CreaTV - DeSiGn Icons are giftware. These tiny artworx may be distributed freely as there will be no profit made higher than, let's say, about 6 \$ or the equivalent value in other currencies for a disk this is included in.

All parts of this library and the documentation must be complete.

The distribution of single parts is not allowed.

The repacking of this distribution with different packers is, however, allowed.

Permission is granted to include this archive in Public-Domain collections, especially in Fred Fishs great Amiga Disk Library (including CD ROM versions of it).

I'm really not responsible for misuse, or damage. Essentially there can't be any danger, but who knows...

But, for instance, this distribution is not ready for use in microwaves or washing driers (I just wanted to say...)

The design of the Icons was drawn being aware of the style of the

MagicWorkbench

, keeping a undivided view

on the workbench. The most new distributions of Icons are kept in this style.

1.3 Install it... NOW !

Well, sure, I could write an Installer-Script for easy moving all necessary to the right places, but if I would have done that, the time I needed therefore would have caused less icons.

On the other side there's your configuration I can't know (my secondname is NOT Copperfield...), so copying via Installer would be like playing in Las Vegas. :-)

The things to do are copying:

- the directories Animdocks and Docks to that place, where your Icons for ToolManager or something else are located .
- the contents of env to envarc:sys/
As the original Startup-Sequence copies the whole Envarc: to Ramdisk, it's maybe advisable to create a directory in e.g. sys:prefs/ named 'sys', move the contents of the env from this distribution to that place and add the line ...

assign env: sys:prefs/ add

to 'S:user-startup' .

- the 's' - contents to your S: Directory, if you want to use something needing the
whatis.library

In 's:Filetypes' already are the needed references for the def_s mentioned above.

- the 'Prefs'- Icons as you like to.

- in the Drives - Drawer are some examples of Disk-Icons and on the WorkBench placed Drawers. Because of that I like a un-divided looking WB, there are some left out drawers having an Icon, which looks like a drive-icon. As I wanted you to have an overview of those icons, I defined them in this distribution as Drawer. 'Disk.info's won't be shown, if they're not in the root-drawer. To use them as ordinary Disk icons, you've to convert them, one possibility therefor is to load them into IconEdit, NOT changing anything except of toggling the icon-kind to Device. After that you've to save it as Disk.info to the root of that Device you want to use with.

1.5 what is whatis?

WhatIs.library

What is whatis.library ? It is a shared amiga library which allow programmers to easily recognize type of files (ilbm, 8svx, maxiplan, exe, PP, etc....) BUT the final user (non-programmer user) can define new types so all programs which use whatis.library can recognize this new type. At this moment only BrowserII, For and AddIcon use whatis.library but I planned to rewrite Icon (a program which make WorkBench 2.0 recognize files which have no icon), and I encourage all programmers to use this library so users can define new types only one time and every program can use it. I actually work on version which support the datatype of KickStart 3.0 so user of whatis.library can use both the customisable whatis type and the standard datatype type.

For example, you love graphics, you digitize lots of image with an official commercial program which produce file ".img", and you want BrowserII can reconised it, well, you define this new type in S:FileTypes and whatis.library know what it is, so you BrowserII can do automatic thing on your file ".img", but all program which use whatis.library can reconised the ".img"-type you just defined and can do what they are supposed to do with them.

1.6 what for hell is Swazinfo ???

Swaz Info Copyright (C)1992,93 David Swasbrook.

Swaz Info replaces workbench's icon information window while still retainig all the information and options and providing more window but with several enhancements.

Important Additional Features

- * Locale support - uses available language catalogs, the english locale built in.
- * Commodities support - can use the commodities exchange to remove, or disable SwazInfo.
- * Arexx support.
- * Icons may be dropped into the information window in several places:
 - 1) If an icon is dropped onto the tool types list then the tool

types from that icon will be added to the list (any duplicates are discarded).

2) Dropping an icon onto the icon image will load the dropped icons image to be used for the icon being edited.

3) Anywhere else in the window performs no action.

* Shift-CloseWindow will close all information windows on the same screen.

* Disk information also displays the disk type (eg. DOS0 or DOS1)

* RWED protection bits may be set for the owner, group and others.

* " MultiuserFileSystem " support:

1) SetUID bit support

2) Owner/Group of the file is displayed and an alternative owner may be chosen (provided you can modify the file).

* Menu options to cycle through other information windows.
