#### **Editing Area**

This is where you insert and arrange your graphic and text objects. You are allowed to create your own graphic object or select one from a previously saved file. Graphic objects can be positioned in on top of or under other objects, selected, moved and resized with the mouse or even edited by double clicking and entering the graphics application that you have previously installed for that type of graphics file.

Text objects can be added to create play lists or other labels. They can be rotated and the format toolbar gives you full control over fonts and other properties.

#### Ruler

The ruler in positioned at the top and left side of the editing area. It can be displayed or disabled at your convenience and the unit of measure can be set to either inches or centimeters from the Options dialog.

#### Label/Insert outline

The label outline is displayed to show the boundaries for the label you are editing. The page selected on the Page toolbar determines the type of outline displayed.

#### Cross-hair cursor

Cross-hairs are displayed when moving the mouse over the editing area. The exact x-y offset is displayed in the message area of the status bar.

#### View Menu - Status Bar

The status bar contains the following information about the operation and state of the JewelCase Maker program. It can be hidden or displayed from the view menu to allow more room for editing when necessary.

### Message Area

The message area provides prompts and other information about objects under the cursor. # Page Layout

Displays the layout of the selected paper type. For paper types containing more than one label, select the lable to use for this printing. Select multiple spots to create additional copies of this CD label or jewelcase insert.

# **Hiding the Toolbar**

## To Hide the Toolbar:

1. Click the Toolbar item from the View Menu. You should see a small check mark to the right of the Toolbar item and the Toolbar should now be displayed at the top of the main program window.

# Viewing the Toolbar

## To View the Toolbar:

1. Click the Toolbar item from the View Menu. You should no longer see a small check mark to the right of the S Toolbar item and the Toolbar should now be invisible.

# **Hiding the Status Bar**

## To Hide the Status Bar:

1. Click the Status Bar item from the View Menu. You should see a small check mark to the right of the Status Bar item and the Status Bar should now be displayed at the bottom of the main program window.

# Viewing the Status Bar

## To View the Status Bar:

1. Click the Status Bar item from the View Menu. You should no longer see a small check mark to the right of the Status Bar item and the Status Bar should now be invisible.

## Opening an existing label set

# To Open an existing label set:

- 1. Click the Open button from the Main toolbar or select Open from the File Menu.
- 2. Locate the desired label set file (.jwc) using the Open dialog controls.
- 3. Click the Open button. The label definition should be displayed in the JewelCase editing area and is ready for printing or modification.

## Saving a label set

### To Save the current label definition:

- 1. Click the Save button on the Main toolbar or select Save from the File Menu.
- 2. Select the directory in the Save In combo box.
- 3. Enter the name for this label set in the Name box.
- 4. Click Save. JewelCase Maker will save the current label set definition file (\*.jwc) to the file you specified.

# Creating a new label set

## To create a new label set:

- 1. Click the New button from the Main toolbar or select New from the File Menu.
- 2. JewelCase Maker resets the editing area and is ready to create a new label set.

### **Printing with JewelCase Maker**

Printing with JewelCase Maker is easy. In a few clicks of your mouse you can be printing your own CD labels and jewelcase inserts. JewelCase Maker uses easy Window's printing features to print the labels you designed. You can even use the Print Preview feature to see what your label will look like before it is printed.

It is easier to print each page of your label set individually. It is also recommended that you use your printer's manual feed option if available. Every label set can contain up to four different pages:

- 1. Front/Outside cover
- 2. Inside insert
- 3. Back (U-Card) insert
- 4. CD Label

Each page above corresponds to pages 1 to 4 in the Print Range option of the Print dialog. To print a jewelcase cover from the Print dialog, simply select the Pages option and then enter from 1 to 1 in the Print Range option. Load the proper paper into your printer and click OK to print the Front/Outside insert. All other pages are printed just as easily. Remember that the inside insert, when desired, is printed on the reverse side of the Front/Outside insert. You will have to feed it through the printer reversed once the front side has been printed. Always let the ink dry before printing the inside insert.

### Previewing a label set before printing

#### To preview a label set before printing:

- 1. Load the desired label set into the editing area. See Opening or Creating a New label set definition.
- 2. Click the Preview button from the Main toolbar or select Preview from the File Menu.
- 3. JewelCase Maker displays all defined pages in the preview window. You can see your label just like it would appear if it were printed. You can print the label from the preview window or return to the editing area for additional modifications or saving.

