry about the price increase, but it really was necessary.

**Modem Special!!** The Viva 2400 Baud Modem with FAXSend capability, a power cord, cable and FAXUser software is priced at only \$125.00 (plus tax). AMUG has put together a nifty bundle with a one year subscription to the AMUG Preferred BBS (the iconic

bulletin board service), TeleFinder 2.1 software, a bound manual and all three AMUG Best of... disks, Telecom, Telecom II and Telecom III, for only \$20.00 with the purchase of a Viva modem.
