INTRODUCTION

SearchGuide is a little search tool for Amigaguide documents.

It is far from perfect, yet, but it does help a bit!

Please note that this version is still a PRE-release, so don't hesitate to mail me your suggestions and bug reports.

SearchGuide has been originaly written for Jérôme Chesnot's "France_Guide 2.0".

SearchGuide is localized. If you do a catalog translation for a not yet supported language, please send me a copy of the SearchGuide.ct file, I'll then include the resulting catalog with the next release.

If you use it in your guide(s), please send me an email.

1.10 Using SearchGuide

Using SearchGuide

SearchGuide is NOT supposed to be used from the Shell, but from inside an AmigaGuide document.

The template is as follow:

SearchGuide VIEWER/K, PUBSCREEN/K, GUIDE/A, KW=KEYWORD/K, D=DEFAULT/K

VIEWER is optional and is the viewer to be used to display the guide

resulting from the search. If not present SearchGuide will try "SYS:Utilities/Multiview", if that fails it'll then try "Multiview", then "SYS:Utilities/AmigaGuide", and finally "AmigaGuide". (The last two have been added in version 0.8.1.5).

PUBSCREEN is also optional and is used for the feedback window and as argument to the viewer for the resulting found guide, otherwise it defaults to the default public screen (at least for the feedback window;-)

The GUIDE argument is mandatory and must be the name of the Amigaguide document that is calling SearchGuide.

KW=KEYWORD is optional, it allows searching directly for a keyword without going through the string requester. Has been added following a request from Pascal Chiozzi. This option is mutually exclusive with the D=DEFAULT option.

D=DEFAULT is also optional and exclusive with KW=KEYWORD. It just puts a default keyword in the string requester. Added following a request from Ours (Jérôme Chesnot) and another one from Gonzalez Rocha. This option is mutually exclusive with the KW=KEYWORD option.

Some examples:

You may add the following line to your Amigaguide document, called "Your.guide", in our example:

@{" Search " SYSTEM "RUN <>NIL: SearchGuide Your.guide"}

Where "Your.guide" is the name of the guide to which your are adding this line!

or:

@{" Search " SYSTEM "RUN <>NIL: SearchGuide VIEWER=NewGuideViewer Your.guide"}

or:

@{" Search " SYSTEM "RUN <>NIL: SearchGuide VIEWER=NewGuideViewer Your.quide"}

or:

@{" Search " SYSTEM "RUN <>NIL: SearchGuide VIEWER=NewGuideViewer PUBSCREEN= ←
 MYSCRREEN.1 Your.guide"}

 DEFAULT=default\_keyword"}

And you should get something like this in Your.guide:

If you click on the above "Search" button. A reqtools string requester should appear (if you didn't use the KEYWORD option!).

If you used the DEFAULT option, the keyword given as argument will already be in the string gadget, otherwise just enter the keyword you are looking for, then press "Return".

A small window will open telling you that SearchGuide is searching ;-)

Then a new guide will open (in a new window) with a list of all the nodes containing your keyword, just click on the one you are interested in ;-)

SearchGuide was sometimes finding things that didn't look like the requested keyword. This was due to the use of StrConvert() from locale.library. This function was translating, for example:

```
"@{b}are you@{ub}" to
"@abcare you@aubc"
```

So, if you were looking for "car" it would find the line containing the above.

Thanks to Pascal Chiozzi for reporting this "feature" ;-)

The lines where the keyword has been found are now displayed in their original case, before they were translated to lower case!