**Note:** All pages must have a paper type selected before they can be printed or previewed. If you have not selected a paper type for each page the Page Setup dialog will be displayed to allow you to make the appropriate selections before the preview window is displayed.

## Printing a label set

### To print a label set:

- 1. Load the desired label set into the editing area. See Opening or Creating a New label set definition.
- 2. Click the Print button from the Main toolbar or select Print from the File Menu.

**Note:** All pages must have a paper type selected before they can be printed or previewed. If you have not selected a paper type for each page the Page Setup dialog will be displayed to allow you to make the appropriate selections before the preview window is displayed.

## Printing multiple copies of the same CD label on the same page.

### To print multiple copies of the same CD label on the same page:

- 1. Load the desired label set into the editing area. See Opening or Creating a New label set definition.
- 2. Select the Page Setup item from the File Menu to open the Page Setup dialog.
- 3. Select a paper type that has multiple spots (labels) per page.
- 4. Click on the numbers of spots in the page Layout area.
- 5. Click the Print button from the Main toolbar or select Print from the File Menu.

**Note:** JewelCase Maker will print the defined label to the selected spots in the layout area. Paper types with multiple spots can be used to create more than one copy of the same label per page.

### **Using Paper Types**

You can use predefined label stock like Avery 8931 Insert or Avery 5824 Disc for your jewel case and CD labels. These predefined papers are perforated for easy use. JewelCase Maker comes with several predefined paper definitions. In addition to these predefined paper types, JewelCase Maker allows you to create you own custom paper types. You can select, add, edit or remove any of these custom paper types from the Page Setup dialog.

In some cases you may not be using a predefined label stock or your label stock is not listed in JewelCase Maker's selection of paper types. In these instances, you can define a new paper type by selecting the type of label and other parameters like paper size, orientation, unit of measure and how many labels (spots) can be printed on this page. All settings are available on the Add paper dialog. The paper layout area shows the location of the label(s) and the printed page. As noted below, the spot offset is measured from the upper left corner for inserts and from the center of the label for CD labels. You may include from one to three spots per page.

## Selecting a paper type


### To select a paper type:

- 1. Select the Page Setup item from the File Menu.
- 2. Choose the tab for the desired page type.
- 3. Select the desired paper type.
- 4. Click OK to save the paper type selection.

**Note:** All pages must have a paper type selected before you can preview or print your labels. JewelCase Maker will display the Page Setup dialog should you try to print or preview a page before selecting the proper paper type for that page.

#### Creating a new paper type

You define a new paper type by selecting the type of label and other parameters like paper size, orientation, unit of measure and how many labels (spots) can be printed on this page. All these settings are available on the Add paper dialog. The paper layout area shows the relation between the spot offsets and the printed page. As noted below, the offset is measured from the upper left corner for inserts and from the center of the label for CD labels. You may include from 1 to 3 spots per page.



### To create your own paper type:

- 1. Select the Page Setup item from the File Menu.
- 2. Choose the tab that will be using the paper type you are creating.
- 3. Click the Add button.
- 4. Use the Add printing paper dialog to create the new paper type.
- 5. Click OK to save the paper type you just created.

**Note:** Use the Paper Layout area of the Add printing paper dialog to view your settings for the new paper type you are defining.

## Editing an existing paper type

### To edit an existing paper type:

- 1. Select the Page Setup item from the File Menu.
- 2. Choose the tab that will be using the paper type you are creating.
- 3. Select the custom paper type to be edited.
- 4. Click the Edit button.
- 5. Use the Edit printing paper dialog to modify the selected paper type.
- 6. Click OK to save your changes.

### Notes:

- Use the Paper Layout area of the Edit printing paper dialog to view your settings for the paper type you are modifying.
- · Only custom paper types can be edited. The Edit button will be disabled when a predefined paper type is selected.

## Removing an existing paper type

### To remove an existing paper type:

- 1. Select the Page Setup item from the File Menu.
- 2. Choose the tab that will be using the paper type you are creating.
- 3. Select the custom paper type to be removed.
- 4. Click the Remove button.
- 5. You will be prompted to confirm the removal of the selected paper type. Click Yes at this prompt if you do wish to remove this paper type.
- 6. Click OK to close the Page Setup dialog.

**Note:** Only custom paper types can be removed. The Remove button will be disabled when a predefined paper type is selected.

### **Graphic Objects**

You can add existing graphic objects to your inserts and labels directly from JewelCase Maker's editing area. Graphic objects are edited using the program that you have installed on your computer for that particular type of object. For example, the Microsoft Paint program installed with Windows 95 usually handles bitmap images. The type of objects that you can insert depends on what graphic programs you have installed on your machine. You will need to consult the help system and program documentation that comes with these programs for assistance in using these programs for creating and editing graphic objects.

## Inserting a new object from an existing graphics file

### To Insert a new object from an existing graphics file:

- 1. Click the Insert new object button on the toolbar or select the New Object item from the Insert menu.
- 2. Use the mouse to position and size the object. The first click selects the position of the upper left corner of the object. Then drag the mouse to position the lower right corner of the new object.
- 3. Select Create from file in the Insert Object dialog.
- 4. Enter the name of the file or use the Browse button to select the graphic file for this object.
- 5. Uncheck the Display as Icon option.
- 6. Click OK to create the new object using the specified file.

## Creating a new graphic object

### To Insert a new graphic object:

- 1. Click the Insert new object button on the toolbar or select the New Object item from the Insert menu.
- 2. Use the mouse to position and size the object. The first click selects the position of the upper left corner of the object. Then drag the mouse to position the lower right corner of the new object.
- 3. Select Create New in the Insert Object dialog.
- 4. Select the object type from the list. For example, choose bitmap image to create a new bitmap graphic image.
- 5. Uncheck the Display as Icon option.
- 6. Click OK to create the new object using the specified file.

## Editing a graphic object

### To edit a graphic object:

- 1. Select the object to edit.
- 2. Click the Bitmap Image Object item from the Edit menu. A sub-menu will be displayed.
- 3. Click the Edit option to edit the graphic in place or Open to edit the option in the actual graphic program.
- 4. Make desired changes using the graphics program.
- If you chose in place editing in step 3 then just click outside the graphic object to return from the graphics program. If you opened the object in the graphics program in step 3 then you will need to choose Exit & Return item from the File Menu of the graphics program.

# Deleting a graphic object

## To delete a graphic object:

- 1. Select the object to delete.
- 2. Click the Delete button on the Main toolbar or select Delete from the Edit menu.

**Note:** You can use the undo/redo feature to recover an item deleted by mistake.

## Working with text objects

Text objects can be inserted in your labels to create play lists, tables of contents or any other place you want to add labels or text. You can select text properties like font, font size and color easily with JewelCase Maker. Other properties like justification, bold, italic and underline may be modified for your custom inserts. Text objects can be repositioned or edited directly from the editing area.

## Inserting a text object

## To insert a text object:

- 1. Click on the Insert Text button on the Main toolbar or select the Text item from the Insert menu.
- 2. Use the mouse to position the upper left corner of the text object being created.
- 3. Enter the text to be inserted.
- 4. Click outside of the text box to exit the edit mode.

# Editing a text object

## To edit a text object:

- 1. Select the text object to be edited.
- 2. Double Click on the object or select the Text item from the Edit menu.
- 3. The text box is displayed in edit mode with the entire string selected. Make the necessary changes as desired.
- 4. Click outside of the text box to exit the edit mode.

# Deleting a text object

## To delete a text object:

- 1. Select the object to delete.
- 2. Click the Delete button on the Main toolbar or select Delete from the Edit menu.

**Note:** You can use the undo/redo feature to recover an item deleted by mistake.

# Changing the properties of a text object

## To change the properties of a text object:

- 1. Select the text object to be modified.
- 2. Use the formatting toolbar or select the property to change from the format menu.

**Note:** Property changes affect all text in a text box.

# Rotating a text object

## To rotate a text object:

- 1. Select the text object to be rotated.
- 2. Click the rotate button on the formatting toolbar or select rotate from the format menu.

**Note:** All text in the selected text box will be rotated 90 degrees counter-clockwise.

### **Positioning Objects**

Objects are printed based on their position on the page. Think of it as a stack of objects and each object can be in front of or behind any other object(s). Any part of an object positioned behind another object may not be visible in the printed label. If you have added an object to your label definition but can not see it on the printed output be sure to check the positioning of all objects in your label definition. This feature allows a layering effect but care must be used when positioning the objects on your labels and inserts.

# Moving an object to the back

## To move an object to the back:

- 1. Select the object to be moved.
- 2. Click the Bring to back button on the Arrange Items toolbar or select it from the Order Objects sub-menu of the Format Menu.

# Moving an object to the front

## To move an object to the front:

- 1. Select the object to be moved.
- 2. Click the Bring to front button on the Arrange Items toolbar or select it from the Order Objects sub-menu of the Format Menu.

# Moving an object up one

## To move an object up one:

- 1. Select the object to be moved.
- 2. Click the Move up one button on the Arrange Items toolbar or select it from the Order Objects sub-menu of the Format Menu.

# Moving an object down one

# To move an object down one:

- 1. Select the object to be moved.
- 2. Click the Move down one button on the Arrange Items toolbar or select it from the Order Objects sub-menu of the Format Menu.

# **Formatting Text Objects**

JewelCase Maker allows you to change the appearance of the text in a text object. You may change the font style and size, the color and other attributes like bold, italic and underlined fonts. Text may be aligned to the left, right or centered. Text objects may be rotated in 90° increments using the rotate function. It is important to note that changes made to a text object apply to all text in that object.

Label Set

# Front Cover

A front cover are inserts is printed on a single-side of the paper. They are typically folded in half giving you a front and back side to the insert.

# Inside Insert

Inside inserts are created by designing and printing an additional page that will be printed on the back of the single-sided insert. When folded, you now have both and inside and outside jewel case insert.

# Back Cover (U-Card)

Back cover inserts are printed on one side and the edges are folded back for insertion into the back cover of the jewel case.

# CD Label

 $\ensuremath{\mathsf{CD}}$  Labels are circular labels with an adhesive side to stick to the top side of you  $\ensuremath{\mathsf{CD}}.$ 

# Paper Type

A description of a label stock like Avery's 8931 or you may define your own paper type using the Page Setup item from the File Menu. Each page must have a paper type selected in order to be printed or viewed with the Print Preview feature.

# Spot

A spot is another word for label. You may define up to three spots (labels) per paper type. It is possible to print more than one copy of a label on the same page.

# Unit

The JewelCase Maker program can work in either inches or centimeters for your convenience. The Unit of measure can be selected in the Add printing paper dialog for paper type definitions or from the Ruler item in the View menu..

## **Editing Area**

This is where you insert and arrange your graphic and text objects. You are allowed to create your own graphic object or select one from a previously saved file. Graphic objects can be positioned in on top of or under other objects, selected, moved and resized with the mouse or even edited by double clicking and entering the graphics application that you have previously installed for that type of graphics file.

Text objects can be added to create play lists or other labels. They can be rotated and the format toolbar gives you full control over fonts and other properties.

## Ruler

The ruler in positioned at the top and left side of the editing area. It can be displayed or disabled at your convenience and the unit of measure can be set to either inches or centimeters from the Ruler item in the View Menu. The exact position of the cursor appears as a dashed line on the ruler while working in the editing area. It is also displayed in the message area of the status bar if visible.

# Spot Outline

The spot outline is displayed to show the boundaries for the label you are editing. The page selected on the Page toolbar determines the type of outline displayed. It may be printed to act as a guide for cutting out your labels and inserts from non-perforated paper types.

## **Main Toolbar**



Toolbar buttons are used as shorthand for menu commands. Each toolbar button represents a frequently used command. The display of these buttons is context-sensitive in that only buttons relevant to the current context are shown and enabled.

Select or create paper type definitions for printing labels.



#### Redo

Re-applies the last undone operation to the current label design.

#### **Delete**

Deletes the selected object from the editing area. No copy is left on the clipboard. Use the Undo operation to restore a object deleted by mistake.

#### Cut

Removes the selected object from the editing area but leaves a copy of the object in the clipboard for later paste operations.

Pastes the contents of the clipboard in the editing area.


#### Select All

## Text

# New Object...

Create a new graphic object from and existing graphic file or create your own using the graphic editor. Graphic objects can be edited using graphics applications previously installed on your computer. For example, bitmap files can be created using the graphic editor installed with Windows. Help information is available with from the documentation or help files installed with the corresponding application.

## **Format Menu**



Provides easy access to JewelCase Maker's formatting commands.

#### **Bold**

Sets the type face to bold for the selected text object.

#### Italic

Italicizes the selected text object.

## Underline

Underline the selected text object.

## Color

Changes the color of the selected text object.

#### Font

Selects the current font for the text being displayed in the text object.

## Justification



## Left

Left justifies the text displayed in the text object.

## Right

Right justifies the text displayed in the text object.


# Center


#### Toolbar


